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### Note 1: Description of the Plan

The following description of the Retiree Life & Medical Supplement Plan of Rowan Companies, Inc. (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

#### *General*

The Plan is a welfare benefit plan established for the purpose of providing life and health benefits for eligible retirees of Rowan Companies, Inc. (the Company) and their covered dependents. On November 27, 2017, the Company established a trust to hold a reserve to purchase annuities to pay benefits as provided for under the Plan.

Effective April 11, 2019, the parent company of Rowan was merged into Ensco plc, which was subsequently renamed EnscoRowan plc. Effective July 31, 2019, the parent company EnscoRowan plc was renamed Valaris plc and subsequently Valaris Limited. Furthermore, effective as of February 3, 2020, the plan sponsor was changed from Rowan Companies, Inc. to another entity within the Valaris organization, Ensco International Incorporated. Eligible former employees have continued to participate in the Plan post-merger and through the renaming of the parent organization and the change of the plan sponsor organization.

#### *Benefits*

Plan benefits include group term life insurance benefits ("Life") payable upon the death of eligible retired employees who die while participants in the Plan. Plan benefits also include establishment of health reimbursement accounts ("HRAs") for eligible retirees (and their eligible surviving spouse and other eligible child dependents).

#### *Contributions*

The Company will fund the premium cost of the Life coverage and the contributions to provide credits to the HRAs. The Benefits Oversight Committee (the Committee) of the Company, in its discretion may cause the Trust to purchase annuities from insurers to satisfy a portion or all of such funding requirements.

#### *Eligibility*

Plan coverage is available to eligible retired employees of the Company and certain other wholly owned subsidiaries of the Company, who are participants in or beneficiaries of the Rowan Pension Plan and certain of their family members. Plan coverage is also available for certain surviving spouses of deceased employees or retirees and certain of their family members.

Plan coverage must be elected by eligible individuals within 60 days of the time that such individual is first eligible and a failure to elect such coverage and enroll in the Plan at that time will result in a complete loss of eligibility for Plan coverage.

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### *Plan Termination*

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to modify the benefits provided, to change or discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

## **Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

### *Basis of Accounting*

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

### *Use of Estimates*

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires Plan management to make estimates that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### *Administrative Expenses*

The Company pays all trustee and service provider fees (including provider administration fees). Company also pays audit, consulting, legal and other miscellaneous administrative expenses.

### *Postretirement Benefits*

The amount reported as the postretirement benefit obligation represents the actuarial present value of those estimated future benefits that are attributed by the terms of the Plan to employees' service rendered to the date of the financial statements, reduced by the actuarial present value of contributions expected to be received in the future from the Company. Postretirement benefits include future benefits expected to be paid to or for (1) currently retired employees and their covered spouses and (2) certain active employees who were Plan participants on January 1, 2008, and who had attained age 50 as of December 31, 2015, and their covered spouses. The postretirement benefit obligation represents the present value of the amount that is to be funded by contributions from Rowan. Prior to an active employee's full eligibility date, the postretirement benefit obligation is the portion of the expected postretirement benefit obligation that is attributed to that employee's service rendered to the valuation date.

During 2016 and 2017, Rowan pursued a strategy for the Plan with the primary objective to reduce and exit postretirement benefit obligations. The following are changes and actions which caused a reduction in post-retirement obligations:

- Employees who had not attained age 50 as of December 31, 2015, were excluded from Plan participation and received a cash payment in lieu of Plan benefits.

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- Effective January 1, 2017, the Plan was amended to provide covered retirees and spouses and child dependents with an annual Health Reimbursement Account credit to purchase individual coverage. For ages 60 to 65, the credit is \$6,500 per year each for the retiree and for the beneficiary. After age 65 the credit reduces to \$1,500 per year. The credits are prorated for completed years of service under 20.
- On November 27, 2017, Rowan purchased annuities to fund post-65 HRA credits for covered retirees and covered spouses and child dependents after December 31, 2018. The annuity purchase eliminated Rowan retiree medical benefit obligations with respect to these HRA credits.

The actuarial present value of the expected postretirement benefit obligation is determined by an actuary and is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to historical claims-cost data to estimate future annual incurred claims costs per participant and to adjust such estimates for the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as those for death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected date of payment.

Other significant assumptions as of December 31, 2024 were as follows:

The changes to the current year actuarial assumptions were: (1) the weighted-average discount rate increased from 5.01% to 5.50% from December 31, 2023, to December 31, 2024; (2) the mortality table changed from the PRI-2012 mortality tables with MP-2023 projection scale applied to MP-2024.

***Risks and Uncertainties***

Plan contributions are made and the actuarial present value of benefit obligations are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, health care inflation rates, and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimation and assumption processes, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term could materially affect the amounts reported and disclosed in the Plan's financial statements.

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**Note 3: Plan Tax Status**

The plan administrator believes the Plan's Trust ("Trust") is designed and is being operated as a taxable trust in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code.

US GAAP requires the Plan administrator to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Trust. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Trust and has concluded that there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Trust has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Trust is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**Note 4: Subsequent Events**

In preparing the accompanying financial statements, the Plan management has reviewed all known events that have occurred after December 31, 2024, and through October 09, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, for inclusion in the financial statements and footnotes.
