We have performed audits of the financial statements of the Steel Technologies LLC Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following description of the Steel Technologies LLC Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Steel Technologies LLC (the “Company”). Employees become eligible to make elective deferrals when they have completed two months of service and are age eighteen or older. Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the payroll period coinciding with or next following the date on which the eligibility requirements are met. A participant must also complete one year of service to become eligible for any Company contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

During March 2024, the East Iowa Machine Company 401(k) Plan, Hawkeye Metal Spinning, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan, and JBT Machining Inc 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan were merged into the Plan. Assets approximating \$31.2 million were transferred to the Plan pursuant to the mergers.

Administration – The Plan sponsor has designated certain employees, who serve without additional compensation, to administer the Plan. The Plan administrator has the overall responsibility and authority as the named fiduciary to manage and control the operations and administration of the Plan and may designate one or more individuals to perform those responsibilities.

Contributions – Upon meeting eligibility requirements as defined in the Plan Agreement, participants of the Plan are permitted to make pre-tax and after-tax Roth contributions to the Plan up to 50% of their annual eligible compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan Agreement provides for automatic enrollment of all newly eligible employees. For eligible employees who are automatically enrolled, a pre-tax deferral in the amount of 3% of eligible compensation will be contributed to the Plan unless the employee elects a different percentage or elects to not contribute to the Plan. This percentage is increased by 1% each Plan year until the 6% maximum percentage under the Plan provision has been achieved. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Contributions are subject to certain limitations as outlined in the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”).

The Plan provides for a Company safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of the first 3% of compensation each eligible participant contributes to the Plan plus 50% of the next 3% contributed. The Plan allows for an annual true-up computation and adjustments relating to matching contributions. In addition, the Company may elect to make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan to be allocated as set forth in the Plan Agreement. There was no discretionary contribution for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024.

Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit and defined contribution plans. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participant Accounts – Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions as well as an allocation of Company discretionary contributions (if any) and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with their withdrawals and an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, specific participant transaction costs or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and Company safe harbor matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes 100% vested after three years of credited service.

Note 1—Description of the Plan (continued)

Investment Options – Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. They may change their investment options among those investments provided at any time during the Plan year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, whichever is less. Generally, the term of the loan may not exceed five years. However, if the loan is for the purchase of a participant's principal residence, the Plan administrator may permit a longer term. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the rate of prime plus 1%. Principal and interest is repaid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits – Upon termination of service or attaining normal retirement age, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or periodic payments not exceeding the participant's life expectancy. In-service and hardship withdrawals are also allowed as defined in the Plan Agreement.

Forfeited Accounts – The nonvested portion of former participants' accounts may be used to reinstate previously forfeited participant account balances, pay Plan expenses, or reduce employer contributions. Forfeiture activity was insignificant for the Plan year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the Plan year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Investment Management Fees and Operating Expenses – Investment management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments in the various funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are reflected as a component of net appreciation (depreciation) in fair values of investments.

Administrative Expenses – Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company or Plan participants, as defined in the Plan Agreement.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid. There were no benefit payments requested and not yet disbursed at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 3—Information certified by the qualified institutions (unaudited)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Trust Company LLC ("Empower Trust"), and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America ("Empower Annuity"), qualified institutions, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule.

- Investments at fair value, investments at contract value, and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Note 4—Fair value measurements

U.S. GAAP provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 4—Fair value measurements (continued)

The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are, therefore, classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Collective Trust Funds – Valued at NAV of units held by the Plan at year-end provided by the issuer of the fund. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on the value of the underlying investment assets owned by the fund, minus its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments. Investments valued using NAV as a practical expedient are not reflected in the valuation hierarchy.

Pooled Separate Account (“PSA”) – Valued at NAV of units held by the Plan at year-end provided by the issuer of the account. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on the value of the underlying investment assets held through a subaccount of an insurance company. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the account will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. The PSA is comprised, primarily, of shares of mutual funds at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The PSA seeks to mirror the investment objectives and strategies of the underlying mutual fund for which the PSA is named. The investment is redeemable at the adjusted NAV on a daily basis under an agreement with the insurance company. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on this investment. Investments valued using NAV as a practical expedient are not reflected in the valuation hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5—Fully benefit-responsive investment contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Annuity that invests contributions in the Select Guaranteed Fund. Empower Annuity maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Empower may impose restrictions on the ability to move Plan assets into or out of this investment option or among investment options in general under the contract. Under the contract, Empower Annuity is contractually obligated to repay to the Plan the principal and a specified interest rate.

The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Annuity, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The methodology for calculating the interest crediting rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium-long term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate, as stated in the contract, and prevailing market conditions.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Empower Annuity. Such events include the following: (i) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan); (ii) changes to Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; or (iii) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such event which would limit the Plan’s ability to transact at contract value with participants has occurred or is probable.

Note 6—Related party and party-in-interest transactions

Certain administrative services are provided by the Company at no cost to the Plan and certain administrative costs incurred by the Plan are paid by the Company. The Plan has entered into various service agreements with parties-in-interest. It invests in a fully benefit-responsive investment contract and PSA managed by Empower Annuity and a mutual fund managed by an affiliate of Empower Trust. These transactions as well as notes receivable from participants and related activity qualify as party-in-interest.

Note 7—Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 8—Income tax status

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) ruled on November 14, 2022, that the pre-approved plan upon which the Plan is based, is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receipt of the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 9—Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants’ account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Note 10—Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through September 29, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued and has determined there are no additional subsequent events that require disclosure.
