Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Murphy Family Ventures, LLC 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (“ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit”). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Murphy Family Ventures, LLC 401(k) Plan’s financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (“investment information”) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (“qualified institution”).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors’ Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Murphy Family Ventures, LLC 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Murphy Family Ventures, LLC 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Murphy Family Ventures, LLC 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

1. Description of Plan

The following description of Murphy Family Ventures, LLC 401(k) Plan, formerly Murphy Family Ventures, LLC 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), provides only general information. Participants in the Plan should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan became effective on January 1, 2000. It is a defined contribution plan covering all non-union employees of Murphy Family Ventures, LLC (the "Company") who have completed three months of continuous employment and are age 18 or older. It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Contributions

Participants may contribute a percentage of their pre-tax annual compensation, not to exceed the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). Effective November 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to permit after-tax ("Roth") contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan also permits rollover contributions from other qualifying retirement plans. The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution. In 2024, the discretionary match was equal to \$0.50 for each \$1.00 contributed by the participant up to 6% of compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's contribution, and allocations of plan earnings and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. A participant is entitled to the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in the salary reduction amount contributed to the Plan. Participants are vested in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts based on credited years of service. A participant is fully vested after three years of service.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$11. Forfeited accounts may be used to pay plan expenses, reduce the employer matching contributions, or to reinstate previously forfeited account balances as permitted by the Plan's provisions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan used \$16,864 of forfeited accounts to reduce employer matching contributions and \$71 of forfeited accounts to pay plan expenses.

Payment of Benefits

Generally, the participant becomes eligible to receive benefits on their normal retirement age (65), death, disability, termination of service, or other reasons of proven financial hardship. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account. Benefits are payable in lump-sum payments in an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account. If a participant's account balance is equal to or less than \$5,000, the account will be automatically distributed. Participants are also eligible to take in-service withdrawals once they attain age 59 ½.

Hardship Withdrawals

Upon approval by the plan administrator, a participant may withdraw all or part of their vested accounts for immediate and severe financial need. In accordance with IRS regulations, the participant must exhaust all other assets available prior to obtaining the hardship withdrawal.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of 50% of their vested account balance. The maximum aggregate dollar amount of notes receivable from any participant may not exceed \$50,000 reduced by the excess of the participant's highest outstanding participant loan balance during the one-year period ending on the day before the date on which such loan is made, over the participant's outstanding balance of loans as of the date such loan is made. A participant can only have one loan outstanding at a time. The notes are secured by the balance in the participants' accounts and bear interest at a fixed rate equal to the prime rate plus one percent (8.50% at December 31, 2024) as of the date of the new loan. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Total notes receivable from participants were \$390,265 and \$551,098 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Plan Expenses

Certain plan expenses are paid by the plan sponsor as provided by the plan document. Expenses related to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participants' accounts.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Plan considers all invested cash balances to be cash equivalents.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued, but unpaid, interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are comprised of mutual funds, money market funds, and a fully benefit-responsive investment contract. The Plan's investments are reported at fair value except for its fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is valued at contract value (see Note 7). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 6 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Realized and unrealized appreciation and depreciation in the value of investments are allocated to the participant accounts based on participant holdings in each fund.

3. Federal Income Taxes

The Plan adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing Plan document. This document received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the document was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). As allowed by the IRS, the Plan is relying on the opinion letter issued on the plan document for its own qualification. The plan document has been amended for changes required by the IRS since receiving the opinion letter. The plan administrator believes the Plan is designed and currently operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that, as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in process.

4. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their accounts.

5. Investments

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity"), the trustee of the Plan, and was not subject to audit for the years ended December 31:

Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels:

Level 1 Inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority.

Level 2 Inputs are based on significant other observable inputs such as:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. The Plan uses Level 2 inputs when market prices are not attainable but other observable inputs are available to arrive at a fair value, and Level 3 inputs were only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available. There were no Level 2 or 3 investments in the Plan.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of money market funds and mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year end.

7. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contracts

The Plan invests in the Lincoln Stable Value Separate Account (the "SVSA"). The SVSA is issued by the Lincoln National Life Insurance Company ("Lincoln") and is a group fixed contract which guarantees a fixed rate of interest. The credited interest rate may be based on an index rate specified in the contract or a declared rate, either of which may be changed quarterly and will never be below the guaranteed rate. The crediting rate at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was 2.45% and 2.0%, respectively. Group fixed contracts are between the plan and the issuer and may not be assigned or sold to another party without consent of the issuer.

The SVSA invests in predominantly fixed income instruments which are collectively held for the benefit of contract owners and are insulated from insurance company obligations through a legal separate account structure.

Money may be withdrawn from the SVSA upon contract termination and is subject to a market value adjustment ("MVA") or according to a withdrawal schedule. Participant withdrawals can be taken without an MVA for hardship needs, death, retirement, or separation from service. Participant-initiated periodic elective withdrawals may be limited to a percentage of the fixed account assets or required to remain in a non-competing fund for a minimum of 90 days before the participant may transfer such funds to a competing fund. If funds from a non-competing fund are transferred to a competing fund, no further transfers from the Fund may occur for a period of 90 days.

The SVSA meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Lincoln, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all, or a portion of, their investment at contract value.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include termination of the contract or termination of the Plan.

8. Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are managed by Fidelity. Fidelity is the trustee as defined by the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to Fidelity and other parties-in-interest for the investment management and record keeping services were \$86,907 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan also holds notes receivable from participants. As a result, these notes receivable and all related transactions were with a party-in-interest. All of these transactions are exempt from being prohibited transactions by ERISA.

9. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities as directed by its participants. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

10. Subsequent Events

The Company has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through October 7, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

In December 2022, Congress passed the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act of 2022 ("SECURE Act 2.0") that continued the retirement system reform previously passed in 2020. Certain provisions of the SECURE Act 2.0 are effective starting at various dates through 2026, with the plan amendment for the adoption of SECURE Act 2.0 due by December 31, 2026.
