Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the Redwood Partners Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Opinion

Basis for Opinion

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Redwood Partners Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of Redwood Management, LLC (the “Company”) who have reached the first day of the month following their hire date, have ninety days of service, and are age eighteen or older. The 401(k) Investment Committee of the Company controls and manages the operation and administration of the Plan. Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC (“Transamerica”) serves as the recordkeeper and State Street Bank and Trust Company (“State Street”) serves as the trustee of the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute compensation, as defined in the Plan document, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations. Participant salary deferrals may be traditional 401(k) (“pretax”) or Roth 401(k) (“after-tax”). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts. The Company shall make matching employer Safe Harbor contributions on behalf of each of its eligible participants at 100% of the first 4% of eligible wages that a participant contributed to the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers a variety of mutual funds as investment options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions, Company contributions and allocations of Plan earnings. The account is charged with benefit payments, transaction fees, and allocations of administrative expenses and Plan losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferral and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s contribution portion of their accounts is immediate.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 minus the highest outstanding balance of loans in the past 12 months, or one-half of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. As of December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum amount as provided by the Plan document. Amounts contributed on a before-tax basis may only be withdrawn upon demonstration of financial hardship, disability, or after the participant reaches the age of 59.5 years.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$51,635. These accounts may be used to reduce Company contributions and Plan expenses. In 2024, forfeitures totaling \$30,269 were used to reduce Company contributions and Plan expenses.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets, changes in net assets, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Quoted market prices, if available, are used to value investments. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Contributions

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan Document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Company's discretion.

Note 3. Certification of Plan Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, State Street Bank, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024
- Investment income and interest income from notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 4. Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by the trustee as defined by the Plan, and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund.

The Plan paid \$113,251 of recordkeeping fees to Transamerica during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 5. Disclosures About Fair Value of Plan Assets and Liabilities

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements must maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. The hierarchy comprises three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities
- Level 2** Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies and inputs used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis and recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits, as well as the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. The Plan had no liabilities measured at fair value on a recurring basis. In addition, the Plan had no assets or liabilities measured at fair value on a nonrecurring basis.

Investments

Where quoted market prices are available in an active market, securities are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy. Mutual funds are publicly traded investments and are valued daily at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7. Transfer of Plan Assets or Rollover Contributions

On January 1, 2024, Redwood Management, LLC established the Redwood Partners Retirement Plan and approved amendments to merge the following retirement plans into the newly formed Plan: ABC-Allbritten Employee's Retirement Plan, The HVAC Pro, Inc. dba Apollo Heating & Cooling, Arlinghaus Air 401(k) Plan, Best Care Home Services, Inc. 401(k) Plan, Environment Masters, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, John C Flood, Inc. 401(k) Plan, Rite Way Heating, Cooling, and Plumbing, LLC, Service Plus Heating & Air Conditioning Inc. Retirement Readiness 401(k) Plan, Union Main Group LLC 401(k) Plan, and Keefe's Air Conditioning & Heating 401(k) Plan. All participants in the merging plans became 100% vested in their respective plans upon termination and were provided the option to have their account balance rolled into any qualified plan (including the "Plan") or IRA or receive a lump-sum distribution. An aggregate of \$23,165,143 was transferred into the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024, and is included as a transfer on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Additionally, effective September 1, 2024, B&J Plumbing, Heating & Air Conditioning adopted the Plan as a Related Participating Employer. This adoption did not involve a plan merger but represents a new plan setup under the Plan.

Note 8. Tax Status

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the prototype plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the document sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the prototype plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 10. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invested in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities could occur in the near term and that such changes would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 11. Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 6, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Effective January 1, 2025, Redwood Management, LLC amended the Redwood Partners Retirement Plan to implement an automatic elective deferral feature under an Eligible Automatic Contribution Arrangement ("EACA"). The amendment introduced a default deferral rate of 3% for newly hired employees, with annual escalation of 1% up to a maximum of 10%. Participants are permitted to make permissible withdrawals within 90 days of their first automatic deferral. This change is intended to enhance employee participation and streamline plan administration.

Following the close of the reporting period on December 31, 2024, the Plan experienced several plan mergers. On January 2, 2025, the merger of the Crisafulli Bros. Plumbing & Heating Contractors, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan resulted in the transfer of approximately \$6,296,837 in plan assets to the Redwood Plan. As part of this merger, matching and nonelective contributions accrued under the Crisafulli plan were transferred and are now permitted for hardship withdrawals. Former participants retain a normal retirement age of 55, and these transferred contributions are both 100% immediately vested and eligible for in-service withdrawals upon reaching age 55.

On January 14, 2025, the Parks Heating & Cooling, Inc. Capital Accumulation Plan was merged into the Redwood Plan, transferring approximately \$706,372 in assets. The merger included the transfer of prior employer matching contributions, which are now available for hardship withdrawals and are 100% immediately vested. These contributions are also permitted for in-service withdrawals upon attainment of age 59½.

Most recently, effective August 1, 2025, the Tony's Plumbing Service Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust was merged into the Redwood Plan, contributing approximately \$710,530 in plan assets. Nonelective contributions from the prior plan were transferred and are permitted for both hardship withdrawals and in-service withdrawals upon age 59½. These contributions are subject to a six-year graded vesting schedule, except in cases of death or disability, in which former participants are immediately 100% vested.
