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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of the

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Bob Ciasulli Auto Group 401(K) Plan ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. 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**NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Bob Ciasulli Auto Group 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Bob Ciasulli Auto Group, Inc. and Subsidiaries and participating employers that have adopted the plan provisions (the "Company"). The basic plan entry requirements include completion of 6 months of service and an age requirement of at least eighteen years of age. Eligible employees are allowed to enroll in the plan on the first day of the Plan Year or the first day of the following month of the Plan Year after meeting eligibility criteria. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

On December 29, 2022, the Secure 2.0 Act of 2022 (SECURE 2.0 Act) was signed into law. The act introduces new requirements and considerations for plan sponsors that are intended to expand coverage, increase savings, preserve income, and simplify plan rules and administrative procedures. Each of the provisions have its own effective dates ranging from the date of enactment to 2028 and beyond. In 2023, the Plan began implementing certain provisions of SECURE 2.0 Act, as approved by the Plan Administrator. The Plan will incorporate changes in its plan document to the extent required by the SECURE 2.0 Act. In 2024, the Plan required catch-up contributions to be Roth contributions and increased the mandatory distribution for \$5,000 to \$7,000 to be in line with SECURE 2.0 Act requirements.

**Contributions**

Participants may contribute a percentage of their compensation to the Plan on a pre-tax basis through elective salary deferrals; however, annual contributions may not exceed the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code in any calendar year. Participants of qualifying age may make additional "catch-up" contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan contains an automatic enrollment feature in which eligible employees are automatically enrolled to defer 3% of pay unless they complete an elective deferral agreement specifically opting out of or electing to defer at a different percentage. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

The Company may make matching contributions as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. The Company may contribute additional discretionary amounts at the option of the Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2024 the Company declared a discretionary matching contribution of \$125,000. The Company applied \$32,241 from the forfeiture account balance as of December 31, 2024. Additionally, the Company booked a receivable of \$92,759 as of December 31, 2024, consisting of a \$82,000 payment and \$10,759 of new forfeitures applied in 2025.

**Investment Options**

The Plan holds various investments made up of a common collective trust and mutual funds. The Plan also has a stable value fund contract choice which seeks to protect against any loss of principal while providing returns in excess of money market funds and one-year U.S. Treasury bills. All assets in the fixed income account are credited with interest using a declared monthly rate determined by Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity") and stated in advance.

Participants are permitted to direct the plan administrators as to respective percentages of their account balances to be invested. They are also permitted to change those percentages; and to direct the plan administrators to transfer a percentage of their accounts invested in the various accounts in accordance with guidelines established by the Plan. These balances can come from elective deferral contributions, participant and rollover contributions, and other contributions.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contribution, and allocations of Plan earnings or losses. The participant accounts are also charged with a portion of the administrative expenses of the Plan. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferred contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after one year of service is completed and an additional 10% for second and third year of service, then 20% each three years thereafter. Participants are fully vested in Company contributions after six years of credited service.

**Forfeitures**

Any non-vested portion of the Company's matching contribution that a participant has lost the right to is called a forfeiture. These amounts should be used to pay plan administrative expenses or to reduce Company matching contributions. During 2024, total amount of forfeitures added is \$31,385. There were \$23,177 of forfeitures used during the year. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the unused forfeiture account balance was \$32,325 and \$24,117, respectively.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms cannot exceed five years, unless the proceeds are used to acquire a principal residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

**Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to retirement, attainment of age 59 ½, termination of employment, death, or disability, the participant's account may be distributed to the participant or beneficiary (in the event of the participant's death) through either a lump sum payment or in installments. A participant is entitled to receive a payment in an amount equal to the vested value of his or her account. Also, under certain hardship circumstances, a participant may withdraw a portion of the amounts credited to their account. Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

The administrative expenses of the Plan are paid for in part by the Plan through charges to the participant accounts and in part by the plan sponsor directly. For the year ended December 31, 2024, plan expenses charged to participant accounts were \$108,255. Net investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits presents the fair value of the investment contracts which is 100% of contract value.

**Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts, changes therein and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The investment assets are reported by the custodian at their fair market value and are valued daily using publicly available quoted market prices. The change in market value from year to year are reported as unrealized gains and losses. The Plan does not share in the realized gains of the investments, just in the change in market value. In addition, certain investment assets generate interest and dividend income for the Plan. See Note E for discussion of fair value measurements.

**NOTE C - UNAUDITED INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE**

Fidelity holds the Plan's investment assets and has certified that all information pertaining to investments included in the financial statements is complete and accurate. This investment information has not been audited by the independent auditors.

**NOTE D - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

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**NOTE E - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

**Level 1** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurements. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

*Mutual Funds*

The mutual funds are actively traded with publicly quoted pricing inputs. The Net Asset Values ("NAV") of the funds are available in an observable market and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

*Common Collective Trusts*

This investment is a collective investment trust for which the NAV is based on the market value of its underlying investment. The fund contains synthetic investment contracts comprised of both underlying investments and contractual components. Due to the various unique investments that may be allowed in a collective trust fund the trust is classified as net asset value practical expedient ("NAVPE").

**NOTE F - STABLE VALUE FUND**

In 2017, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive stable value fund contract with Fidelity totaling \$56,522 and \$202,187 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Fidelity maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with a stated interest rate that is provided at least 30 days prior to the effective date each plan year. Administrative fees and recordkeeping fees not paid by the employer may be charged against this fund as expenses. The stable value fund contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0.90%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The stable value fund contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Fidelity, represents contributions made under the

contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without consent of the issuer.

**NOTE G - PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

**NOTE H - TAX STATUS**

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirement of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the standardized prototype plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the trustee by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the prototype plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

The Plan has determined that it does not have any material unrecognized tax benefits or obligations as of December 31, 2024. The 2021, 2022, and 2023 tax years remain subject to examination by major tax jurisdictions.

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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of the  
Bob Ciasulli Auto Group 401(K) Plan

### Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the financial statements of Bob Ciasulli Auto Group 401(K) Plan ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year then ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note C to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### Opinion

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**NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the Bob Ciasulli Auto Group 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all eligible employees of Bob Ciasulli Auto Group, Inc. and Subsidiaries and participating employers that have adopted the plan provisions (the "Company"). The basic plan entry requirements include completion of 6 months of service and an age requirement of at least eighteen years of age. Eligible employees are allowed to enroll in the plan on the first day of the Plan Year or the first day of the following month of the Plan Year after meeting eligibility criteria. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

On December 29, 2022, the Secure 2.0 Act of 2022 (SECURE 2.0 Act) was signed into law. The act introduces new requirements and considerations for plan sponsors that are intended to expand coverage, increase savings, preserve income, and simplify plan rules and administrative procedures. Each of the provisions have its own effective dates ranging from the date of enactment to 2028 and beyond. In 2023, the Plan began implementing certain provisions of SECURE 2.0 Act, as approved by the Plan Administrator. The Plan will incorporate changes in its plan document to the extent required by the SECURE 2.0 Act. In 2024, the Plan required catch-up contributions to be Roth contributions and increased the mandatory distribution for \$5,000 to \$7,000 to be in line with SECURE 2.0 Act requirements.

**Contributions**

Participants may contribute a percentage of their compensation to the Plan on a pre-tax basis through elective salary deferrals; however, annual contributions may not exceed the maximum allowed under the Internal Revenue Code in any calendar year. Participants of qualifying age may make additional "catch-up" contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Plan contains an automatic enrollment feature in which eligible employees are automatically enrolled to defer 3% of pay unless they complete an elective deferral agreement specifically opting out of or electing to defer at a different percentage. Contributions are subject to certain limitations.

The Company may make matching contributions as determined annually by the Company's Board of Directors. The Company may contribute additional discretionary amounts at the option of the Board of Directors. For the year ended December 31, 2024 the Company declared a discretionary matching contribution of \$125,000. The Company applied \$32,241 from the forfeiture account balance as of December 31, 2024. Additionally, the Company booked a receivable of \$92,759 as of December 31, 2024, consisting of a \$82,000 payment and \$10,759 of new forfeitures applied in 2025.

**Investment Options**

The Plan holds various investments made up of a common collective trust and mutual funds. The Plan also has a stable value fund contract choice which seeks to protect against any loss of principal while providing returns in excess of money market funds and one-year U.S. Treasury bills. All assets in the fixed income account are credited with interest using a declared monthly rate determined by Fidelity Management Trust Company ("Fidelity") and stated in advance.

Participants are permitted to direct the plan administrators as to respective percentages of their account balances to be invested. They are also permitted to change those percentages; and to direct the plan administrators to transfer a percentage of their accounts invested in the various accounts in accordance with guidelines established by the Plan. These balances can come from elective deferral contributions, participant and rollover contributions, and other contributions.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the Company's matching contribution, and allocations of Plan earnings or losses. The participant accounts are also charged with a portion of the administrative expenses of the Plan. Allocations are based on participant compensation or account balances, as defined by the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their elective deferred contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 20% vested after one year of service is completed and an additional 10% for second and third year of service, then 20% each three years thereafter. Participants are fully vested in Company contributions after six years of credited service.

**Forfeitures**

Any non-vested portion of the Company's matching contribution that a participant has lost the right to is called a forfeiture. These amounts should be used to pay plan administrative expenses or to reduce Company matching contributions. During 2024, total amount of forfeitures added is \$31,385. There were \$23,177 of forfeitures used during the year. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the unused forfeiture account balance was \$32,325 and \$24,117, respectively.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms cannot exceed five years, unless the proceeds are used to acquire a principal residence. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the plan document.

**Payment of Benefits**

On termination of service due to retirement, attainment of age 59 ½, termination of employment, death, or disability, the participant's account may be distributed to the participant or beneficiary (in the event of the participant's death) through either a lump sum payment or in installments. A participant is entitled to receive a payment in an amount equal to the vested value of his or her account. Also, under certain hardship circumstances, a participant may withdraw a portion of the amounts credited to their account. Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Administrative Expenses**

The administrative expenses of the Plan are paid for in part by the Plan through charges to the participant accounts and in part by the plan sponsor directly. For the year ended December 31, 2024, plan expenses charged to participant accounts were \$108,255. Net investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

**NOTE B - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits presents the fair value of the investment contracts which is 100% of contract value.

**Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts, changes therein and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The investment assets are reported by the custodian at their fair market value and are valued daily using publicly available quoted market prices. The change in market value from year to year are reported as unrealized gains and losses. The Plan does not share in the realized gains of the investments, just in the change in market value. In addition, certain investment assets generate interest and dividend income for the Plan. See Note E for discussion of fair value measurements.

**NOTE C - UNAUDITED INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE**

Fidelity holds the Plan's investment assets and has certified that all information pertaining to investments included in the financial statements is complete and accurate. This investment information has not been audited by the independent auditors.

**NOTE D - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits.

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**NOTE E - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") *Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

**Level 1** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

**Level 2** - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

**Level 3** - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurements. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023:

*Mutual Funds*

The mutual funds are actively traded with publicly quoted pricing inputs. The Net Asset Values ("NAV") of the funds are available in an observable market and are classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

*Common Collective Trusts*

This investment is a collective investment trust for which the NAV is based on the market value of its underlying investment. The fund contains synthetic investment contracts comprised of both underlying investments and contractual components. Due to the various unique investments that may be allowed in a collective trust fund the trust is classified as net asset value practical expedient ("NAVPE").

**NOTE F - STABLE VALUE FUND**

In 2017, the Plan entered into a traditional fully benefit-responsive stable value fund contract with Fidelity totaling \$56,522 and \$202,187 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Fidelity maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with a stated interest rate that is provided at least 30 days prior to the effective date each plan year. Administrative fees and recordkeeping fees not paid by the employer may be charged against this fund as expenses. The stable value fund contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 0.90%. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The stable value fund contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Fidelity, represents contributions made under the

contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract (3) a material misrepresentation, or (4) a material amendment to the agreements without consent of the issuer.

**NOTE G - PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

**NOTE H - TAX STATUS**

The Plan has not obtained a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") stating that the Plan was in compliance with the applicable requirement of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan is relying on the IRS approval of the standardized prototype plan that it is utilizing. The IRS has determined and informed the trustee by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the prototype plan document was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC. The plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, the plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

The Plan has determined that it does not have any material unrecognized tax benefits or obligations as of December 31, 2024. The 2021, 2022, and 2023 tax years remain subject to examination by major tax jurisdictions.
