Independent Auditor's Report

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an

opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.

- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter - Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024 and the supplemental schedule of delinquent participant contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedules, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedules, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedules, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including their form and content, are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion—

- the form and content of the supplemental schedules, other than the information in the supplemental schedules that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are

presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- the information in the supplemental schedules related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Fuji Vegetable Oil, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of Fuji Oil International Inc. and Subsidiaries (the Company), who have three months of service and are age eighteen or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. Effective January 1, 2022, the Plan was amended to allow employees of Oilseeds International, Ltd. (Oilseeds), a newly acquired wholly owned subsidiary of the Company, to participate in the Plan. The employees of Oilseeds entered the Plan on May 1, 2022, when the Company's acquisition of Oilseeds was complete. Eligible compensation for participants employed by Oilseeds includes bonuses, unlike eligible compensation of other participants. Participants employed by Oilseeds are otherwise subject to the same Plan provisions and rules as other participants. No other significant changes to the Plan were made as a part of this amendment and the tax-exempt status of the Plan was not affected.

Contributions

Contributions to the Plan are made voluntarily by participating employees who elect a salary reduction which is remitted to the Plan by the Company on behalf of the participants. Participants may contribute up to 90% of their gross compensation, not to exceed \$23,000 and \$22,500 during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants age 50 or older may contribute up to an additional \$7,500 catch-up amount for each of the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan also provides for rollover contributions by participants from other qualifying plans. The Company made a safe harbor contribution of 3% and an additional 9.5% contribution of eligible employee wages to participant accounts in 2024 and 2023. Oilseeds made a discretionary contribution in arrears during 2024 and 2023 that accounted for 12% of participants' 2023 and 2022 eligible earnings, respectively. The Company may also elect to contribute amounts to be allocated based on participants' compensation.

Contributions receivable

Contributions receivable are based upon the timing difference between the determined contributions of the employer and employees and the receipts by the investment custodian. All contributions receivable are fully collectible without any necessary allowance for credit losses.

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN (continued)

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested immediately in accounts attributable to elective deferrals, safe harbor contributions, and rollover contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's additional contribution portion of participant accounts is based on years of service. One year of service is defined by the Plan as 1,000 hours of service. Participants hired after September 1, 2016, are 100% vested after five years of service as follows:

Participants hired before September 1, 2016, were 100% vested after three years of service.

Participants employed with Fuji Oil, New Orleans LLC, were 100% vested effective April 14, 2023, when the New Orleans plant assets were sold.

Upon attainment of normal retirement age, total permanent disability, or death, a participant or his/her beneficiary becomes 100% vested.

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the excess of their highest outstanding balance of loans from the Plan during the one-year period prior to the date of the loan over their current outstanding balance of loans, or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Interest rates are set the fourteenth day of each month at the Wall Street Journal prime rate plus 1%. Loan terms may generally not exceed five years. However, if a loan is for a participant's principal residence, longer repayment terms may be permitted. Principal and interest are paid ratably through weekly payroll deductions. A participant may have a maximum of one Plan loan outstanding at any given time. Interest rates on outstanding notes receivable from participants ranged from 4.25% to 9.50% at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are payable upon (a) termination of service, (b) normal retirement after attainment of age 65, (c) late retirement upon termination of service if the participant continues to work for the Company after his or her normal retirement date, or (d) death or permanent disability. A participant may elect to receive a lump sum equal to the value of his or her account or one of several annuity options. Additionally, the Plan allows for in-service hardship distributions subject to Plan provisions.

The portion of net assets which was processed for payment to persons who requested withdrawals but had not yet been paid by the Plan totaled \$0 at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Investment options

Investments are participant-directed among eighteen funds.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). Accordingly, contributions are recognized when determined rather than when received, and expenses are recognized when incurred rather than when paid.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Valuation of investments

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value based on published market quotations, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Purchases and sales are recognized on their transaction dates.

Administrative expenses

Certain administrative, recordkeeping and trustee fees, and participant-initiated transaction fees are paid by participants from their Plan accounts.

Subsequent events

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - DESCRIPTION OF INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE INVESTMENT TRUSTEE

As permitted by Section 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the plan administrator has elected to have the investment trustee of the Plan, American Trust Company, certify as to the accuracy and completeness of certain information included in the accompanying financial statements and schedules in lieu of the Plan's independent accountants examining such information. Accordingly, the following information was certified by the investment trustees and was not subjected to any auditing procedures except for comparing such information with the related information contained in the accompanying financial statements and schedules:

- A. Investments in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- B. Activity in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- C. Information included in the supplemental schedules, as listed in the accompanying table of contents.

NOTE 4 - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated March 31, 2008, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

NOTE 5 - FORFEITED NONVESTED ACCOUNT BALANCES

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeitures of withdrawing participants' account balances totaled \$94,290 and \$81,959 respectively. The Company may use forfeitures to pay any administrative fees of the Plan or to reduce amounts otherwise required to be contributed to the Plan. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$0 was used to reduce the amount the Company contributed to the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the balance of unused forfeitures totaled \$249,917 and \$150,539, respectively.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE 7 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The MetLife Stable Value Fund is a fully benefit-responsive investment and is reported at contract value in the statements of net assets available for benefits and is only converted to fair value if the contract with Metropolitan Life Insurance Company (MetLife) is terminated and market value is less than book value. Benefit responsiveness is defined as the extent to which a contract's terms and the Plan permit or require participant-initiated withdrawals at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

In a Met Managed GIC, the assets are invested in a MetLife separate account. MetLife guarantees principal and accrued interest, based on credited interest rates, for participant-initiated withdrawals as long as the contract remains active. Interest is credited to the contract at interest rates that reflect the performance of the underlying portfolio. The credited rate resets quarterly and has a minimum interest rate of 0%. MetLife resets the rate by amortizing the difference between the market value of the portfolio and the guaranteed value over the weighted average duration of the investments.

NOTE 7 - FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT (continued)

Participants receive the principal and accrued earnings credited to their accounts upon withdrawal for allowed events. These events include transfers to other investment options, and payments due to retirement, termination of employment, disability, death, and in-service withdrawals as permitted by the Plan.

The Plan may terminate its participation in the contract at any time. If it chooses to do so, the Plan will receive the lesser of the guaranteed or market value.

NOTE 8 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy follow:

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used should maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual funds are valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Brokerage accounts are self-directed brokerage assets which consist of common stocks and mutual funds that are valued at the last reported sales price on the last business day of the year, and uninvested cash that is recorded at carrying value since maturities are less than three months. These assets are deemed to be a Level 1 investment.

NOTE 8 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (continued)

Collective investment trusts are valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value and is based on dividing the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund, less its liabilities, by the total number of units outstanding at the time of such computation. The practical expedient is not used when probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

NOTE 9 - EXEMPT PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

The trustee is authorized under contract provisions, and by ERISA regulations providing an administrative or statutory exemption, to invest in funds under its control. Certain Plan investments, including shares of mutual funds and units of collective investment trusts, are managed by Unified Trust Company, a subsidiary of American Trust Company. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund.

NOTE 10 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan provides for investments in various securities that are exposed to risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near future and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in future statements of net assets available for benefits.
