## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Plan Trustees of  
Tampa Bay Banking Company 401(k) Plan

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Tampa Bay Banking Company 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Tampa Bay Banking Company 401(k) Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note E to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.



- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Tampa Bay Banking Company 401(k) Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Tampa Bay Banking Company 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.



NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Tampa Bay Banking Company (the "Company") 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of its provisions.

1. General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Company who have three months of service and are age twenty-one or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

2. Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation and any additional catch-up contributions (subject to Internal Revenue Code limitations), as defined in the Plan. The Plan has an automatic deferral feature. The employer will automatically withhold 3% of the employee's compensation. In addition, deferral amounts will automatically increase 1% each Plan Year until the amount withheld equals 6% of the employee's compensation. Participants may specifically elect an alternative deferral amount (including zero). The total may not exceed the maximum allowed by the Internal Revenue Service limits. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified benefit or defined contributions plans (participant rollovers). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds and a guaranteed interest fund as investment options for participants.

The Company's matching of participant contributions is discretionary and determined on a year by year basis. The Company matched participant contributions at a rate of 100% of participant elective deferral contributions not to exceed the lesser of 3% of a participant's compensation or \$5,200 during the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company has a right to make an additional discretionary contribution. No such additional amounts of discretionary contributions were made for the year ended December 31, 2024.

3. Participant Accounts

The participant accounts are participant directed investment options. The participants are allowed to change the percentage contributed to the Plan through payroll deductions at any time. Participants can also move individual accounts from one mutual fund to another or change how the funds are allocated among investments. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN - Continued

Each participant in the Plan has a separate account that is credited with the participant's contribution, the Company's matching and discretionary contributions and allocation of Plan earnings or losses are charged with allocation of administrative expenses and any distributions taken. Allocations are based on participant account balances, as defined.

4. Vesting and Forfeited Accounts

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions; the Company's matching contributions, and the Company's discretionary contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Accordingly, the Plan has no forfeited accounts.

5. Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. As of December 31, 2024, the interest rate charged on new loans was 9.5%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

6. Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or other reasons, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account.

7. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would continue to be 100 percent vested in their employer contributions.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A summary of the Plan's significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements follows:

1. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting except for benefit payments, which are reported on the cash basis.

NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - Continued

2. Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

3. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Mutual funds are valued at the quoted market price of the issuer. The insurance company general account is valued at an amount determined by the issuer as payable on demand on the reporting date. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

4. Concentration of Credit Risk

Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

5. Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

6. Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

7. Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits.

NOTE C - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of the net realizable value or reflective of future values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

*Insurance company general account:* Valued at fair value which is the amount determined by the issuer as payable on demand on the reporting date.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The fair values of funds are measured at the number of units held by the Plan and valued daily by the issuer. The following tables set forth, by level within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's investments at fair value as of December 31,:

NOTE D - INVESTMENT CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan held a group annuity contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The group annuity contract, Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund, is a fixed account that is part of the general account of Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America. The methodology for calculating the interest credit rate is based on the earnings of the underlying assets in the entire medium long-term new portfolio compared to the minimum interest crediting rate (which will never be less than 0% as stated in the contract), and prevailing market conditions. Interest crediting rate is reset quarterly. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund's fair value equaled its contract value of \$1,713,418 and \$1,035,495, respectively.

The average yield earned by the Plan is derived by averaging the quarterly gross interest rates for the fund over the year. That average for 2024 and 2023 is 1.41% and 1.23%, respectively.

The actual average yield earned by the Plan is derived by averaging the Plan's quarterly interest rates. That average for 2024 and 2023 is 1.41% and 1.23%, respectively.

NOTE E - FINANCIAL DATA CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEES (unaudited)

The investments of the Plan were held and administered by Empower Trust Company, LLC and Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America as of and during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, collectively the "Trustees". The Plan Trustees have supplied the Plan administrator with certain information utilized in preparing the financial statements and supplemental schedule for their respective years. The Plan administrator has obtained certifications from the Trustees certifying that the information provided by the Trustees is complete and accurate for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, for their respective years.

In accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA, the Plan administrator has elected not to have this information audited by the Plan's independent certified public accountants.

NOTE F - PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are funds held in insurance company general accounts managed by Empower Annuity Insurance company of America who also served as a Plan Trustee. Any transaction between the Trustee (as defined by the Plan), and the Plan qualify as a party-in-interest transaction. Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Additionally, certain administrative expenses incurred by third parties are directly paid for by the Company.

NOTE G - TAX STATUS

The Plan obtained its latest determination letter on July 8, 2010, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan was last amended in February 2022 with an effective date of February 15, 2022. The Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by any taxing jurisdiction. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for the years prior to 2021.
