NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Lago Mar Properties, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established effective July 1, 2001 by Lago Mar Properties, Inc. (the Employer and Plan Sponsor).

The Plan is a defined contribution plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employer Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees, as defined by the Plan, who have completed 1,000 hours of service during a 12-consecutive month eligibility computation period. The Plan entry date is the first day of month after completing the service requirement. There is no age requirement.

Funding

Each year, participants may elect to contribute from 1% to 90% of their eligible pre-tax compensation, after tax contribution (Roth contribution), or any combination thereof, as defined in the Plan, up to a maximum of \$23,000 and \$22,500, for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who have attained age 50 during the Plan year may make an additional elective deferral contribution of \$7,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The percentage of contribution may be changed by the participant at any time. Any such change will apply only after its effective date, and after it is executed and filed with the Plan Sponsor.

The employer shall match this contribution at a rate of 50% of the employee's contribution limited to 6% of total compensation. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

Participants may also rollover amounts representing distributions from other qualified benefit or contribution plans. Employees are fully vested on rollover amounts contributed.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and Employer's contributions, Plan earnings (losses), and charged with management or service fees and allocation of any administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan. Additional administrative fees are charged by the custodian upon fund withdrawal. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (Continued)

Vesting

Participant contributions are 100% vested. Discretionary employer-provided contributions are 20% vested after two years of service, and 20% for each additional year of service. Automatic 100% vesting occurs upon attainment of normal retirement age (65), upon retirement due to disability, upon death, and upon termination of the Plan.

To have a year of service for vesting purposes, employees must complete at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan calendar year. An employee completes a year of service upon working for a full 12 months beginning on the date of hire.

Investment Options

Participants may direct contributions to any of the investment options offered by the Plan. The investment options include money market funds and various stock and bond funds. The fund values are computed daily by the custodian and reflect changes in the unit values of the investments. Fund allocations may be changed by the participant at any time.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Since inception, participant loans have not been permitted by the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Upon retirement or separation from service with the Employer, the participant may elect to receive a single lump-sum cash payment for the vested balance in their account. Also, upon reaching age 59½, participants may receive a lump-sum cash payment for any portion of their vested accounts on a yearly basis. Until a participant actually retires from the Employer, the participant shall continue to be treated in all respects as a participant.

Hardship distributions can only be made to the extent that there is a financial hardship, as defined in the Plan document and in accordance with IRS rules.

Forfeited Accounts

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$73 and \$71, respectively. These accounts can be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay for Plan expenses. For the year ended December 31, 2024 forfeited non-vested amounts used to fund employer matching contributions were approximately \$14,000.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting and Use of Estimates

The accompanying financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Concentration of Credit Risk

Financial instruments, which potentially expose the Plan to concentrations of credit risks, as defined by GAAP, consist primarily of investments. The Plan's investments are primarily in mutual funds and a common collective trust which, inherent in their fair market value determination, include the risk factor of credit worthiness for each individual security.

Administrative Expenses

Certain administrative expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan Sponsor and therefore are excluded from these financial statements. Account administrative fees are paid by the participants. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

NOTE 3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, Reliance Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and related investment activity in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the accompanying supplemental information reflected on Form 5500 – Schedule H, Line 4i- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

Allocations among the underlying investments are participant directed. The accounts are credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses.

NOTE 4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

GAAP provides a framework for measuring fair value, expands disclosures about fair value measurements, and establishes a fair value hierarchy which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value summarized as follows:

Level 1: Inputs using the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical, unrestricted assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used to measure fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The following is a description of the valuation methods used for assets measured at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE COMMON COLLECTIVE TRUST

The Plan has a traditional benefit-responsive common collective trust, which was reported at a contract value of \$459,695 and \$395,810 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The Metlife Reliance Stable Value Fund is a general account product offered through the group annuity contract with principal and interest being fully guaranteed by the entire general account assets of Reliance Trust Company. Interest is credited daily to the group contract holder on a portfolio basis.

NOTE 6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Reliance Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan. They provided certain administrative and investment services to the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Automatic Data Processing, Inc. (ADP) is the Plan's third-party administrator. They received fees for recordkeeping and other administrative functions directly from the Plan Sponsor, except for distribution fees which are paid by the participants. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

The party-in-interest transactions above are exempt from prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue their contributions at any time. In addition, although they have not expressed any intent to do so, the Trustees have the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 8. TAX STATUS

The master prototype plan from which the Plan was drafted has received a favorable determination from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) by a letter dated October 6, 2020. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Sponsor believes the Plan is designed, and currently is being operated, in compliance with the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and, therefore, management believes that the Plan is qualified and that the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan Sponsor has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by tax authorities; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. Management believes that the Plan is no longer subject to such audits for tax periods prior to 2021.

NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
