Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. Description of Plan

The following brief description of The Mahoney Group 401(k) Plan and Trust (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information regarding the Plan's definitions, benefits, and eligibility requirements and other matters.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan was established on August 1, 1978. M&O Agencies, Inc., dba The Mahoney Group (the "Company" and the "Employer") is the Plan Sponsor and Plan Administrator. Empower Trust Company, LLC (the "Trustee") is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA") and the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Eligibility

Employees who are age 21 or older and not collective bargaining, non-resident aliens nor residents of Puerto Rico during the calendar year are eligible to participate in the Plan. Eligible employees may enter the Plan on the first day of the month following their date of hire if eligibility requirements are met. All employees can receive nonelective matching and discretionary matching contributions after one year of service.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of their pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Upon eligibility, each employee will be enrolled into the Plan by the Plan Administrator, automatically deferring 1% of their pre-tax annual compensation, with a 1% automatic increase in deferral percentage each Plan Year, up to 5%. Employees may elect not to defer compensation or may change their percentage deferral at any time. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan allows participants to designate contributions as Roth 401(k) contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The Company may make discretionary contributions to participant accounts. The Company made a discretionary contribution of approximately \$447,000 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Plan's matching contribution and the allocation of Plan earnings; each participant account is charged an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Certain expenses and administrative costs incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan are paid out of Plan assets.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Employer contributions are subject to a graded vesting schedule and are fully vested after six years of service. A participant is 100% vested upon death or disability.

Investment Allocation

Assets of the Plan are held in various funds as determined by the Plan. All accounts are participant directed. Participants may change their investment allocation daily.

Forfeited Accounts

If a participant terminates employment before becoming fully vested in their account balance, the forfeited portion of the account balance is used to reduce future Employer contributions to the Plan as well as pay reasonable Plan expenses. During 2024, \$76,000 was used to reduce employer contributions or pay plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled approximately \$3,000.

1. Description of Plan (Continued)

Notes Receivable From Participants

Participants are permitted to borrow up to 50 percent of their vested account balance with a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum loan amount of \$50,000. Only one note may be outstanding at any given time. The notes are secured by up to 50 percent of the participant's vested account balance. The terms require principal and interest payments no less frequently than one per quarter. Notes generally have a term of not more than five years, unless the note is for the purchase of a principal residence in which case the note repayment period may not extend beyond 15 years. The interest rate on notes shall be determined by the Plan Administrator based on terms as described in the Plan document. Upon termination of employment, the outstanding balance of a note becomes immediately payable. The notes bear interest at prime rate plus 1 percent. Notes receivable from participants are valued at their unpaid principal balance plus accrued interest.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Certain mandatory distribution provisions may apply for smaller account balances of terminated employees. Distributions may be made at the participant's election prior to termination, upon attainment of age 59½, or hardship as defined in the Plan Document.

If a participant's account balance does not exceed \$5,000 upon termination of employment, a distribution of the vested account balance will be made to the participant, regardless of whether they consent to receive it, as soon as administratively feasibly possible following termination of employment. The participant may elect to receive the distribution as a lump sum payment in cash or roll over the distribution into another retirement plan or individual retirement account ("IRA"). If the balance at termination exceeds \$1,000 (but does not exceed \$5,000), and the participant does not elect to either receive as a lump sum or roll over the distribution, the balance will be directly rolled over to an IRA automatically.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (US GAAP).

Accounting Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value, with the exception fully benefit-responsive investment contract, which is reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Realized gains and losses on investments bought and sold during the year, as well as unrealized gains and losses on investments held during the year, are presented in the net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Notes Receivable From Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivables are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid directly by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Certain expenses incurred in connection with the general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Fair Value of Financial Instruments

The Plan's accounting for fair value measurements of assets and liabilities that are recognized or disclosed at fair value in the financial statements on a recurring or nonrecurring basis adheres to the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to measurements involving significant unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs: Unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities accessible to the Plan at the measurement date.
- Level 2 Inputs: Other than quoted prices included in Level 1 inputs that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.
- Level 3 Inputs: Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability used to measure fair value to the extent that observable inputs are not available, thereby allowing for situations in which there is little, if any, market activity for the asset or liability at measurement date.

The level in the fair value hierarchy within which a fair measurement in its entirety falls is based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There were no changes in valuation methodologies as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commissions. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The Plan Administrator determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (the "Custodian"), Trustee and other third parties.

The method described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

SECURE 2.0

In December 2022, Securing a Strong Retirement Act (SECURE 2.0) was passed into law. The provisions of SECURE 2.0 continue the themes and reform that began with the 2020 CARES act. Most of the provisions of SECURE 2.0 became effective in 2024 or will become effective in 2025 and beyond. Since the provisions include both required and optional elements, the Plan Administrator will determine the optional provisions to elect.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Certification of Investment Information

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustee and Custodian have certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, at fair value, investment, at contract value, and notes receivable from participants, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Investment income and interest income on notes receivable from participants, as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024.

At the direction of the Plan Administrator, the Plan's independent accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

5. Fully Benefit-Responsive Investment Contract

The Plan entered into a fully benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower Retirement. Empower Retirement maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contract is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower Retirement, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than zero percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the plan documents (including complete or partial plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Employer or other employer events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. Plan management believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

6. Tax Status

The Plan uses a pre-approved plan document sponsored by Empower Retirement, Inc., which obtained its latest determination letter on April 7, 2021, stating that the pre-approved plan document satisfies the applicable provisions of the IRC. The Plan itself has not received an advisory letter from the IRS; however, the Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by Empower, the trustee of the Plan. As described in Note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to Plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. The Plan's investments are exposed to various risk factors, such as interest rates, market conditions and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is possible that changes in risk factors in the near term could materially affect the amounts reported in the financial statements.

9. Plan Termination

Although the Plan has not expressed any intent to do so, it has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of a Plan termination, participants will become fully vested in their Employer contributions, and the Plan assets will be distributed according to the provisions of the Plan documents.
