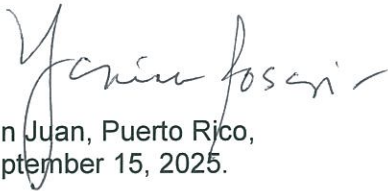

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

1. Plan Description:

The following description of the **Hewlett Packard Enterprise Puerto Rico Tax Savings Capital Accumulation Plan** (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

The Plan Sponsor is Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC, the Plan Administrator is the Benefits Board Committee established by Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC, the Trustee is Banco Popular de Puerto Rico, and Fidelity Management Trust Company is the investment manager and record keeper of the Plan. Refer to the twelfth amendment to the 2014 restated Plan explained below and to Note 6 – Subsequent Events – for further details on the most recent restatement of the Plan effective January 1, 2025.

General

The Plan is a Puerto Rico only qualified defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC, Hewlett Packard Enterprise III LLC, Hewlett Packard Enterprise V LLC, Hewlett Packard Enterprise I LLC, Hewlett Packard Enterprise CRL, Hewlett Packard Enterprise Holding CRL and Hewlett Packard Puerto Rico BV LLC (the Companies) (refer to Plan's amendments details below for participant employers' updates).

The Plan was originally established effectively on March 10, 1992. The Plan is intended to provide retirement benefits to Puerto Rico employees and to encourage and assist those employees in adopting a regular savings program by means of payroll deductions through a plan that qualifies under Sections 1081.01(a) and (d) of the Puerto Rico Internal Revenue Code of 2011, as amended (PR Code). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employees' Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Plan is funded through a Puerto Rico situs trust exempt from Puerto Rico taxation under Section 1081.01(a) of the PR Code, and from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (US Code), in conformity with Section 1022(i)(1) of ERISA.

The Plan has been amended and restated several times. The Plan document in effect as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 was effective January 1, 2014 (2014 Plan Restatement) and subsequently amended as here-in explained.

The first amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement became effective on August 1, 2015, in connection with the separation in Puerto Rico of Hewlett Packard Enterprise Company (HPE), the former Hewlett-Packard Company (HP) enterprise technology infrastructure, software, services and financing businesses (the Separation). In connection with the Separation, HP changed its name to HP Inc. (HPI). Effective August 1, 2015, the name of the Plan was changed to Hewlett Packard Enterprise Puerto Rico Tax Savings Capital Accumulation Plan. Effective August 1, 2015, and as a result of the Separation, a new defined contribution Plan was created for the employees of HPI. Balances of participants' accounts whose employment transferred to HPI, including notes receivable, totaling \$32,745,775 were transferred into the HP Inc. Puerto Rico Tax Savings Capital Accumulation Plan.

The second amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement was made August 10, 2016, to reflect the adoption of the Plan by Hewlett Packard Caribe y Andina BV LLC, an affiliate of HPE, which commenced operations in Puerto Rico on July 25, 2016, to benefit its employees in Puerto Rico.

The third amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement was made effective October 31, 2016, to provide the termination of Hewlett Packard Technology Center, Inc., an entity whose employees were covered under the Plan, as an adopting employer under the Plan. Hewlett Packard Technology Center, Inc. was closed, and its employees were transferred to Hewlett-Packard Caribe BV LLC.

The fourth amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement was adopted to reflect: i) effective December 1, 2016, the adoption of the Plan by Enterprise Services Caribe LLC, an affiliate of HPE, until the completion of a spin-off and merger of the enterprise services business of Enterprise Services Caribe LLC with Computer Sciences Corporation, a public company unrelated to HPE, which was known after the spin-off and merger as DXC Technologies; and ii) effective April 1, 2017, termination of Enterprise Services Caribe LLC as an affiliate of HPE and an adopting employer under the Plan because of the foregoing spin-off and merger, and that the employees in Puerto Rico of Enterprise Services Caribe LLC who participated in the Plan before said date incurred in separation of service, which entitled them to receive distributions from the Plan.

The fifth amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement was adopted to reflect: i) effective June 1, 2017, the adoption of the Plan by Entco Caribe B.V. LLC and Entco Puerto Rico, B.V. LLC, both HPE affiliates, to benefit their employees in Puerto Rico until the completion of a spin-off and merger of the software business of HPE with Micro Focus International, plc, a public company unrelated to HPE, by August 31, 2017; and ii) effective September 1, 2017, the termination of Entco Caribe B.V. LLC and Entco Puerto Rico, B.V. LLC as HPE affiliates and adopting employers of the Plan, and the transfer of assets and liabilities attributable to the employees of Entco Caribe B.V. LLC and Entco Puerto Rico, B.V. LLC from the Plan to the Entco Puerto Rico Tax Savings Capital Accumulation Plan, a new profit sharing plan containing a cash or deferred arrangement intended to be qualified under the PR Code. Balances of participants' accounts in the Plan related Entco Caribe B.V. LLC and Entco Puerto Rico, B.V. LLC, including notes receivable, totaling \$445,803 were transferred from the Plan into the Entco Puerto Rico Tax Savings Capital Accumulation Plan.

The sixth amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement was adopted: i) effective February 8, 2017, to incorporate the changes made by Puerto Rico Act No. 9 of February 2, 2017 and Puerto Rico Act No. 106 of August 23, 2017 to the definition of "Highly Compensated Employee" under Section 1081.01(d)(3)(E)(iii) of the PR Code and to add the actual deferral percentage safe harbor rule under Section 1081.01(d)(3)(A) of the PR Code; ii) effective February 19, 2018, to reflect the adoption of the Plan by Hewlett Packard Enterprise CRL, a new HPE entity, for the benefit of its employees; and iii) effective from September 20, 2017 through June 30, 2018, to provide for eligible distributions, whether in-service withdrawals or lump-sum distributions, as applicable, from the Plan to participants and beneficiaries affected by Hurricane María in conformity with the Puerto Rico Treasury Department Administrative Determination No. 17-29 of November 15, 2017, as modified, and the requirements, rules and procedures established by the Plan Administrator.

The seventh amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement became effective on April 1, 2019, to approve the adoption of the Plan by Hewlett Packard Enterprise Holdings CRL to benefit its employees in Puerto Rico, including those that were transferred from Hewlett Packard Enterprise CRL. On April 1, 2019, certain employees of Hewlett Packard Enterprise CRL, a wholly owned subsidiary of Hewlett-Packard Caribe BV LLC, who were participating or eligible to participate in the Plan were transferred to Hewlett Packard Enterprise Holdings CRL, a limited liability company organized under the laws of Puerto Rico and an affiliated entity of the Company.

The eighth amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement was adopted on November 1, 2019, when, pursuant to a reorganization plan, Hewlett-Packard Caribbean Manufacturing BV LLC sold its Puerto Rico business operations and assets to Hewlett-Packard Caribe BV LLC. As of this date, Hewlett-Packard Manufacturing BV LLC is no longer an affiliate of HPE and its employer under the Plan. Employees in Puerto Rico of Hewlett-Packard Caribbean Manufacturing BV LLC, who were participating or eligible to participate in the Plan were transferred to Hewlett-Packard Caribe BV LLC on October 14, 2019, and continue to participate in the Plan in conformity with the terms and conditions of the Plan after said date.

The ninth amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement became effective on February 27, 2020, to authorize declared disaster distributions, whether as an in-service withdrawal or total distribution in cash, from the Plan, known as "Special Disaster Distributions" to participants, beneficiaries or alternative payees, as applicable, affected by a disaster for which the Governor of Puerto Rico has issued a disaster declaration in accordance with Section 1081.01(b)(1)(D) of the PR Code, as described by the applicable guidance issued by the Puerto Rico Treasury Department.

Due to the disaster declarations issued by the Governor of Puerto Rico and the President of the United States of America in 2020 resulting from the earthquakes that struck Puerto Rico in January 2020 and the novel coronavirus pandemic which commenced in late 2019 (COVID-19 Pandemic), the Plan Administrator authorized Special Disaster Distributions from the Plan to affected participants, beneficiaries, or alternatives payees, as applicable, in conformity with guidance issued by the Puerto Rico Treasury Department Internal Revenue Circular Letters No. 20-09, No. 20-23, No. 20-24, and No. 20-29, and subject to the rules and procedures established by the Plan's Administrator.

To lessen the financial burdens resulting from the COVID-19 Pandemic, the tenth amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement provided Hewlett-Packard Caribe BV LLC to authorize the temporary suspension of employer matching contributions to participants under the Plan for payroll periods from July 6, 2020, through January 3, 2021. Employer matching contributions for Plan year 2020 were made with respect to payroll periods before July 6, 2020.

As a result of the disaster declarations issued by the Governor of Puerto Rico and the President of the United States of America because of Hurricane Fiona, on October 24, 2022, the Plan Administrator authorized Special Disaster Distributions from the Plan to affected participants, beneficiaries, or alternatives payees, as applicable, in conformity with guidance issued by the Puerto Rico Treasury Department Internal Revenue Circular Letter No. 22-13, and subject to the rules and procedures established by the Plan's Administrator.

The eleventh amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement became effective on April 1, 2023. The HPE PR Entities operating in Puerto Rico were reorganized to ensure compliance with changes to the federal tax regime. As a result of this corporate reorganization, the sponsorship of the Plan was transferred from Hewlett-Packard Caribe BV LLC to Hewlett Packard Enterprise II BV LLC, a private limited liability company incorporated under the laws of the Netherlands. Effective April 1, 2023, the 2014 restated Plan was further amended to reflect Hewlett Packard Enterprise II BV LLC as sponsor and participating employer of the Plan, and to incorporate Hewlett Packard Enterprise I LLC as participating employer of the Plan.

The HPE PR Entities operating in Puerto Rico continued their reorganization in 2024. As a result, effective March 1, 2024, the sponsorship of the Plan was transferred from Hewlett Packard Enterprise II BV LLC to Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC, a limited liability company organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico.

As an additional result of the 2024 Reorganization, Hewlett Packard Enterprise III LLC, Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC and Hewlett Packard Enterprise V LLC, three limited liabilities companies organized under the laws of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, adopted the HPE PR Plan as participating employers for the benefit of their employees on March 1, 2024 (the effective date) in conformity with Section 2.16 of the HPE PR Plan.

Effective March 1, 2024, the 2014 Plan Restatement was further amended by Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC by adopting the twelfth amendment. This amendment was adopted to reflect Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC as sponsor and participating employer of the Plan, to incorporate Hewlett Packard Enterprise III LLC, and Hewlett Packard Enterprise V LLC as participating employers of the Plan and to authorize the end of Hewlett Packard Enterprise II BV LLC, Hewlett Packard Caribe y Andina BV LLC, and Hewlett-Packard Caribe BV LLC as participating employers under the Plan.

Eligibility

An employee becomes a member of the Plan during the first pay period of the month immediately following the date of employment.

Contributions

Participants of the Plan may authorize the Companies to make contributions to the Plan from payroll deductions of their monthly compensation before amounts paid for insurance or other welfare benefits, if any. At no time may participant pre-tax contributions exceed \$15,000 for 2013 and beyond, the limit imposed as per Section 1081.01(d) of the PR Code. With the approval of the Plan's Administrator, participants may also contribute amounts representing rollovers from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans.

The Companies match participants' contributions based on predetermined matching contribution percentages, as follows:

<u>Participant's Payroll Deduction Percentage</u>	<u>Matching Percentage Contribution</u>
From 1% to 3%	100%
From 4% to 5%	50%

Participants' Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan's participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's applicable pre-tax, and/or rollover contributions and allocations of: (a) the Companies' matching and discretionary contributions, and (b) Plan earnings. Allocations are based on participant's share of the Plan's income (losses) and any related expenses.

The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. The change in the value of the Plan's invested assets is posted to the participant's account on a daily basis.

Investment Alternatives

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct its contributions, along with the Companies' matching contribution, in: (a) entirely in any one of the available funds; or (b) divided between any two or more of such investment funds in multiples of 5%. Funds are managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company.

Vesting

Participants' contributions are always vested and shall not be subject to forfeiture for any reason. A participant who first becomes an employee before October 1, 2012, is fully vested on the matching contributions. A participant who first becomes an employee on or after October 1, 2012, will be 100% vested on the matching contributions upon the earlier of: (1) three years of service; (2) attainment of age 65; (3) death; or (4) becoming eligible for disability benefits under the Companies' long term disability benefits program.

Payment of Benefits

Payment of benefit shall be made as soon as practicable after the date of termination of employment as and not later than sixty days after the end of the Plan year in which:

- the participant attains age 65, or if later.
- employment terminates.

Distribution of participant accounts may be made in: (a) one lump-sum cash payment, or (b) cash installments over a certain period. In the case of reaching the early retirement age of 55 or a participant termination because of death or disability, the entire account balance amount is paid to the person or persons legally entitled thereto regardless of the years of service.

If, at the time of distribution, the value of a participant's vested benefit is one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or less, the Plan administrator will immediately distribute such benefit without the participant's consent. However, a participant's vested benefit may not be paid without written consent if the value exceeds one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants should not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the participant's vested account balance. In no event will the amount of any loan granted to a participant exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or be less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000).

Loans to participants under the Plan may be repaid within five years of the date on which the loan is made, except loans used to acquire a principal residence of the participant which may be repaid within fifteen years. The notes receivable from a participant are secured by the balance in the participant's account and will bear interest at one percent (1%) above the prime rate (as published by Reuters). Principal and interest are repaid to the Plan ratably through payroll deductions or manual loan repayments.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Companies have the right under the Plan provisions to discontinue their contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants shall be fully vested and nonforfeitable in their accrued benefits as of the date of termination or discontinuance.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan have been prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonable possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and those changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Investments and Notes Receivable from Participants Valuation

The Plan's investments are stated at fair market value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Quoted market prices are used to value investments, which represent the net asset value of units held by the Plan at year-end. Notes receivable from participants are valued at their outstanding principal amount, plus accrued but unpaid interest. Refer to Note 3 – Fair Value Measurements – for more information.

Purchases and sales of investment units are reflected on a trade date basis. Income is recorded as earned on an accrual basis.

In accordance with the policy of stating investments at fair market value, net unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of investments for the year is reflected in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

Management fees and certain operating expenses charged to the Plan for investments are deducted from income earned daily and are not separately reflected. Consequently, these management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction in the investment return for such investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded.

If a participant does not make repayments and the Plan administrator considers the participant to be in default, the balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document. Notes are considered in default if any scheduled payment remains unpaid beyond the last day of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the participant missed the scheduled payment. Outstanding notes receivable on December 31, 2024, have final maturities ranging from January 2025 December 2029, for general purpose loans, and September 2031 for principal residence acquisition loans, and carry an interest rate ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%.

Contributions

Participant contributions and employer matching contributions are recorded in the period in which the Companies make the payroll deductions from the Participant's compensation. Discretionary contributions are posted to Participant accounts annually.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits payments to participants are recorded upon distributions.

Administrative Expenses

Certain expenses for the administration of the Plan were paid by the Companies and amounted to approximately \$99,200 during the Plan year ended December 31, 2024.

3. Fair Value Measurements:

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Valuation techniques used by the Plan are based upon observable and unobservable inputs.

Observable or market inputs reflect market data obtained from independent sources, while unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's assumptions about market participant assumptions based on the best information available.

Assets and liabilities are classified in the fair value hierarchy based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement:

- Level 1 – Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2 – Quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, and model-based valuation techniques for which all significant assumptions are observable in the market or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the asset or liabilities.
- Level 3 – Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to observable inputs and lowest priority to unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities:

- Mutual funds: Valued at quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value of shares held by the Plan at year-end.
- Short-term investments: Valued at cost plus accrued interest, which approximates fair value.

4. Tax Status:

The Plan holds a favorable determination letter dated October 15, 2024, wherein the Puerto Rico Treasury Department certified that the Plan, as modified by the eleventh amendment to the 2014 Plan Restatement, continues to meet the qualifications requirements under Sections 1081.01(a) and (d) of the PR Code, and that the trust forming part of the Plan continues to be exempt from Puerto Rico income tax. Pursuant to Section 1022(i)(1) of ERISA, the Puerto Rico situs trust funding the Plan is intended to be exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(a) of the US Code. The Plan has been amended and restated since receiving the October 15, 2024 determination letter. Based on the best knowledge and belief, the Plan Administrator understands that the Plan, as currently being designed and operated, meets the applicable requirements of the PR Code, ERISA, and the regulations issued thereunder. The Plan's legal counsel comprehends that the Plan complies in form with Sections 1081.01(a) and (d) of the PR Code.

Generally accepted accounting principles in the United States of America requires the Plan to evaluate uncertain tax positions. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more likely than not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the tax authorities. The Plan has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions and regulators; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

5. Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions:

The Plan engages in certain transactions involving the Fidelity Management Trust Company and affiliates of Fidelity Investments, The Vanguard Group, Inc. and Banco Popular de Puerto Rico, which are, or have at certain times in the audited period been, parties-in-interest under the provisions of ERISA. The Plan invests in shares of mutual funds, fixed income funds and money market funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company, The Vanguard Group, Inc. and Banco Popular de Puerto Rico. Fidelity Management Trust Company is also the investment manager and record keeper of the Plan's investments and participants' accounts; and Banco Popular de Puerto Rico is the Plan's Trustee; therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Vanguard Group, Inc. owns more than ten percent (10%) of Hewlett Packard Enterprise Company, parent entity of the Companies participating in the Plan. Fees paid by the Plan for investment management and recordkeeping services are included as a deduction of net assets available for benefits.

On December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held \$19,931,959 and \$15,263,301, respectively, of The Vanguard Group Inc. shares of fixed income and money market funds. In addition, the Plan held shares of mutual funds managed by Fidelity Management Trust Company as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaling \$157,042,897 and \$129,849,535, respectively. Also, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan has a demand deposit account with Banco Popular de Puerto Rico with balance of \$381 and \$16,581, respectively.

6. Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through September 15, 2025, the date the Plan's financial statements were available to be issued.

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan was most recently amended and restated to: i) incorporate all amendments adopted since the 2014 Plan Restatement; ii) incorporate certain provisions required by the SECURE 2.0 Act; and iii) make other miscellaneous changes (2025 Plan Restatement).

On February 21, 2025 and in conformity with Puerto Rico Treasury Department Tax Policy Circular Letter No. 16-08 of December 23, 2016, Hewlett Packard Enterprise IV LLC, through their legal counsel, applied for an updated determination letter for the Plan, as modified by the twelfth amendment made to the 2014 Plan Restatement and the adoption of the 2025 Plan Restatement, regarding such plan's continued tax qualified status under Sections 1081.01(a) and (d) of the PR Code. Based on the Plan's legal counsel, the February 21, 2025 application met the requirements of Puerto Rico Treasury Department Tax Policy Circular Letter No. 16-08 of December 23, 2016 to secure an updated determination letter, and the Plan, as modified by the twelfth amendment made to the 2014 Plan Restatement and the 2025 Plan Restatement, continues to comply in form with the applicable qualification requirements under Sections 1081.01(a) and (d) of the PR Code. To date, the Puerto Rico Treasury Department has not issued the requested determination letter for the Plan.
