

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

Note 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of Steel Art Company, Inc. 401(k) Retirement Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution Plan covering all employees of the Steel Art Company, Inc. (the "Company" or the "Plan Sponsor") who have completed six months of service and are age 21 or older. An employee who has satisfied the eligibility requirements may enter the Plan on the first day of any calendar month following the date the eligibility requirements are met. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Board of Trustees is responsible for oversight of the Plan.

Contributions

The Plan provides for employee pre-tax contributions and Roth contributions up to the maximum amount allowed by federal law. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution Plans (rollover). The Plan also provides for discretionary employer contributions. Employer contributions were \$155,385 and \$140,226 for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. There were no discretionary contributions attributable to 2024. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations. Contributions from plan participants and Company contributions are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of Plan earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or their vested account balance. Participants may have multiple loans outstanding at any time. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a reasonable rate as determined by the Plan Administrator. The interest rate on loans outstanding in 2024 and 2023 ranged from 3.25% to 8.5%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions, and the loan repayment period cannot exceed five years, unless it is for the purchase of a principal residence.

The Plan administrator shall treat a loan as in default if any scheduled repayment is not made by the end of the calendar quarter following the calendar quarter in which the missed payment was due. Upon default, death, disability or termination of employment, the entire outstanding principal and accrued interest shall be immediately due and payable.

Notes receivable from three participants totaled \$74,485 (40%) and \$89,034 (56%) of the Plan's total notes receivable for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Payments of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement or upon attainment of age 59 ½, a participant may elect to receive a distribution of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum. A participant who ceases to be employed for the above reasons with a vested account balance less than \$1,000 will automatically receive a lump sum distribution of the vested account balance.

Hardship withdrawals are only allowed from participant deferrals under the provisions of the Plan and cannot exceed the amount required to meet the immediate financial need created by the hardship. The participant will be suspended from making contributions for six months after taking a hardship withdrawal.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100 percent vested after six years of credited service.

Forfeited Accounts

There were no forfeited non-vested accounts at both December 31, 2024, and 2023.

Note 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

The self-directed brokerage account is an option that allows participants to self-direct investment in a wider variety of mutual funds, equity securities, and debt securities.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payments of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in the net appreciation (depreciation) of fair value of investments.

Note 3 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan can access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include.

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets.
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets.
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability.
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024.

- *Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts:* Within the self-directed brokerage account, the fair value of mutual funds and equity securities are based on quoted market prices (Level 1), while the fair values of money market are valued at amortized cost, which approximates fair value. The amortized cost of an instrument is determined by valuing it at its original cost and thereafter amortizing any discount or premium from its face value at a constant rate until maturity. Securities held by the money market fund are generally high quality and liquid; however, the inputs used to determine fair value are not quoted prices in an active market (Level 2).
- *Pooled separate accounts:* Valued using the market value of the underlying investments as determined by an independent professional's opinion and independent pricing sources (Level 2)
- *Mutual Funds (Registered Investment Companies):* Valued at a daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

During 2023 the management of Steel Art Company, Inc., the Plan's sponsor, elected to change the Plan's third-party administrator from John Hancock Life Insurance Company ("John Hancock") to ADP, Inc ("ADP"). The change was made to increase efficiencies within the management of the Plan's sponsor. On December 29, 2023, the Plan's total assets of \$2,739,418 (participant account balances and participant notes receivable balances) were transferred from John Hancock to ADP.

On January 2, 2024, ADP recorded the receipt of the Plan's assets transferred from John Hancock. There were no liabilities existing at December 29, 2023 and thus, none were transferred.

For 2024, ADP, Inc. will now serve as the Plan's third-party administrator.

Note 4 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY TRUSTEE (UNAUDITED)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, Automatic Data Processing, Inc. ("ADP"), the custodian of the registered investment accounts and cash accounts have certified to the completeness and accuracy of all plan assets, investment transactions, income and for the schedule of assets (held at the end of the period) as of December 31, 2024.

Note 5 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Section 3(14) of ERISA defines a party-in-interest to include, among others, fiduciaries or employees of the plan, any person who provides services to the plan, or an employer whose employees are covered by the plan. The plan invests in pooled separate accounts issued by the plan's custodian and record keeper, ADP, Inc ("ADP") A substantial portion of the income or loss of the plan is derived from these investments.

Legacy Retirement Solutions is the third-party administrator of the Plan. ADP, Inc. provides investment transaction services to the Plan. Therefore, transactions between the Plan, Legacy Retirement Solutions and ADP, Inc. qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for record-keeping and investment transaction services amounted to \$21,435 and \$12,617 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 plus additional amounts included as a reduction of the returns earned on the investments.

Certain officers of the Company, who are also participants in the Plan, perform administrative services to the Plan at no cost to the Plan. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules.

Note 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Plan Sponsor has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 7 – TAX STATUS

The Plan has adopted a prototype non-standardized profit-sharing Plan. The prototype Plan and related trust received a favorable opinion letter dated September 30, 2014, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the form of the prototype Plan was designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the advisory opinion, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax provisions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any of the tax periods in progress.

Note 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

Note 9 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through the date of this report, October 2, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued and there were no material subsequent events that required recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.
