NOTE 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Port City Logistics, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan was established on January 1, 2015, and was most recently amended on March 2, 2023. The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees (excluding: union employees, certain nonresident aliens, residents of Puerto Rico, part-time, temporary or seasonal employees with less than 1,000 hours of service, and reclassified employees) of Port City Logistics, Inc. (the Company) who have completed 90 days of service, and are 21 years of age or older. Participants may elect to defer salary on the earlier of the first day of the plan year or the first day of the coinciding quarter of the plan year after completion of 90 days of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower) or its affiliates serves as the trustee, recordkeeper and custodian of Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a percentage of pretax or post-tax annual compensation, not to exceed statutory limitations as set by law, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers mutual funds, collective trust funds and a guaranteed investment contract with an insurance company as investment options for participants. The Company may make discretionary profit sharing nonelective contributions to the Plan. No discretionary profit sharing nonelective contributions were made during the plan year ending December 31, 2024. These contributions are subject to certain limitations. For the Plan year ending December 31, 2024, the Plan made a safe harbor matching contribution of \$380,249. This contribution was calculated on a per payroll basis subject to 100% match of the first 3% of employee deferral and 50% match of the next 2% of employee deferral. Employees become eligible for the safe harbor contribution matching upon becoming eligible to participate in the Plan. To be eligible for the discretionary profit sharing nonelective contributions, employees must be employed on the last day of the Plan year and be credited with 12 months of service with at least 1,000 hours during the Plan year.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the employer's contribution, an allocation of the Plan's investment earnings, an allocation of forfeitures of terminated participants' nonvested amounts, and is charged with an allocation of the Plan's investment and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their contributions and safe harbor matching contributions. Vesting in the Company's discretionary profit sharing nonelective contributions is based on years of service in accordance with the following schedule:

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum amount. Participant accounts will be distributed to the participant as soon as is administratively feasible following the event that entitles the participant to a distribution.

NOTE 2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures may be used to reduce employer contributions or pay administrative expenses for the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were forfeitures of \$5,057 and \$0, respectively. These amounts will be used in the future to pay plan expense or reduce employer contributions

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. (See Note 5 for discussion of fair value measurements.)

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Costs

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by the Plan and reduce net assets available for benefits unless the Company elects to pay such expenses.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events have been evaluated for potential recognition and/or disclosure through October 13, 2025. This represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3. CERTIFICATION OF ASSETS AND INCOME

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the United States Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, as permitted under such election, the Plan Administrator instructed the Plan's independent auditors not to perform any auditing procedures with respect to the following information certified by Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, (collectively referred to as "Empower"), the custodians of the Plan's assets, as complete and accurate to the best of their knowledge, except for comparing such information certified by the custodian to information included in the Plan's financial statements and supplementary schedule.

NOTE 4. CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

The Plan holds a fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Empower. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. Because the contract is benefit responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the respective contract. Contract value represents contributions made, less withdrawals and administrative expenses, plus interest credited. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. The crediting rate is reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting. The crediting rate was 1.41% and 1.23% for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. The contract value was \$44,633 and \$37,445 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Certain events limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value. Such events include the following: amendments to the Plan documents, changes to Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such value event, which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with Plan participants, is probable.

NOTE 5. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, established a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered investment companies. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust funds: Funds that are valued at the NAV of units of the collective trust as provided to the plan administrator by the trustee of the collective trust. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. If the Plan initiates a full redemption of the collective trust, the issuer reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawals from the trust in order to ensure that securities' liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business matter.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period.

NOTE 6. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are managed by Empower. Empower is the custodian of the Plan's assets and therefore, investments or transactions with Empower qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Administrative expenses paid directly from Plan assets to Empower totaled \$49,442 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Empower also received indirect compensation for the year ended December 31, 2024. These transactions qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 7. PLAN TERMINATION

The Company anticipates and believes that the Plan will continue without interruption but has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become fully vested in their account balances and the Plan assets would be distributed to participants on the basis of their prorated values at the termination date.

NOTE 8. TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a Non-Standardized Pre-approved Profit Sharing Plan with a cash or deferral arrangement, which received a favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on November 14, 2022, which stated that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

FASB ASC requires the Plan Administrator to annually evaluate the Plan's tax positions, including accounting and measurement of uncertain tax positions. For the year ending December 31, 2024, the Plan Administrator concluded that no uncertain tax positions had been taken that would require adjustment to or disclosure in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by federal, state, or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

NOTE 9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
