We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.



Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect Management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, Management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by Management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.



We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedules, as listed in the accompanying table of contents, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of Management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion:

- The form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that Management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Progressive Planning - a 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the benefit of eligible employees of Frontier Management, LLC and various related participating employers (the Employer). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). Charles Schwab Trust Company and Standard Insurance Company (Standard) (collectively, "the Custodians") are the appointed custodians of the Plan's assets. The Plan is administered by the Retirement Committee of the Progressive Planning – a 401(k) Retirement Plan, whose members are employees of the Employer and participants in the Plan. Participants may direct their contributions and account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Eligibility

Employees – other than those who are part-time, seasonal, or temporary employees – are eligible to participate in the Plan and make salary deferrals if they are at least 21 years of age and have completed 90 days of eligible service. Employees are eligible to receive Employer matching contributions if they are at least 21 years of age and have completed one year of eligible service. In addition, the same employees are eligible to receive other Employer contributions if they are employed on the last day of the Plan year and have completed one year of eligible service. Qualifying employees may participate in the Plan on the first day of the Plan year or first day of the seventh month of the Plan year following the date that they meet the eligibility requirements.

Contributions

The Plan includes a salary deferral provision which provides for both pre-tax contributions and after-tax Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants may elect to defer a percentage of their eligible compensation up to the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) each year. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (i.e., rollover contributions).

The Employer may elect to make matching contributions, other Employer contributions, or both to the Plan. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Employer elected to match 50% of each participant's contributions up to 8% of the participant's eligible compensation, as determined on a per-pay period basis. There were no other Employer contributions during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Contributions received from participants for 2024 and 2023 are net of payments of \$44,206 and \$110,419 made in 2025 and 2024, respectively, to certain active participants to return to them excess deferral contributions as required to satisfy the relevant nondiscrimination provisions of the Plan. These amounts are also included in the Plan's statements of net assets available for benefits as excess contributions payable as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited (charged) with the participant's contributions and allocations of (a) the Employer's contributions, (b) Plan earnings (losses), and (c) administrative expenses. Earnings (losses) for each investment fund are allocated to participants' accounts based on the individual participant's account balance as compared to the total balance of the related investment fund. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their voluntary salary contributions, rollover contributions, and the actual earnings (losses) thereon. Vesting in the Employer matching contributions and other Employer contributions is based on years of service as follows:

In addition, upon death or retirement at age 65 or older, participants will immediately become 100% vested in their share of the Employer's contributions and the actual earnings (losses) thereon.

Forfeitures

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts were approximately \$298,000 and \$184,000, respectively. At the Employer's discretion, forfeited accounts may be used to reduce future Employer contributions and/or to pay Plan expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures were not used to reduce Employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2023, Employer contributions were reduced by forfeitures of approximately \$8,000.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may elect to borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance, reduced by the highest outstanding participant note receivable balance in the preceding one-year period. A participant may have only one loan outstanding at any time. Notes receivable from participants are secured by the balances in the respective participants' accounts. Terms of notes receivable from participants range from one to five years, unless used to acquire the participant's principal residence, in which case the term may be extended up to 30 years. The notes receivable from participants bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the plan administrator. Interest rates on notes receivable from participants outstanding as of December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant (or their beneficiary) may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or partial withdrawals of at least \$1,000. For termination of service for other reasons, distributions of vested balances less than or equal to \$1,000 are automatically made in a lump-sum. If the terminated participant's vested balance exceeds \$1,000 but is less than \$5,000, and the participant does not elect to receive a distribution, the Plan permits the plan administrator to make a distribution directly to an individual retirement account set up on the participant's behalf. For vested balances greater than or equal to \$5,000, the Plan permits a participant to elect distribution by lump-sum or partial withdrawals of at least \$1,000. Upon reaching age 59½, participants may make in-service withdrawals of part or all of their vested account balance, including the related earnings (losses).

Hardship withdrawals

Participants who are still employed by the Employer are permitted to take withdrawals from their accounts under certain financial hardship conditions, as described in the Plan document.

Administrative expenses

At the Employer's discretion, administrative expenses of the Plan may be paid directly by the Employer; certain other administrative expenses may be paid by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from the accompanying financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the related participants' accounts and are included in administrative expenses in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are offset against net appreciation or included in net depreciation in fair value of investments in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Retirement Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Custodians. See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because contract value is the amount that participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Investment income recognition

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the note receivable to be in default, the note receivable balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent events

Management has evaluated, for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements, subsequent events that have occurred through October 13, 2025, which is the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Certified Investments

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments and notes receivable held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments and interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the years then ended, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the Custodians, qualified institutions.

4. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract (the Contract) with Standard. Standard maintains the related contributions in its general account. The general account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The Contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

As described in Note 2, because the Contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the Contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Standard, represents contributions made under the Contract, plus earnings, less withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The crediting interest rate is determined by Standard based on a formula agreed upon between the Plan and Standard. Such interest rate is reviewed by Standard on a quarterly basis for resetting and takes into account yield forecasts from Standard's asset advisory group and other factors. The crediting interest rate of the Contract may not be less than 1.00%. The crediting interest rate as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 3.04% and 2.78%, respectively.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk associated with the Contract issuer or the underlying investments. However, the Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the Contract issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The Contract issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events may limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with Standard. Such events include termination of the Contract, spinoffs, divestitures, layoffs, corporate relocation, partial or total Plan termination, bankruptcy, retirement incentive programs, and the liberalization of Plan withdrawal or transfer rules. Standard may terminate the contract with 30 days advance written notice to the Plan for reasonable cause, which includes the Plan's failure to abide by state or federal law, failure to render performance necessary to comply with the terms of the contract, failure to maintain assets of at least \$25,000, and Plan disqualification. Upon occurrence of any of these events, a market value adjustment may apply. The plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants, is probable.

5. Fair Value Measurements

GAAP defines fair value, establishes a framework for measuring fair value, and requires certain disclosures about fair value measurements. The hierarchy of fair value valuation techniques under GAAP provides for three levels: Level 1 provides the most reliable measure of fair value, whereas Level 3, if applicable, generally would require significant management judgment. The three levels for categorizing assets and liabilities under GAAP's fair value measurement requirements are as follows:

- Level 1: Fair value of the asset or liability is determined using unadjusted quoted prices in active markets (that the Plan has the ability to access) for identical assets or liabilities;
- Level 2: Fair value of the asset or liability is determined using inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the applicable asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar (as opposed to identical) assets or liabilities in active markets and quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active; and
- Level 3: Fair value of the asset or liability is determined using unobservable inputs that are significant to the fair value measurement and reflect the Plan's own assumptions regarding the applicable asset or liability.

An asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodology used for the Plan's assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodology used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds – The fair value of mutual funds is based on the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

6. Related Party Transactions

One of the Plan's investments is invested in the Contract offered by Standard. Therefore, transactions involving the Contract qualify as party-in-interest.

The Employer is the sponsor of the Plan and paid certain administrative expenses of the Plan during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. In addition, the plan administrator is a participant in the Plan.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan's termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

8. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a prototype defined contribution retirement plan (the Prototype Plan) developed by Pension Plan Specialists PC (PPS). The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed PPS by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Prototype Plan is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since PPS received the original designation letter, the plan administrator and the Plan's legal counsel believe that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires the plan administrator to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the accompanying financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment instruments which are exposed to certain risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the Plan's investments will occur in the near-term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules.
