### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Mickey's Linen & Towel Supply, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ["ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

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**NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Mickey's Linen and Towel Supply, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more comprehensive description of its provisions.

**General.** The Plan is a single-employer, defined contribution plan with a 401(k) provision covering employees of Mickey's Linen and Towel Supply, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer"). Employees who have completed three months of service and are twenty-one or older are eligible to participate except for employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement or leased employees. An employee may begin participating in the Plan immediately upon meeting all eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

**Administration of the Plan.** The Company is the Plan's sponsor and administrator. Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Trustee") is the trustee of the Plan. The Trustee is a qualified institution pursuant to ERISA.

All investments are self-directed by Plan participants, and investment options may be changed on a daily basis.

**Participant Contributions.** An eligible employee may elect to contribute a percentage of their pretax earnings which is limited and subject to amounts established by the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Effective November 3, 2023, participants may elect to defer a portion of their compensation as a Roth contribution on a before-tax basis.

All newly eligible employees will be subject to a 6% automatic enrollment with an annual increase of 1% on July 1 until a deferral rate of 10% is reached. Effective January 1, 2020, all active participants without a deferral election were subject to automatic enrollment provision.

The Plan accepts rollovers and transfers as defined in the Plan document.

**Employer Contributions.** The Company may elect to make discretionary matching contributions to each participant based on their elective deferrals in a percentage set by the Company prior to year-end. The Company matched 50% of the first 6% of each participant's salary deferral for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company made Employer discretionary matching contributions totaling \$180,777 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company may also contribute an additional amount as qualified non-elective contributions. There were no qualified non-elective contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. Discretionary profit sharing contributions by the Company may also be elected. Participants who have completed one year of service with at least 1,000 hours worked and are twenty-one or older are eligible for discretionary contributions. The Company made discretionary profit sharing contributions totaling \$229,335 for the year ended December 31, 2024. An employee is eligible immediately upon satisfaction of the eligibility requirements. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

**Participants' Accounts.** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Employer matching contribution and allocations of the Employer profit sharing contribution and Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of Plan expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Eligible participants may elect to convert employee deferrals or Employer discretionary matching contributions to be considered designated Roth contributions as defined in the Plan document.

**Investment Options.** Participants direct the investment of their contribution into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options on a daily basis, up to a certain amount of times as prescribed by the Plan Trustee.

**Vesting.** Participants are always 100% vested in their employee 401(k) deferral contributions and earnings. Participants vest in their Employer matching and profit sharing accounts in accordance with the following table:

**Notes Receivable from Participants.** According to the Plan's provisions, participants may not borrow from their accounts.

**Payment of Benefits.** Benefits may be paid to the participant or beneficiary upon death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, as defined in the Plan agreement. The Plan provides for normal retirement at age 65 with a provision for in-service distributions at age 62. A participant who continues employment after reaching age 65 shall have the right to elect to receive distribution of their account balance. For termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive (i) a lump-sum payment, (ii) a direct rollover to another qualified plan or IRA equal to their entire account, or (iii) combination non-rollover distribution and direct rollover. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant will be entitled to receive only the vested interest in their account in one of the forms above.

The Plan permits distributions in the event of a hardship, as defined by the Plan agreement, which are taxable and may be subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the hardship distribution amount if the participant is younger than 59 1/2. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the participant's elective account.

**Forfeitures.** Forfeiture account balances at the end of the Plan year are used to reduce the Employer's profit sharing and matching contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$7,344 and \$4,205, respectively, and were used to reduce the 2024 Employer profit sharing and matching contributions paid in 2024 by \$7,344 and \$-0-, respectively.

**Recent Legislation.** In December 2022, SECURE Act 2.0 ("SECURE 2.0") was enacted. SECURE 2.0 contains numerous significant changes for retirement plans, plan sponsors, and retirement plan providers. For example, SECURE 2.0 contains provisions related to, among many other things, increasing the required minimum distribution age, reducing required minimum distribution penalties, and removing required minimum distribution barriers for annuities. Many of the provisions in SECURE 2.0 went effective in 2023, but SECURE 2.0 will not be completely implemented until 2027. The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has issued additional guidance addressing specific issues arising from the implementation of the provisions of SECURE 2.0.

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**NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting.** The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

Investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

**Concentration of Credit Risk.** Substantially all the Plan’s investments were held by the Trustee.

**Estimates and Assumptions.** The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Future events and their effects cannot be predicted with certainty; accordingly, accounting estimates require the exercise of judgment. Accounting estimates used in the preparation of these financial statements change as new events occur, as more experience is acquired, as additional information is obtained and as the operating environment changes.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition.** Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit responsive contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments represents the change in fair value during the year, including realized gains and losses on investments sold during the year.

**Benefit Payments.** Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses.** Certain administrative expenses, including functions performed by officers or employees of the Company, are provided by the Company at no charge to the Plan, and the Company’s management has no plans to obtain reimbursement of these expenses from the Plan.

**NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE OF THE PLAN ASSETS**

The following is a summary of the unaudited information regarding the Plan, included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedule that was prepared by the Trustee and furnished to the Plan’s administrator (“Plan Administrator”). The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Trustee that such information is complete and accurate:

- Investments, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Interest and dividends and net appreciation in fair value of investments as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Note 4: All investment balances.
- Supplemental schedule - All balances.

#### **NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

FASB Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value.” That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

**Level 1.** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2.** Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3.** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund.** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan Administrator believes the valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE CONTRACT**

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract, Putnam Stable Value Fund, which meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

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**NOTE 5 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE CONTRACT** (Concluded)

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than a floor of 0% compounded annually as of December 31, 2024. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date. Participants may direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Premature terminations of the guaranteed general accounts for a non-benefit event are subject to a surrender charge.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Code.
2. Premature termination of the contracts.
3. Plan termination or merger.
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options.
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines.
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract.
3. A material misrepresentation.
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

**NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to discontinue its contributions or terminate the Plan, it is free to do so at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA and the Plan document. In the event of Plan termination, all participants will automatically become fully vested in all their accounts and the Trustee will distribute participant assets.

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**NOTE 7 – RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

Some Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by the Fidelity Management & Research Company, LLC, related party to the Trustee of the Plan. These transactions are allowable party-in-interest transactions under ERISA and the regulations promulgated there under.

**NOTE 8 – INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan is a volume submitter plan that had received an IRS opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 confirming its qualification under the applicable section of the Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter; however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The Plan Administrator is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might adversely affect the Plan's qualified status.

**NOTE 9 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of stocks, bonds, fixed income securities, registered investment companies and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 10 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated all known subsequent events from December 31, 2024 through October 7, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued, and is not aware of any material subsequent events occurring during this period that have not been disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

To the Administrative Committee of the

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of the Mickey's Linen & Towel Supply, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) ["ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit"]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan ("investment information") by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA ("qualified institution").

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2023, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Opinion**

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

### ***Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements***

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### ***Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements***

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

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**NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Mickey's Linen and Towel Supply, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more comprehensive description of its provisions.

**General.** The Plan is a single-employer, defined contribution plan with a 401(k) provision covering employees of Mickey's Linen and Towel Supply, Inc. (the "Company" or "Employer"). Employees who have completed three months of service and are twenty-one or older are eligible to participate except for employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement or leased employees. An employee may begin participating in the Plan immediately upon meeting all eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as amended.

**Administration of the Plan.** The Company is the Plan's sponsor and administrator. Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Trustee") is the trustee of the Plan. The Trustee is a qualified institution pursuant to ERISA.

All investments are self-directed by Plan participants, and investment options may be changed on a daily basis.

**Participant Contributions.** An eligible employee may elect to contribute a percentage of their pretax earnings which is limited and subject to amounts established by the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code"). Effective November 3, 2023, participants may elect to defer a portion of their compensation as a Roth contribution on a before-tax basis.

All newly eligible employees will be subject to a 6% automatic enrollment with an annual increase of 1% on July 1 until a deferral rate of 10% is reached. Effective January 1, 2020, all active participants without a deferral election were subject to automatic enrollment provision.

The Plan accepts rollovers and transfers as defined in the Plan document.

**Employer Contributions.** The Company may elect to make discretionary matching contributions to each participant based on their elective deferrals in a percentage set by the Company prior to year-end. The Company matched 50% of the first 6% of each participant's salary deferral for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company made Employer discretionary matching contributions totaling \$180,777 for the year ended December 31, 2024. The Company may also contribute an additional amount as qualified non-elective contributions. There were no qualified non-elective contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024. Discretionary profit sharing contributions by the Company may also be elected. Participants who have completed one year of service with at least 1,000 hours worked and are twenty-one or older are eligible for discretionary contributions. The Company made discretionary profit sharing contributions totaling \$229,335 for the year ended December 31, 2024. An employee is eligible immediately upon satisfaction of the eligibility requirements. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

**Participants' Accounts.** Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, the Employer matching contribution and allocations of the Employer profit sharing contribution and Plan earnings and charged with an allocation of Plan expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Eligible participants may elect to convert employee deferrals or Employer discretionary matching contributions to be considered designated Roth contributions as defined in the Plan document.

**Investment Options.** Participants direct the investment of their contribution into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options on a daily basis, up to a certain amount of times as prescribed by the Plan Trustee.

**Vesting.** Participants are always 100% vested in their employee 401(k) deferral contributions and earnings. Participants vest in their Employer matching and profit sharing accounts in accordance with the following table:

**Notes Receivable from Participants.** According to the Plan's provisions, participants may not borrow from their accounts.

**Payment of Benefits.** Benefits may be paid to the participant or beneficiary upon death, disability, retirement or termination of employment, as defined in the Plan agreement. The Plan provides for normal retirement at age 65 with a provision for in-service distributions at age 62. A participant who continues employment after reaching age 65 shall have the right to elect to receive distribution of their account balance. For termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, a participant may elect to receive (i) a lump-sum payment, (ii) a direct rollover to another qualified plan or IRA equal to their entire account, or (iii) combination non-rollover distribution and direct rollover. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant will be entitled to receive only the vested interest in their account in one of the forms above.

The Plan permits distributions in the event of a hardship, as defined by the Plan agreement, which are taxable and may be subject to a tax penalty equal to 10% of the hardship distribution amount if the participant is younger than 59 1/2. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the participant's elective account.

**Forfeitures.** Forfeiture account balances at the end of the Plan year are used to reduce the Employer's profit sharing and matching contributions. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$7,344 and \$4,205, respectively, and were used to reduce the 2024 Employer profit sharing and matching contributions paid in 2024 by \$7,344 and \$-0-, respectively.

**Recent Legislation.** In December 2022, SECURE Act 2.0 ("SECURE 2.0") was enacted. SECURE 2.0 contains numerous significant changes for retirement plans, plan sponsors, and retirement plan providers. For example, SECURE 2.0 contains provisions related to, among many other things, increasing the required minimum distribution age, reducing required minimum distribution penalties, and removing required minimum distribution barriers for annuities. Many of the provisions in SECURE 2.0 went effective in 2023, but SECURE 2.0 will not be completely implemented until 2027. The Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") has issued additional guidance addressing specific issues arising from the implementation of the provisions of SECURE 2.0.

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**NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting.** The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“GAAP”).

Investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan.

**Concentration of Credit Risk.** Substantially all the Plan’s investments were held by the Trustee.

**Estimates and Assumptions.** The preparation of financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Future events and their effects cannot be predicted with certainty; accordingly, accounting estimates require the exercise of judgment. Accounting estimates used in the preparation of these financial statements change as new events occur, as more experience is acquired, as additional information is obtained and as the operating environment changes.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition.** Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit responsive contracts which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments represents the change in fair value during the year, including realized gains and losses on investments sold during the year.

**Benefit Payments.** Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses.** Certain administrative expenses, including functions performed by officers or employees of the Company, are provided by the Company at no charge to the Plan, and the Company’s management has no plans to obtain reimbursement of these expenses from the Plan.

**NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE OF THE PLAN ASSETS**

The following is a summary of the unaudited information regarding the Plan, included in the Plan’s financial statements and supplemental schedule that was prepared by the Trustee and furnished to the Plan’s administrator (“Plan Administrator”). The Plan Administrator has obtained a certification from the Trustee that such information is complete and accurate:

- Investments, as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Interest and dividends and net appreciation in fair value of investments as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Note 4: All investment balances.
- Supplemental schedule - All balances.

#### **NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

FASB Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value.” That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

**Level 1.** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2.** Inputs to the valuation methodology include the following:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3.** Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodology used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund.** Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

The preceding method described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan Administrator believes the valuation method is appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

**NOTE 5 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE CONTRACT**

The Plan holds a traditional investment contract, Putnam Stable Value Fund, which meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

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**NOTE 5 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE CONTRACT** (Concluded)

The traditional investment contract held by the Plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than a floor of 0% compounded annually as of December 31, 2024. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date. Participants may direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. Premature terminations of the guaranteed general accounts for a non-benefit event are subject to a surrender charge.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Code.
2. Premature termination of the contracts.
3. Plan termination or merger.
4. Changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options.
5. Bankruptcy of the plan sponsor or other plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines.
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract.
3. A material misrepresentation.
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

**NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to discontinue its contributions or terminate the Plan, it is free to do so at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA and the Plan document. In the event of Plan termination, all participants will automatically become fully vested in all their accounts and the Trustee will distribute participant assets.

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**NOTE 7 – RELATED-PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

Some Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by the Fidelity Management & Research Company, LLC, related party to the Trustee of the Plan. These transactions are allowable party-in-interest transactions under ERISA and the regulations promulgated there under.

**NOTE 8 – INCOME TAX STATUS**

The Plan is a volume submitter plan that had received an IRS opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 confirming its qualification under the applicable section of the Code. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter; however, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. The Plan Administrator is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might adversely affect the Plan's qualified status.

**NOTE 9 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan provides for various investment options in any combination of stocks, bonds, fixed income securities, registered investment companies and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 10 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated all known subsequent events from December 31, 2024 through October 7, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued, and is not aware of any material subsequent events occurring during this period that have not been disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.
