Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of NEA Therapy Providers 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1: Description of Plan

The following description of the NEA Therapy Providers 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Description, Plan Document and Adoption Agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all full-time employees of NEA Therapy Providers of Arkansas (the “Company”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employment Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Dyatech, LLC is the third-party administrator of the Plan and Capital Bank and Trust Company is the custodian of the Plan. Ronnie Norman and Kevin James are the trustees of the Plan. The trustees and certain administrative employees at the Company are responsible for oversight of the Plan.

Contributions

Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, subject to certain Internal Revenue Code limitations, as defined in the Plan. The Plan allows Roth deferrals. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Company may make a discretionary matching contribution. For the years ending December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company made a matching contribution up to 100% of the first 2% of base compensation that a participant contributed to the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$17,255 and \$16,160, respectively. These accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions. In 2024 and 2023, employer contributions were reduced by \$0 and \$3,085, respectively, from forfeited non-vested accounts.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their contributions as well as the Company’s contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers 29 mutual funds and one money market fund as investment options for participants.

Participant Accounts

Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contribution, if any, and is credited/charged with Plan earnings/losses. Allocations are based on participant earnings/losses or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount or installments equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account. For termination of services for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings/losses thereon. Vesting in the Company's matching contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of credited service.

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Subsequent Events

The Company has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements through October 3, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments purchased and sold as well as held during the year.

Fees charged to the Plan for investments in mutual funds are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Plan Administration Costs

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Administrative costs may be paid by the Company or the Plan, at the Company's discretion. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity U.S. GAAP requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 3: Fair Value Measurements

FASB ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

An asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period.

We have evaluated the significance of transfers between levels based upon the nature of the financial instruments and size of the transfer relative to total net assets available for benefits. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no transfers in or out of levels 1, 2, or 3.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Mutual funds represent investments with various investment managers. The fair value of these investments is determined by reference to the fund's underlying assets, which are principally marketable equity and fixed income securities. Shares held in mutual funds traded on national securities exchanges are valued at the net asset value.

Money Market: Money market funds represents investments primarily in high-quality, short term money market instruments. The money market fund is traded on national securities exchanges.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 4: Information Prepared and Certified by the Custodian

The plan administrator elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Capital Bank and Trust Company, the custodian of the Plan, has certified that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule is complete and accurate with respect to investments:

- Investments, at fair value
- Net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments
- Interest and dividends
- Schedules of assets (held at end of year)

The Plan's independent public accountants did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Note 5: Risks And Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Note 6: Federal Income Tax Status

The Plan obtained its latest opinion letter on June 30, 2020, in which the Internal Revenue Service stated that the Plan, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (the "IRC"). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, they believe that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

U.S. GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the United States Department of the Treasury Internal Revenue Service. The Plan has analyzed all tax positions and does not feel any meet the requirement for reporting under U.S. GAAP. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7: Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event that the Plan is terminated, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 8: Related-Party and Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan, including the Company. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. The Company provides certain administrative services at no cost to the Plan. The Plan incurs expenses related to general administrative and recordkeeping. The Company pays the majority of these expenses and certain accounting and auditing fees related to the Plan.
