Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of MegaMex Foods, LLC's 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ("ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL's") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier ("qualified institution") in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

1. Description of Plan

The following summary description of MegaMex Foods, LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement and the Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

On April 1, 1985, MegaMex Foods, LLC (the “Employer”) adopted the Plan, which was most recently restated effective February 18, 2022, to bring the Plan into compliance with legislative and regulatory changes. The Plan is a contribution profit-sharing retirement plan containing a cash or deferred arrangement described in Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) Section 401(k). Employees that have attained the age of 21 and have completed 3 months of service are eligible to participate in the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”) and certain provisions of the IRC.

Plan Administration

The Employer is the administrator of the Plan. As administrator, the Employer has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan. Principal Life Insurance Company was the appointed custodian for the Plan for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, and acted at the direction of the Plan’s administrator.

Contributions

Employees who elect to participate in the Plan may contribute a portion of their salary up to 100% of their compensation for that period, or up to the limits imposed by Section 402(g) of the IRC. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may elect to make pre-tax elective deferral contributions and/or Roth contributions to the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The Employer makes matching contributions based on employee elective deferrals. Generally, the Employer’s matching contributions will be the lesser of 100% of the employee elective deferral, or 4% of compensation. Additionally, the Plan allows qualified non-elective contributions at the discretion of the Plan Employer. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contributions, employer contributions, Plan earnings or losses, and rollovers from other qualified plans. Plan earnings or losses are allocated based upon each participant’s account balance. Certain fees are charged to the fund investments and are offset against Plan investment income and loss as presented on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Participants should refer to the prospectuses of these funds for details on the various types and amounts of investment fees charged to the Plan and their individual accounts.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their elective contributions, as adjusted for actual earnings or losses thereon. For the Employer’s matching and discretionary contributions, each participant is immediately vested.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants can only have one loan outstanding at any time and may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to 50% of the value of their account balance, or \$50,000, whichever is less. Note receivable terms range from one to five years, except for notes receivable used to purchase a primary residence, which have a maximum term of 10 years. The notes receivable are secured by no more than 50% of the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates at the time the note receivable originates. Interest rates on notes receivable from participants ranged from 3.25% to 8.50% per annum as of December 31, 2024. Principal and interest are paid in equal installments through payroll deductions, personal checks from employees on leave, or cashier's checks for the full payoff of the notes receivable.

Payments of Benefits

When participants terminate their employment with the Employer, upon retirement or for any other reason, those participants (or their beneficiaries) may receive the vested value of their account in a single lump-sum payment. The Plan also allows for in-service withdrawals upon a participant attaining the age of 59½, or having a hardship. In-service withdrawals may be taken from the pre-tax elective deferral account, matching contributions, profit sharing contributions, and rollover accounts as long as they are vested, with the exception of hardships that may not be taken from matching contributions or profit-sharing contributions. In addition, the Plan allows for withdrawals of any rollover contributions at any time.

Distributions under the Plan shall generally be made as soon as possible after the date of retirement, date of death, or termination of employment. Mandatory distributions of account balances under \$5,000 will be made as soon as possible. In the event of a mandatory distribution greater than \$1,000, if the participant does not elect to have such distribution paid directly to an eligible retirement plan specified by the participant in a direct rollover or to receive the distribution directly, then the Plan's administrator will pay the distribution in a direct rollover to an Individual Retirement Account designated by the Plan's administrator.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct his or her contributions in percentage increments into a series of mutual funds, common/collective trusts, pooled separate accounts, guaranteed investment contract and a money market fund offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

Forfeitures

As participants are immediately vested in the Employer's matching and discretionary contributions, there are no forfeited non-vested participant account balances as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, and changes therein, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities and changes in net assets available for benefits. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisor and custodian. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are reflected on a trade date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments sold during the year, as well as any unrealized appreciation or depreciation on investments held at year-end.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Employer. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Information Certified by the Custodian

Principal Life Insurance Company has prepared and certified as complete and accurate the Plan's schedule of investment assets, transactions, and net realized and unrealized gains and losses on investments, and interest and dividend income, which was used to prepare the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards for fair value measurements establish a framework for determining fair value, which provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under these accounting standards are described below:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common/collective trusts: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Pooled separate accounts: Valued at the NAV of units of the separate account. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the separate account, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the account in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. Investment Contract with Principal Financial Group

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Principal Financial Group (“Principal”) totaling \$1,939,984 and \$1,895,803 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Principal maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0%. The crediting interest rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement for the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendment to the Plan document (including complete or partial termination or merger with another plan.), (2) changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Employer or other Employer events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

6. Related-Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are issued and managed by Principal. Principal Life Insurance Company, the custodian of the Plan, is a member of Principal. Any purchases and sales of these funds are performed in the open market at fair value. Such transactions, while considered party-in-interest transactions under ERISA regulations, are permitted under the provisions of the Plan, and are specifically exempt from the prohibition of party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net appreciation in fair value of the investments, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than a direct payment.

7. Tax Status

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by Principal Life Insurance Company. Principal Life Insurance Company received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) dated June 30, 2020, which states that the prototype plan document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received an opinion letter from the IRS. However, the Plan’s management believes that the Plan is currently designed and in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore, believes the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt. Accordingly, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan’s financial statements.

7. Tax Status, continued

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. No such liability has been recorded by the Plan. The Plan may be subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. Plan Termination

The Employer has established the Plan with the intention and expectation that the Plan will continue indefinitely. However, the Employer reserves the right at any time to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of termination of the Plan, distributions will be made to participants as described in the Plan agreement, and participants would become 100% vested in their Employer contributions.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of mutual funds, common/collective trusts, pooled separate accounts and the guaranteed investment contract offered by the Plan. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market fluctuations and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes on net assets available for benefits.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, approximately 10%, of net assets available for benefits are held in one fund.

10. Subsequent Events

In accordance with accounting standards affecting disclosures of subsequent events, the Plan evaluated subsequent events for recognition and disclosure through October 10, 2025, the date which these financial statements were available to be issued. Management concluded that no material subsequent events have occurred since December 31, 2024 that require recognition or disclosure in such financial statements.
