## INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

### ***Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit***

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of P.A. Landers, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

- the information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### ***Basis for Opinion***

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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**A. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN:**

The following description of P.A. Landers, Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

1. General - The Plan is a prevailing wage and defined contribution plan established on December 1, 1987 for the benefit of P.A. Landers, Inc. and affiliated entities (the Company). It is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended. The Company is responsible for the oversight of the Plan.
2. Eligibility - The prevailing wage component of the Plan covers all employees meeting the applicable federal, state or municipal laws. The defined contribution component of the Plan covers all full-time employees of the Company who have six months of service and are age 21 or older.
3. Contributions - All contributions are subject to certain limitations imposed by the Plan and the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). Contributions to the Plan may include the following:

Participant Contributions - The annual amount that a participant may elect as 401(k) contributions is limited to the amount designated by the Secretary of the Treasury pursuant to the limits on elective deferrals under Code Section 402(g). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions.

Employer Match and Profit Sharing Contributions - The Company makes matching contributions equal to 10% of participants' contributions (see above). The Company may terminate or discontinue such contributions at any time. The Company may also make a discretionary profit sharing contribution that is determined annually. There were no discretionary profit sharing contributions for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Employer Prevailing Wage Contributions - For work performed under prevailing wage contracts, the amount contributed to the Plan by the Company on behalf of the employee is based on the wage rate and job classification of the employee, and will not exceed the amount designated by the Secretary of the Treasury pursuant to the limits under the Code 415.

Rollovers - The Plan permits participants to transfer distributions from other qualified plans into the Plan.

4. Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with contributions, including employee, employer match, employer profit sharing, prevailing wage and rollover contributions, less any expenses attributable to such contributions. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations of profit sharing contributions, investment income and administrative expenses are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined.
5. Investment Options - Participants may direct their contributions into any of the funds offered by the Plan, which are held at Principal Financial Group. These funds include a variety of investment options with various objectives and degrees of financial risk.
6. Vesting - A participant's interest in employer prevailing wage contributions and participant contributions to his/her account is always 100% vested. Vesting in employer match and profit sharing contributions are based on a graded vesting schedule. The graded vesting schedule allows a participant's vesting to begin after one year of continuous service, such that after five years of continuous service, a participant is fully vested.

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**A. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN: (Continued)**

7. Participants' Notes Receivable - Participants with Plan account balances may borrow the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance. Each Loan shall bear a reasonable fixed rate of interest to be determined by the Loan Administrator. Loans are to be repaid at least quarterly on the basis of substantially level amortization within five years from the date the loan is made, except when used to acquire a principal residence where the term can be extended to up to fifteen years.
8. Payments of Benefits - Upon termination of service, a participant may receive a lump-sum distribution, installment payments or an annuity equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account as defined in the Plan. If a participant terminates employment for any reason and his or her vested account balance does not exceed \$1,000, the plan administrator may distribute such amount in a lump-sum payment to the participant without consent of the participant. If the participant's balance is between \$1,000 and \$5,000, the plan administrator may rollover the amount into an individual retirement account on behalf of the participant without the consent of the participant.

The Plan also provides for in-service withdrawals by participants who have attained the age of 59½. Upon financial hardship, a participant is entitled to the value of his or her deferral accounts, but not the earnings thereon, which is payable immediately in a lump-sum distribution. Benefits are recorded when paid.

9. Forfeitures - Forfeited nonvested accounts are used to reduce the Company's future matching or profit sharing contributions and/or reduce Plan expenses. Forfeited nonvested accounts as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 totaled zero and \$5,774, respectively. There were zero forfeitures used to reduce employer matching contribution for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. There were zero forfeitures used to reduce Plan expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**B. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:**

1. Basis of Accounting - Accounting records were maintained by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company dba: Principal Trust Company for the years then ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 on a modified cash basis and are in compliance with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The accompanying financial statements are prepared using the modified cash basis of accounting which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles, under which contributions and investment income are reported when received rather than when earned, distributions and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when incurred, and investments are recorded at fair value.
2. Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.
3. Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are presented in the accompanying financial statements at their fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value).

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the modified cash basis of accounting. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

4. Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the modified cash basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make note repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant note to be in default, and the participant note balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.
5. Benefit Payments - Benefit payments are recorded when paid.
6. Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expense. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

**C. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIAN (UNAUDITED):**

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

Principal Trust Company, the qualified institution of the Plan has certified to the completeness and accuracy of notes receivable from participants and investment information reflected on the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity reflected in the statement of changes in net assets for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**D. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS:**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurements.

**D. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS: (Continued)**

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for the assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Mutual Funds* - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**E. GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT WITH INSURANCE COMPANY:**

The Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal Life). Principal Life maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed-upon with the issuer, but is guaranteed not to drop below 1.00%. The crediting interest rate is set semi-annually and is declared in advance. The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore, is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Principal Life, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA, or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

**F. PARTICIPANTS' NOTES RECEIVABLE:**

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, outstanding notes receivable were \$343,288 and \$395,761, respectively.

**G. TAX STATUS:**

The Plan is placing reliance on an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 received from the IRS on the prototype plan indicating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the IRC and is, therefore, not subject to tax under current income tax law. The prototype plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Company has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

**H. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS:**

The Plan investments are managed by Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company dba: Principal Trust Company. Delaware Charter Guarantee & Trust Company dba: Principal Trust Company is the qualified institution of the Plan and, therefore, the investment transactions qualify as party-in-interest. Fees incurred by the Plan for the investment management services are included in net depreciation in fair value of the investment, as they are paid through revenue sharing, rather than direct payment. These party-in-interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

**I. PLAN TERMINATION:**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In any such event, the participants will become fully vested in their account balances.

**J. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES:**

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of pooled separate funds and insurance general accounts. Investment securities are exposed to various risk, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term, and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported on the statements of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis).

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**K. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS:**

Management has evaluated events occurring after the statement of net assets available for benefits date through October 13, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued. No material events have been identified which would require disclosure.
