Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Valiant Integrated Services 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). 1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Valiant Integrated Services 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan, which was established by ABM Government Services, LLC (the Former Plan Sponsor) effective April 1, 1996.

Effective May 31, 2017, Valiant Integrated Services, LLC (the Plan Sponsor) (the Company) acquired 100% of the ownership interest in ABM Government Services, LLC. All employees in the ABM Governmental Services 401(k) Plan were not included in the acquisition by the Plan Sponsor. As a result, such employees were transferred out of the Plan into an unrelated ABM 401(k) Employee Savings Plan in July 2017.

The Plan was most recently amended and restated effective May 20, 2025 to change the name of the Plan Sponsor from Valiant Integrated Services, LLC to Valiant Integrated Defense Services LLC and to change the name of the Plan from the Valiant Integrated Services 401(k) Plan to the Valiant Integrated Defense Services 401(k) Plan.

Eligibility

All employees of the Company are covered by the Plan, with the exception of union employees (unless participation is stipulated by an individual collective bargaining agreement), non-resident aliens with no U.S. source income, leased employees or independent contractors. For purposes of contributions other than participant contributions, part-time, temporary or seasonal employees who are regularly scheduled to work less than 1,000 hours of service are also excluded from the Plan. Other than those who are excluded from the Plan, employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of the month following their date of hire. McNamara O'Hare Service Contract Act (SCA) or prevailing wage employees are allowed to receive contributions immediately upon hire.

Participant Contributions

Participants may contribute up to the lesser of 90% of the participant's eligible compensation or the maximum allowable contribution under the Internal Revenue Code (the Code), which totaled \$23,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan allows Roth elective contributions. A participant's Roth elective contributions are allocated to a separate account maintained for such contributions.

Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year may make additional catch-up contributions, subject to limitations imposed by the Code, which totaled \$7,500 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Participants are permitted to make rollover contributions to the Plan.

Company Contributions

The Company contributes to the Plan on behalf of eligible employees. The Company will make a contribution for each employee's SCA or prevailing wage service based on the hourly contribution rate for the employee's employment classification, net of the amount utilized for health care benefit payments.

The Company may also make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan. Discretionary matching contributions will be made based upon the following groups/divisions of employees:

The discretionary matching contributions are calculated on a per payroll basis and invested in the same manner as those directed by the participant. Participant catch-up contributions are not eligible for a discretionary match. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company made discretionary matching contributions to all employees except for collective bargaining employees unless their collective bargaining agreement specified that the participating employees would receive the match. The discretionary matching contribution was equal to 100% of the first 3% of participants' elective deferrals and 50% of the amount of the participants' elective deferrals of compensation that exceeded 3% but did not exceed 5% of the participants' deferrals of compensation.

The Company may also make discretionary profit sharing contributions to employees. A discretionary profit sharing contribution may be made to eligible employees at a ratio of the participant's eligible compensation to the total compensation of all eligible participants. There were no profit sharing contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is participant-directed and is credited with the participant's contributions and Company contributions in accordance with the investment options selected by each participant. Plan earnings, losses, and administrative expenses are allocated to each participant's account based upon the balance in each account. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN – cont'd.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow up to 50% of their vested account balance, not to exceed \$50,000, without regard to the intended use of the funds. The minimum note amount is \$1,000 and only one note may be outstanding at any given time. The notes are collateralized by the participant's vested account balance.

Note repayments are to be made on a direct salary deduction or on a direct payment basis with such payments being made at least quarterly with interest at a fixed rate based on the prevailing rate for similar loans at the time of loan issuance. Notes must be repaid within five years.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in participant and Company contributions plus earnings thereon.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or normal retirement (age 65), or age 59 ½, a participant or their beneficiary, in the event of death, is entitled to a distribution of his or her vested account balance. Distributions from the Plan are payable in the form of a lump sum payment prior to retirement. Upon termination, if a participant's account balance is less than \$7,000, the Plan administrator may elect to automatically distribute the participant's account balance. Participants may withdraw deferral or rollover account balances from the Plan at any time. Upon proof, to the satisfaction of the Plan administrator, of an immediate and heavy financial need, amounts may be withdrawn for a hardship purpose. Hardship withdrawals may be taken from all allowable account balances.

Certain benefit payments are protected for Plan participants who were former participants in certain predecessor plans in accordance with the Plan Document.

Certain income tax penalties may apply to withdrawals or distributions prior to age 59 ½. Distributions are subject to the applicable provisions of the Plan agreement. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no net assets of the Plan allocated to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan that had not received such distributions.

Plan Expenses

Expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are required to be paid by the Custodian and Trustee with assets of the Plan unless the Company, at its discretion, elects to pay them. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid direct expenses of \$276,562.

Loan and distribution fees are paid by the Plan and its participants. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment contracts held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of changes in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investments in assets that are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities may occur in the near term that materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments, with the exception of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts (Note 5), are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Fair Value Measurement

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification 820, *Fair Value Measurement* (ASC 820), defines fair value and establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements).

Fair Value Measurement – cont'd.

The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The assets' or liabilities' fair value measurement levels within the fair value hierarchy are based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Interests in registered investment companies: Valued at the closing price of shares held by the Plan at year end. Funds are traded in an active market.

Interest in common/collective trust: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) of units held by the Plan at year end practical expedient.

Interest in separate account: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year end practical expedient.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent loans are reclassified as distributions in accordance with the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated for disclosure any subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined that there were no material subsequent events that required disclosure except as noted in Note 1 and Note 10.

3. INVESTMENTS

All investment data contained in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedules, including assets held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and interest and dividend income and net appreciation in fair value of investments for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from the information supplied to the Plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company (Principal), the Custodian and Trustee of the Plan.

4. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by affiliates of Principal as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan loans funds to its participants according to the applicable provisions of the Plan agreement. The Company provides the Plan with certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged. All such transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT

The Plan invests in the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option, which is a traditional investment contract. As of December 31, 2023, the Principal Fixed Income Guaranteed Option balance totaled \$60,547,220. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan terminated their contract with Principal Life Insurance Company and transferred the value of the investments to common/collective trust investments. The plan complied with the terms of their contract with Principal Life Insurance Company and, accordingly, this transaction occurred at the contract value guaranteed by the contract rather than fair value.

5. FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACT – cont'd.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and, therefore, is reported at contract value, which approximates fair value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

With traditional investment contracts, the Plan owns only the contract itself. Traditional investment contracts are designed to accrue interest based on crediting rates established by the contract issuers.

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a group annuity contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer, but could not be less than zero. The crediting rate was reviewed on a periodic basis for resetting. The contract could not be terminated by the issuer before the scheduled maturity date.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with the fully benefit-responsive investment contract was dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations.

Certain events could limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Internal Revenue Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code
2. Premature termination of the contracts
3. Plan termination or merger
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options
5. Bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract
3. A material misrepresentation
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

As described above, the Plan terminated the contract during the year ended December 31, 2024. The Plan was able to transact at contract value with the issuer and redeem the investment balance at contract value.

6. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan document, which received a favorable opinion from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code and therefore, the related trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Plan has been amended since receiving the favorable opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The Plan administrator does not believe that the operational failures, as described in Note 8, would cause the Plan to lose its qualified tax status. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

ASC 740, *Income Taxes*, prescribes a recognition threshold and a measurement attribute for the financial statement recognition and measurement of tax positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return as well as guidance on de-recognition, classification, interest and penalties and financial statement reporting disclosures. For these benefits to be recognized, a tax position must be more-likely-than-not to be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. Given the Plan is tax exempt and has no unrelated business income, the provisions of ASC 740 do not have an impact on the Plan's financial statements. The Plan recognizes interest and penalties accrued on any unrecognized tax exposures as a component of income tax expense. The Plan does not have any amounts accrued relating to interest and penalties as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by the Internal Revenue Service and Department of Labor; however, there are currently no audits for any periods in progress.

7. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed the intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue, modify, amend or terminate the Plan in total, or in part, subject to the provisions of ERISA.

8. OPERATIONAL FAILURES

In the course of the audits of the Plan for the 2018-2020 Plan years, the Company became aware of certain operational failures that occurred during those years. The Company made changes to their operational processes during 2021 and 2020 to address the operational failures. Additionally, the Company intends to correct the operational failures noted in those years through the IRS Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System described most recently in Revenue Procedure 2021-30. Specifically, the Company, as advised by legal counsel, filed an application for a compliance statement under the IRS Voluntary Compliance Program. As of the date of the financial statements, the corrections were pending IRS approval. The Company does not expect that the correction of such operational failures will result in any material adjustments to the Plan's financial statements.

9. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

During the years ended December 31, 2018 through December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor determined that certain participant deferrals and loan payments were remitted to the Plan outside the required timeframe by the Department of Labor (DOL). The DOL considers late deposits to be prohibited transactions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company had delinquent participant deferrals and loan repayments totaling \$44,909. Those contributions that have been contributed to the Plan as of December 31, 2024 have been reported in the supplemental schedule either as corrected if lost earnings have been submitted or as uncorrected if lost earnings still need to be calculated and submitted. The Plan Sponsor has corrected delinquent participant contributions related to the years ended December 31, 2018 through December 31, 2021. The Plan Sponsor intends to correct all delinquent contributions during the year ended December 31, 2025.

10. EXCESS CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan failed to comply with certain non-discrimination rules. As a result, the Plan is required to refund certain excess contributions to affected participants. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, corrective distributions totaling \$4,833 and \$93,861, respectively, are required to be made and are included in excess contributions payable in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The corrective contributions as of December 31, 2023 were made in 2024. The corrective contributions as of December 31, 2024 were made in March 2025.
