Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Otter Tail Corporation Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Otter Tail Corporation Retirement Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter – Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule H, line 4i-schedule of assets held at end of year as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following brief description of the Otter Tail Corporation Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Otter Tail Corporation, or any affiliated entity (the Company). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Benefits Administration Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, and monitors investment performance.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan and receive a discretionary match if they are 18 years of age. To qualify for the employer profit sharing, the employee must be a participant during the Plan year and be employed on the last day of the Plan year. To qualify for enhanced employer contributions, the employee must be a participant during the Plan year. Employees of Otter Tail Corporation must also be employed on the last day of the Plan year. Effective January 1, 2024, employees of Otter Tail Corporation are not required to be employed on the last day of the Plan year to be eligible for an enhanced employer contribution.

Entry Date

Employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month coinciding with or following the date they satisfy the Plan's eligibility requirements.

Contributions

Eligible plan participants may elect to contribute up to 50 percent of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year, are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The employers may make a discretionary match, which varies by company, based on the participant's annual contributions. The Plan includes profit sharing and enhanced employer contribution provisions under which the Company may contribute additional funds, which will be allocated as a percentage of each individual's compensation. Employees do not have to participate in the savings portion of the Plan to receive profit sharing contributions. A participant will share in the employer discretionary contributions regardless of their employment on the last day of the Plan year, in the year of their death, disability, or retirement. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made a \$2,772,676 discretionary contribution to the Plan.

The Plan sponsor will automatically withhold three percent of the employee’s compensation upon becoming eligible to participate unless otherwise elected by the participant. Automatically enrolled participants to the Plan that have been participating for at least nine months as of any December 31 and that have not made an affirmative election will have the deferral rate automatically increased by one percent each year until the contribution equals 10 percent.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant’s contribution and the Company's matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company’s discretionary contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Investment Options

Upon enrollment to the Plan, a participant may direct deferrals and employer contributions in any of the funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the employer profit sharing contribution portion of their accounts will be 100 percent if the participant is credited with at least one hour of service on or after January 1, 2008. Vesting for employer match and enhanced employer contributions is based on years of credited service as set forth in the following table:

0-1	0%
1-2	20%

5+	100%

Active participants as of December 30, 2002, are 100 percent vested in their entire account balance. In addition, participants who are employed by Otter Tail Corporation and are members of a collective bargaining unit are 100 percent vested in their account.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$16,805 and \$169,907, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or pay Plan administrative expenses. During the year ended December 31, 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$643,005 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts, a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The interest rate is set at 1% above the prime rate. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions over a period not to exceed five years, unless the proceeds of the notes were used to acquire the participant's residence, in which case the maximum notes term will be 15 years. A participant may have no more than 2 outstanding notes at any one time.

Payment of Benefits

Participants may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their vested interest as defined in the Plan document upon retirement, termination, death, or disability. A terminated employee with a balance of less than \$1,000 may be automatically paid out by the Plan upon termination. Any terminated participants with a balance between \$1,000 and \$5,000 can still be automatically paid out if their balance is rolled into a qualified Individual Retirement Account. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination upon attainment of age 59 ½ or hardship as defined in the Plan Document.

Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 2 - Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and insurance companies. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as those held during the year.

The classification of investment earnings reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits may differ from the classification of earnings on Form 5500 due to different reporting requirements on Form 5500.

Contributions

Participant contributions and the related Company matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under the FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Fund – Valued at fair value based on the NAV of units held of the collective fund. The NAV is based on the observable market prices of the underlying investments within the fund less liabilities. The NAV for the underlying assets of the fund is a readily determinable measure of their fair value and is the basis used by the fund for current transactions.

Common Stock – Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Note 4 - Certified Information

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (Principal) (the trustee of the Plan).

Note 5 - Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by letter dated December 6, 2017, that the Plan and related trust were designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the IRC. Subsequent to the issuance of this determination letter, the Plan was amended. However, the Company and plan management and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believe the Plan is qualified and the related trust continues to be tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 6 - Related Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

Note 7 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or global conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 8 - Plan Amendments

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to remove the requirements to be employed on the last day of the Plan year and have at least 1,000 hours of service to be eligible for an enhanced employer contribution for employees of Otter Tail Corporation. The Plan was also amended to add partial and installment payments as distribution options for all participants.

Effective January 1, 2024, the Plan was amended to adopt provisions of Secure 2.0.

Note 9 - Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500

Invesco Stable Value Trust is reported at fair value on Form 5500 and is reported at contract value within the financial statements. The fund is an indirect fully benefit responsive contract which the contract value approximates fair value within the financial statements. The Schedule of Assets Held at Year End as of December 31, 2024 reflects the amount that is reported on Form 5500.
