Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Chelo's 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the Statements of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 1. Description of the Plan

The following description of the Chelo's 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is intended to provide only general information regarding the Plan. Participants should refer to the Plan Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a participant-directed defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Chelo Management Company, Inc., Chelo's of Warwick, Inc., Chelo's Beef Hearth of Cranston, Inc., and Beef Hearth of Providence, Inc., (collectively, the Employer) who are at least twenty-one (21) years old and have completed 1,000 hours or one year of service as defined in the Plan provisions. Participants are allowed to enter the Plan on January 1 or July 1, following the completion of eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

The Employer is also the administrator of the Plan. As administrator, the Employer has exclusive authority and responsibility for all matters in connection with the operation and administration of the Plan. Three owners of the Employer serve as trustees of the Plan. The appointed trustees of the Plan act at the direction of the Plan Administrator.

Contributions

Participants may elect to contribute up to 90% of eligible compensation, not to exceed annual limitations as provided by the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers).

The Employer matches 25% of the amount that a participant contributes to the Plan, up to 10% of the participant's eligible compensation. The Employer may also make additional discretionary contributions to the Plan as approved by the Employer's Board of Directors. The contributions will be allocated based on a calculation factoring individual Plan participants' compensation in proportion to total compensation of all Plan participants. There were no additional discretionary contributions made to the Plan during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, including rollovers and allocations of the Employer's contributions and Plan earnings and losses. The allocation of earnings and losses is performed based on individual participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus the allocation of Plan earnings on those contributions, at the time of allocation. Participants become fully vested in Employer matching and discretionary contributions, and the allocation of Plan earnings on those contributions as follows: 20% after 1 year, 40% after 2 years, 60% after 3 years, 80% after 4 years, and 100% after 5 years. Each participant shall be 100% vested in their Employer contributions upon death.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their account a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Participants may only have one outstanding loan at a time. Note terms range from one to five years, or up to a reasonable time for the purchase of a primary residence. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate of prime plus 1%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant with a vested benefit exceeding \$5,000 may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. Upon termination of service, if a participant's vested balance is less than \$1,000, the participant will receive an immediate cash-out of their vested account balance. If a participant's vested balance exceeds \$1,000 but is less than \$5,000, the amount will be rolled over to an individual retirement plan designated by the Plan Administrator.

Participants, by written notice to the Employer, may request a financial hardship withdrawal from their participant deferral accounts, subject to limitations imposed by the IRC. Participants who have attained age 59½ may elect to withdraw all or a portion of their vested account while still employed.

Forfeitures

Participants in the Plan who leave the employment of the Employer before completing five years of service forfeit the non-vested portion of their accounts. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$36,922 and \$32,212, respectively, and are available to reduce future Employer contributions or to pay administrative expenses of the Plan. Forfeitures of \$11,295 were used to pay administrative expenses during 2024. No forfeitures were used to reduce Employer contributions during 2024.

Plan Termination

The Employer expects to continue the Plan indefinitely. However, the Employer reserves the right to amend the Plan or contributions thereto, at any time and in any manner that it deems advisable, provided that no amendment shall have the effect of diverting Plan assets for purposes other than for the exclusive benefit of the Plan participants. Any Plan termination would be subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan is terminated, the participants would become fully vested and entitled to receive all amounts credited to their accounts.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Valuation of Investments and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value, except for amounts allocated to the insurance company general account investment, which is stated at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (Note 3). Contract value represents investments at cost plus accrued interest income less amounts withdrawn to pay benefits. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and custodian.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the period.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest, and are secured by the balance in the respective participant's account. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Interest income on participant notes receivable is recorded when it is earned. A receivable is considered past due if payment has not been received within stated terms. Delinquent notes receivable from participants are reclassified as distributions based on terms of the Plan document.

Excess Contributions Refundable

Amounts refundable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the excess contributions to the applicable participants subsequent to year end.

Contributions

Employee contributions are recorded weekly when the Employer remits the payroll deductions for investment into the Plan. Employer matching contributions and any additional Employer discretionary contributions are recorded as a receivable at year end and are remitted to the Plan during the following year.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid to participants or their designated beneficiaries.

Administrative Expenses

Expenses incurred in the administration of the Plan are paid by the Employer unless the Employer directs that such expenses be paid by the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Employer are excluded from these financial statements. Participant notes receivable set-up and maintenance fees are paid directly by the participants through a reduction in their account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment management and recordkeeping fees, if applicable, are paid by the Plan as a reduction of investment income (net appreciation or depreciation) from the related investment fund.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of assets, liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported changes in net assets. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options with various investment objectives. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market risk and credit risk. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits.

The Plan invested in two mutual funds that accounted for approximately 64% and 66% of total Plan investments as of December 31, 2024 and December 31, 2023, respectively.

Financial Instruments with a Concentration of Credit Risk

The Plan's investments are held by a single custodian. The Plan's exposure to credit risk is associated with the outside entity's non-performance of their fiduciary responsibilities relating to these amounts as specified in the agreements. Benefits provided by the Plan are not insured or guaranteed by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Administrator has evaluated subsequent events through September 16, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy and inputs to the valuation methodologies are described as follows:

Level 1 inputs are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 inputs are other than quoted prices in active markets that are observable either directly or indirectly for the asset. Such inputs are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data for similar assets by correlation or other means, over substantially the full contractual term of the asset, if applicable.

Level 3 inputs are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. Such inputs generally rely on the Plan's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value on a recurring basis.

Pooled Separate Accounts: Valued using the net asset value (NAV) provided by the administrator of the fund based on the valuation of the underlying investment. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The pooled sperate accounts have a daily redemption frequency and no redemption notice period.

Self-directed Brokerage Account: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

4. Investment Contract with Insurance Company

The Plan has entered into an investment contract with Voya (Fixed Account). Amounts held in connection with this contract may be held in Voya's general account or separate accounts which invest in mutual funds advised by Voya, mutual funds sub-advised by third parties, mutual funds managed by external mutual fund companies or invested directly in securities.

Contributions allocated to the Fixed Account are invested in the general account of and are guaranteed by Voya. All other contributions allocated to any investment fund become part of separate accounts and are maintained separately from the general assets of Voya. The value of these contracts included in the financial statements, as reported to the Plan by Voya, is equal to the sum of the contributions made under the contracts, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

The contract value of funds allocated to the traditional general account investment with Voya at December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$408,669 and \$258,429, respectively. The minimum crediting rate under the contract was 1.00% for each of the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Withdrawals from this investment for other than the payment of benefits may be subject to a market value adjustment and a surrender charge and the ability to move funds out of this investment may be restricted by Voya.

The guarantee of values provided for investments made with Voya under the Plan's investment contract are based on the financial strength and claims-paying ability of Voya.

5. Income Tax Status

The Plan has been designed using a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing plan, in which the IRS stated in a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Plan satisfies the applicable requirements of the IRC. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter in order to comply with the latest applicable tax laws and regulations. The Employer and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability for any uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain positions taken, or expected to be taken, that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits in progress for any tax periods.

6. Summary of Financial Data Certified by the Custodian

The following is a summary of financial information and data certified by Voya, the custodian:

Statements of Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits at December 31, 2024 and 2023, except for participant notes and contributions receivable and liabilities;

Investment income and interest income from participant notes receivable on the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Plan Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and;

Investment information provided on the supplemental schedule, Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) at December 31, 2024, except for participant notes receivable.

7. Differences from Form 5500

Differences between the Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan, Form 5500, and these financial statements are a result of different classifications between line items. Total Plan assets are in agreement.

8. Related Party Transactions and Party-in-Interest Transactions

Plan investments are held and managed by Voya, the custodian of the Plan. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Plan made indirect payment to Voya for administrative services of \$13,335 for the year ended December 31, 2024. In addition, participant notes receivable qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Three owners of the Employer serve as trustees of the Plan.

9. Non-exempt Transactions

During 2024, the Employer failed to remit participant contributions of \$17,459 and loan repayments of \$2,471 to the Plan on a timely basis as prescribed in the applicable Department of Labor Regulations 29 CFR 2510.3-102. Defined contribution plans must remit employee contributions to the Plan as soon as they can be reasonably segregated from the Employer's general assets, but no later than the 15th business day of the month following the month in which the participant contributions are withheld or received by the Employer.

During 2024, the Employer remitted untimely participant contributions and loan repayments totaling \$19,930 due to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Employer is currently working with its third-party administrator to calculate and remit any lost earnings associated with these late remittances.

During 2023, the Employer failed to remit participant contributions of \$16,268 and loan repayments of \$1,520 to the Plan on a timely basis as prescribed in the applicable Department of Labor Regulations 29 CFR 2510.3-102.

During 2023, the Employer remitted untimely participant contributions and loan repayments of \$17,765 due to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2023. During 2024, the Employer remitted untimely participant contributions of \$23 due to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2023.
