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Independent Auditors' Report

To the Board of Directors

Community Health Centers of the Rutland Region 403(b) Retirement Plan:

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Community Health Centers of the Rutland Region 403(b) Retirement Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Community Health Centers of the Rutland Region 403(b) Retirement Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Community Health Centers of the Rutland Region 403(b) Retirement Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Community Health Centers of the Rutland Region 403(b) Retirement Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Notes to Financial Statements

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the Year Ended December 31, 2024

1. Description of Plan:

The following brief description of the Community Health Centers of the Rutland Region 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Community Health Centers of the Rutland Region (the Organization) over the age of 21 with no minimum employment period to be eligible. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act (ERISA).

Contributions – Participants are allowed to elect to defer from one percent (1%) up to one hundred percent (100%) of pre-tax annual compensation, subject to annual dollar limitations established by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS). Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans, and participants that are 50 years old or older could make additional “catch-up” contributions. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers several mutual funds and a money market fund as investment options for participants. The Organization will match 25% of the participant’s contributions up to six percent (6%).

Participant Accounts – Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s voluntary contribution, the Organization’s matching contribution, investment income and an allocation of the Organization’s discretionary contribution. Allocations are based on participant account balances.

Vesting – Voluntary participant contributions, and related investment income, are fully vested at all times. Participants own an increasing share of employer matching and discretionary contributions based on the number of years of service with the Organization. Participants are 100% vested in the employer matching and discretionary contributions portion of their accounts after one year of service. Participants become 100% vested in the case of early retirement, death, or disability.

Payment of Benefits – A participant may not make withdrawals from his Participant’s Elective Account except for:

- (1) Normal retirement - age 65;
- (2) Total and permanent disability;
- (3) Death;
- (4) Termination of employment;
- (5) Attainment of age 59½; or
- (6) Financial hardship

Distributions are paid as soon as possible following termination date, except for financial hardship withdrawals which are payable immediately. Distributions are paid to participants in a lump sum or annual payments.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of \$50,000 (not to exceed 50% of the participant’s vested account balance). Loan transactions are treated as a transfer to (from) the investment fund from (to) the loan fund. Loan terms range from 3 to 5 years and up to a reasonable period commensurate with the repayment period permitted by commercial lenders for similar loans by commercial lenders for the purchase of a primary residence. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant’s account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Interest rates range from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably. Participants also have the option to repay the loan at any time during the term in a lump-sum payment.

1. Description of Plan (continued):

Forfeited Accounts – Amounts forfeited due to terminations are used to first pay administrative expenses and then to reduce the Organization’s matching contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeitures used to offset employer contributions and pay plan expenses were \$0. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$4,053 and \$2,434, respectively.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting – The Plan’s policy is to prepare its financial statements on the accrual basis of accounting; revenues are recognized when earned and expenses are recorded when the obligation is incurred.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Contributions – Contributions from Plan participants and the Organization’s matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan’s investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 7 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participants account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net depreciation of fair value of investments.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Subsequent Events – The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Plan Termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested and would be entitled to the full value of their account.

4. Information Prepared and Certified by Custodian:

The Plan administrator had elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Capital Bank and Trust Company serves as the Plan's custodian. They have provided the Plan administrator with certifications as to the completeness and accuracy of cash, investment balances, investment transactions, supplemental schedule, interest, and dividend income, realized gains (losses) on the sale of investments and unrealized appreciation (depreciation) of investments in accordance with the Department of Labor Regulations.

5. Tax Status:

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (Code). The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the sample language provided by the IRS in Revenue Procedure 2007-71. The Plan administrator intends to apply for a determination letter on the Plan should the IRS open such a program. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status for Plan participants under Section 403(b).

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

6. Risks and Uncertainties:

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participant's accounts and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

7. Fair Value Measurements:

The Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB), Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurement) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements).

7. Fair Value Measurements (continued):

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC Topic 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;

Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;

Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;

Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money market fund: Valued at the closing price reported by the fund sponsor from an actively traded exchange.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of the different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

8. Related Party and Parties-in-Interest Transactions:

The Organization provides to the Plan certain accounting and administrative services for which no fees are charged. The employees that provide these services are also contributing participants in the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Notes receivable from participants are also considered party-in-interest transactions. However, under the provisions of ERISA, these transactions meet the criteria for exemption, are not considered prohibited transactions and do not need to be reported in the supplementary schedules of Form 5500.

Plan investments are managed by Capital Bank and Trust Company. Capital Bank and Trust Company is the custodian for the Plan and, therefore, transactions with Capital Bank and Trust Company qualify as party-in-interest transactions.
