Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Note 1 - Description of Plan

The following description of The Villages Charter School, Inc. (the School) Employees Savings Plan (the Plan) provides general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan commonly known as a Code Section 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan covering all eligible employees of the School, as defined, who have attained age 21. There is no minimum service requirement to participate under the Plan. Therefore, employees will be eligible to participate in the Plan as the attainment of the minimum age of 21 and service requirements are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was established October 1, 2000, and was most recently restated January 1, 2022.

On July 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to allow The Villages Early Childhood Center, Inc. as a participating employer under the Plan. Prior service with The Villages Early Learning Company, LLC for those employees that were employed on June 30, 2023, will be counted for the purposes of eligibility, vesting, and allocation conditions. Additionally, as of the same date, the Plan was amended to permit participation from all employees, including part-time staff, provided they meet the age eligibility requirements.

Beginning in August 2024, the employees of The Villages Charter School Autism Center, LLC began participating in the Plan.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute pre-tax deferrals up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan document. Effective June 1, 2023, participants may also contribute after-tax Roth deferrals. Participants whose 50th birthday is on or before the last day of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined-benefit or contribution plans. The School will contribute to the Plan a matching contribution of 100% of the first 5% of the participant's compensation. Additionally, the School may make profit-sharing contributions, at its discretion, subject to certain employment and service conditions, as defined in the Plan document. The profit-sharing contribution will be allocated using the same ratio as each participant's compensation bears to the total of such compensation of all eligible participants. Contributions are subject to certain limitations established annually by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS).

The Plan is set up with an "automatic" deferral feature. If no Salary Reduction Agreement is completed, the School will automatically withhold 5% of the participant's Plan compensation from each paycheck and deposit such amounts into the Plan as a salary deferral.

Qualified Non-Elective Contribution (QNEC)

The Plan recorded QNECs totaling \$35,724 during the year ended December 31, 2024, for certain participants who were not provided the opportunity to contribute their elected deferral amounts due to certain administrative errors. Participants are immediately 100% vested in the QNECs. The contributions were made in accordance with IRS procedures and do not affect the tax-qualified status of the Plan. The QNECs were funded subsequent to December 31, 2024, and are included in employer contributions receivable in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the School's matching contributions, and allocations of the School's discretionary contributions and Plan earnings, and charged with benefit payments and an allocation of the Plan's losses and expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. The participant directs the allocation of the assets, both employee and employer, to the various funds available through the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the School's matching and discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest 20% per year of service; therefore, a participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service. To earn a year of service, a participant must be credited at least 1,000 hours of service during a Plan year. Employees who terminate employment on account of death or permanent disability, or after attaining normal retirement age, are 100% vested.

Investment Funds

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and employer contributions into various investment funds offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment elections periodically, as permitted by the Plan sponsor.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to or equal to the lesser of \$50,000, or 50% of their vested account balance, and may only have one loan outstanding at any time. Prior to June 1, 2023, loan terms ranged from one to five years or up to ten years for the purchase of a primary residence. After June 1, 2023, loan terms may not exceed five years. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus 1% for all loans currently outstanding. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service, a participant is entitled to a distribution from the Plan. Depending on the balance of the vested account, the participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the vested value of his or her account, or in equal annual installments over a set number of years.

A participant who has attained age 59 ½ may receive an in-service distribution from any accounts in which the participant is 100% vested. Hardship withdrawals may be requested from employee deferrals and are paid in one lump sum upon approval.

Absorption of Costs by the School

The School absorbs the Plan's audit costs and does not charge the Plan for administrative functions performed by employees of the School on behalf of the Plan.

Forfeitures

Forfeited balances of participants' non-vested accounts can be used to reduce future School contributions and to reduce administrative expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,923 and \$1,427, respectively. Also, in 2024, \$149,906 in forfeitures were used to reduce School contributions.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The assets are maintained by the Trustee and are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest, with no allowance for credit losses, as repayments of principal and interest are received primarily through payroll deductions and the notes are collateralized by the participants' account balances.

If a participant defaults on a notes receivable repayment, the participant will be taxed on the entirety of the note amount (plus accrued interest) through the date of the default. If a participant is terminated, the participant may repay the entire outstanding balance of the note (including accrued interest) within a reasonable time period. If the entirety of the balance is not repaid, the participant's vested account balance is reduced by the remaining outstanding balance of the note.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Plan Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid either by the Plan or the School, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the School are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan, that are paid by the Plan, are recorded

as administrative expenses in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Transaction fees for distributions and loans are charged directly to the accounts of the participants who incur those fees. Certain investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. Any costs associated with the investment of a participant's account are charged to that participant.

Revenue Sharing

The Plan participates in a revenue sharing agreement with Principal Trust Company, a party-in-interest of the Plan. Under the terms of the agreement, the Plan earns revenue credits based on the Plan's investment holdings. The Plan administrator may direct Principal Trust Company to use amounts held in the revenue credit account to pay vendors for fees and expenses associated with services provided to the Plan. For the 2024 Plan year, Principal Trust Company contributed \$39,486 in revenue sharing credits, all of which was used as participant fee levelization for the year ended December 31, 2024. Revenue credits are presented net with Plan administrative expenses in the accompanying financial statements.

Note 3 - Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- **Level 1**—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.
- **Level 2**—Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- **Level 3**—Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds—Value is determined by quoted market prices, which represent the net asset value (NAV) of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and disclosed as a Level 1 investment.

Collective Investment Trust—The Plan invests in the Galliard Stable Return Fund PN, which is a collective investment fund established, operated, and maintained by the SEI Trust Company. All of the assets of the Galliard Stable Return Fund PN are invested in the Galliard Stable Return Fund Core. Fund Core invests in fully benefit-responsive investment contracts and security-backed contracts.

The fund is valued at the NAV of units of the bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the issuer of the fund, is based on the fair values of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities and is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient would not be used if it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different from the reported NAV. The fund files a U.S. Department of Labor Form 5500, Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan, as a direct filing entity. Accordingly, certain disclosure requirements under Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Update 2015-12 with respect to investment strategies for investments measured using the NAV practical expedient are not required in this report.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Note 5 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the School has the right under the Plan to permanently discontinue its contributions at any time, and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan termination, all participants become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 6 - Party-in-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Delaware Charter Guarantee and Trust Company d/b/a Principal Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan to the Trustee for recordkeeping, loan fees, and other services totaled \$31,544 for the year ended December 31, 2024. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Note 7 - Income Tax Status

The Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing Plan, which received a favorable opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020. The opinion letter stated that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require the Plan's management to evaluate uncertain tax positions taken by the Plan. The financial statement effects of a tax position are recognized when the position is more-likely-than-not, based on the technical merits, to be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan has recognized no interest or penalties related to uncertain tax positions. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment funds. Investments in general are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall volatility risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment will occur in the near-term, and that such changes could materially affect the participant account balances and amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
