Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). We are required to be independent of the Marble Industry Annuity Trust Fund and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Marble Industry Annuity Trust Fund's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Marble Industry Annuity Trust Fund's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter — Supplemental Schedules Required by ERISA

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming an opinion on the financial statements as a whole. The supplemental schedule of assets held at end of year attached to Schedule H of Form 5500 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental information, we evaluated whether the supplemental information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

In our opinion, the information in the accompanying schedule is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole, and the form and content are presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Marble Industry Annuity Trust Fund (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document and its Summary Plan Description for a more complete description of the Plan provisions.

General: The Plan is a collectively bargained multi-employer non-contributory money purchase defined contribution plan established in 1951 that is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA). The Plan operates as a trust to provide retirement benefits to participants who are covered employees of participating employers under contracts with the Tile, Marble & Terrazzo Local 7, Bricklayers & Allied Craftworkers (the “Union”).

Plan Administration: The administration of the Plan is the responsibility of a Board of Trustees comprised of Union and Employer Trustees. The Union Trustees and Employer Trustees have equal voting rights. The investments of the Plan are managed by investment advisers and maintained by separate Plan custodians.

Benefits: Account distributions are made upon retirement, death, and withdrawal from the industry or permanent disability.

Funding: Contributions are made by employers for covered participants based upon hours. The contribution rates are determined by the collective bargaining agreements in effect at the time.

The Plan also accepts contributions for eligible employees of the Union under a separate participation agreement.

Contributions for 2024 and 2023 met the minimum funding requirements of ERISA.

Participant Accounts: Each participant’s account is credited with employer contributions plus an allocation for Plan earnings (losses) less an allocation of administrative expenses and benefits paid. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s account.

Vesting: Once an individual account has been established all contributions are immediately vested in each participant’s account.

Loans: A participant who has had an individual account for three (3) or more years may apply to the Plan for a loan of an amount not exceeding the lesser of (i) fifty percent (50%) of the participant account balance; or (ii) \$50,000 reduced by the amount of any current or previously defaulted loans and accrued interest. Interest from repayment of participant loans is allocated directly to participants’ individual account.

Other: Although they have not expressed any intention to do so, the Plan’s Board of Trustees has the right under the Plan to modify benefits provided to participants.

The Plan will terminate upon disbursement of the entire Trust Estate after the obligation of employers to make contributions terminates or upon any liquidation of the Trust Estate.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting: The financial statements were prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates: The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Employer Contributions: Employer contribution income and receivables do not include estimates of amounts due from employers where remittance reports were not received by the Plan office or for amounts due but unpaid as a result of disputed payroll audits, or for contributions held in the Trust Funds' clearance account that have not been identified by the Plan.

Payment of Benefits: Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition: Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 8 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Unrealized gains or losses are the differences between the fair value of the investments held at year-end and those held at the beginning of the year. Realized gains or losses on the sale of investments are based on the historical costs of the individual investments sold for financial reporting purposes, whereas the revalued cost (fair value at the beginning of the year) is used for determining the realized gain or loss for Form 5500 purposes.

Participant Loans Receivable: Participant loans receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are recorded as a distribution based upon the terms of the plan document.

Current Expected Credit Losses: The Plan has adopted Accounting Standards Update (ASU) No. 2016-13, Financial Instruments – Credit Losses (Topic 326): Measurement of Credit Losses on Financial Instruments. The core principles of ASU 2016-13 (the "ASU") significantly change the way organizations recognize credit losses by replacing the incurred loss model with an expected loss model. The financial assets held by the Union that are subject to the ASU are accounts receivables.

The Plan assesses credit losses on accounts receivable on a regular basis to determine the allowance for doubtful accounts. Given the nature of the Union's financial assets and historical loss experience, the adoption of the ASU did not have a significant impact on the financial statements.

NOTE 3 – PROCEDURE ON TERMINATION

In the event of termination of the Plan, the Trust Agreement requires that the trustees pay all obligations of the Plan and shall distribute and apply any remaining surplus in such a manner as will, in their opinion, best effectuate the purpose of the Plan. In no circumstances shall any funds revert or accrue to the benefit of any employer or the Union.

NOTE 4 – TAX STATUS

The Plan is a qualified Plan under Section 401 (a) of the IRC, and the Trust is exempt from federal income taxes under provisions of Section 501 (a) of the IRC. The Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") has determined and informed the Plan by letter dated February 12, 2017, that the Plan is a tax qualified Plan under applicable sections of the IRS. The Plan's management believes that the Plan is currently designed and is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirement of the Code and, therefore, believes that the related trust is tax exempt. Consequently, no provision for income tax has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

NOTE 5 – EVALUATION OF SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 6 – TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES AND PARTIES IN INTEREST

All employer contributions are initially recorded and deposited into a clearance account, which is recorded in the books of the Marble Industry Trust Fund (the “Trust Fund”), and then transferred to the various Marble Industry Fringe Benefit Funds. Amounts due to or from the clearance account represent under or over-transferred amounts of employer contributions. Employer contributions receivable includes amounts due from the clearance of \$130,348 and due to the clearance of \$5,587 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Plan reimburses the Trust Fund for a percentage of common administrative expenses paid by the Trust Fund based upon various methods in accordance with an allocation study done annually.

NOTE 8 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- Level 1: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the plan has the ability to access.
- Level 2: Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3: Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Interest bearing cash: Interest bearing cash is valued at cost, which approximates fair market value.

Partnership/joint ventures, common/collective trusts, pooled separate accounts, and 103-12 investment entities: Valued at net asset value (NAV) of units held (or its equivalent, such as member units or an ownership interest in partners' capital). The NAV or its equivalent is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV or its equivalent is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV or its equivalent.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting *date*.

The common/collective trusts, pooled separate accounts and 103-12 investment entities are measured at fair value by using the NAV practical expedient and file U.S. Department of Labor Form 5500 as a direct filing entity (DFE). Accordingly, disclosure of the significant investment strategies for these entities is not required.

Boyd Watterson GSA Fund, L. P. (“Boyd”) is a Delaware limited partnership formed on August 16, 2013, as a perpetual life, open-end, commingled collective investment fund. The general partner is Boyd Watterson GSA REIT, which was formed on September 26, 2013, as a Maryland corporation. The limited partners are public employee’s retirement systems.

The objective is to generate a stable stream of current income while preserving capital by investing primarily in real estate leased to the U.S. government through the General Services Administration (“GSA”) or other federal government agencies. It targets 8% net income return (with an expected range of 7%-9%) with lower volatility than intermediate U.S. Treasuries and core real estate alternatives.

Boyd’s investment guidelines are a loan-to-value ratio target of 40% with a maximum of 50%; maximum leverage limit of 75%; maximum position size of 10% of gross assets; a maximum of 15% of gross assets (measured by lease revenue) in non-GSA leases; no more than 35% in one agency calculated by rental revenue; and diversified revenues by geographic regions.

The U.S. Real Estate Investment Fund, LLC (the "Fund") is a limited liability company organized under the laws of the State of Delaware on July 31, 2006, pursuant to the Delaware Limited Liability Company Act (the Act). The Fund's investment objectives are to invest in a pool of real estate assets that are diversified by geography and property type, with a focus on yield-driven investments and, to a lesser extent, on value-added investments. The Manager of the Fund is Intercontinental Real Estate Corporation. The Fund is an open-ended, commingled real estate investment fund.

The Fund is organized for the objective and purpose of enabling its operating subsidiaries, U.S. Real Estate Investment REIT Fund, Inc., Bay State REIT, LLC, and U.S. Real Estate Investment Fund Non-REIT, LLC, to make investments in real estate assets; owning, managing, supervising, and disposing of such investments through its subsidiaries; sharing the profits and losses there from and engaging in such activities necessary, incidental, or ancillary thereto; and engaging in any other lawful act or activity for which limited liability companies may be organized under the Act in furtherance of the foregoing; provided, however, that the Fund shall make all qualifying investments only through one or more subsidiaries.

NOTE 9 – UNALLOCATED NET ASSETS AVAILABLE FOR BENEFITS

The Plan posts contributions to participant's accounts on the cash basis of accounting, but the financial statements report contribution income using the accrual basis of accounting. As a result, the Plan had unallocated net assets at December 31, 2024 and 2023 as follows:

NOTE 11 – CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

Financial instruments that subject the Plan to concentration of credit risk include cash and short-term investments. While the Plan attempts to limit any financial exposure, its cash deposit balances may, at times, exceed federally insured limits. Short-term investments are not covered by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

NOTE 12 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
