We have performed an audit of the financial statements of Duck Creek Technologies 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the *Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974* (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of Duck Creek Technologies 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on January 1, 2017, to provide eligible employees of Duck Creek Technologies, LLC (the “Company”) with retirement benefits in accordance with Sections 401(a) and 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). Effective January 1, 2021, the Plan was amended and restated.

Eligibility

All Company employees are eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of employment, except for leased employees, collectively bargained employees, Puerto Rico residents and interns who are not credited with at least 1,000 hours of service, as defined by the Plan document.

Participant Contributions

Eligible participants may make voluntary contributions through salary reductions from 1% to 80% of their annual eligible pre-tax compensation, as defined by the Plan, limited to the maximum amounts allowed under the provisions of the IRC (\$23,000 in 2024). Further, participants who are 50 years of age or older as of December 31, 2024 may contribute an additional “catch up” contribution (\$7,500 in 2024).

The Plan also includes an automatic enrollment provision, providing eligible employees to be automatically enrolled into the Plan at a deferral rate of 6% and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. In accordance with the automatic enrollment provision, the deferral rate will increase by 1% annually (January 1st), not to exceed 20% for those participants who have been automatically enrolled. Eligible employees are able to opt out of participating at any time. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan currently offers various mutual funds, common collective trust funds, and self-directed brokerage accounts as investment options for participants.

The Plan also allows participants to defer funds as a “Roth 401(k) deferral”. In addition, the Plan allows for additional after-tax contributions. These deferrals are subject to federal and state income taxes and the maximum allowable contribution is \$23,000 combined between both the Roth and the pre-tax deferrals.

Rollover Contributions

The Plan may receive, on behalf of a participant, rollover contributions from other qualified plans subject to approval by the plan administrator. These contributions are 100% vested upon contribution.

Employer Contributions

The Plan allows for a discretionary matching contribution to be made on a payroll period basis. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company matched 100% of each participant’s contributions up to 6% of the participant’s eligible compensation. The Company’s matching calculation includes a true-up contribution for the application of the discretionary match on an annual basis if the participant is employed on the last day of the plan year. The discretionary matching contribution for the year ended December 31, 2024, was \$5,842,901.

Participants' Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participants' contribution and its allocation of (a) employer contributions and (b) Plan earnings or losses.

Vesting

Participants' voluntary contributions, rollover contributions, and earnings thereon vest immediately. The Company's discretionary matching contributions are 100% vested after two years of service (as defined). In the event of death, disability, or attainment of age 55, participants' accounts become fully vested.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of employment, retirement, death, or disability, the participant or the participant's beneficiary is entitled to receive the vested portion of the participant's account in a single lump-sum or installment payments. Further, withdrawals from the Plan before leaving the Company are available for special "hardship" reasons or after attaining the age of 59½. Distributions to participants are recorded when paid.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures, the unvested portion of employer contributions for terminated participants, may be used to reduce future employer contributions or to pay Plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested account balances totaled \$322,890 and \$263,999, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$683,279 of forfeitures were used to fund employer contributions.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Participants may borrow up to 50% of their vested account balance with a minimum of \$1,000 and maximum of \$50,000. Loans are subject to approval by the plan administrator and bear interest at 1% above the prime rate (8.50% at December 31, 2024). Loan terms range from one to five years. However, if the loan is to acquire the principal residence of the participant, the term may be extended up to ten years. Participants are limited to two loans outstanding at any given time. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Notes receivable from various participants are accruing interest at rates from 4.25% to 9.50% with maturity dates through March 2032 at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following is a summary of significant accounting policies followed by the Plan.

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires Plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Plan investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Company determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the trustee. See Note 8 for discussions of fair value measurements.

Realized gains and losses on investments sold and the unrealized appreciation and depreciation of investments held are reported on an average current cost basis, based on fair market value of the investments at the beginning of the Plan year or at the time of purchase during the Plan year.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Administrative Expenses

The Company may, at its discretion, pay the expenses incidental to administering the Plan. In the event that the Company does not pay Plan expenses, the expenses shall be paid by the Plan.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the excess contributions to the applicable participants in the subsequent plan year.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3. Information Certified by The Plan's Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(c) pursuant to CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, T. Rowe Price Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, a qualified institution, has certified the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, is complete and accurate:

- Investments and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023
- Investment income and interest income from notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024
- Investment information and notes receivable from participants included in the accompanying schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024

The Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified investment information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

Note 4. Tax Status

The Plan operates a non-standardized pre-approved profit sharing/money purchase adoption agreement sponsored by T. Rowe Price Retirement Plan Services, Inc.

Effective February 25, 2021, the Pre-Approved Defined Contribution Plan documents adopted by the Plan were restated to adopt required amendments, regulatory changes, and other enhancements in order to maintain the Plan's tax-qualified status. On August 19, 2020, the IRS stated that the pre-approved plan adopted by the Plan, as designed, qualifies under Section 401(a) of the IRC.

The Financial Accounting Standards Board has issued a standard regarding the accounting and recognition of income tax positions taken or expected to be taken by the Plan. The plan administrator assesses the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

The Plan's management believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

Note 5. Party-In-Interest Transactions

Party-in-interest transactions include those with fiduciaries or employees of the Plan, any person who provides services to the Plan, an employer whose employees are covered by the Plan, an employee organization whose members are covered by the Plan, a person who owns 50% or more of such an employer or employee association, or relatives of such persons.

Certain Plan investments consist of common collective trust funds and a money market fund held by T. Rowe Price. T. Rowe Price is the trustee, as defined by the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules as defined by ERISA. Fees paid by the Plan for recordkeeping and investment management services amounted to \$ \$105,717 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Note 6. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for various investment options in accounts which invest in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that these changes could materially affect participants' account balances, and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits

Note 8. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards require that financial and non-financial assets and liabilities, recognized or disclosed in financial statements on a recurring basis (at least annually), be measured at fair value. These standards define fair value as the exchange price that would be received for an asset or paid to transfer a liability (an exit price) in the principal or most advantageous market for the asset or liability in an orderly transaction between market participants on the measurement date. These standards also establish a fair value hierarchy which requires an entity to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value.

These standards describe three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value:

- Level 1** - Quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that are accessible at the measurement date.
- Level 2** - Observable inputs other than Level 1 prices such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active; or model-derived valuations or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for the assets or liabilities.
- Level 3** - Unobservable inputs for the asset or liability that are significant to the fair value measurement. These inputs reflect the Plan's assumptions about the assumptions a market participant would use in pricing the asset or liability.

The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 2 and Level 3 inputs are only used when higher level inputs are not available.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trusts: Valued at the net asset value of units of a bank collective trust. The net asset value as provided by the trustee is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The net asset value is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported net asset value. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

Money market fund: Valued at the closing price reported by the fund sponsor from an actively traded exchange.

Self-directed brokerage: Consists of mutual funds, money market funds, Fixed Income and equities. All these are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices except Fixed Income. Fixed Income are valued at are not actively traded in market but can be valued using observable market inputs such as interest rate and yield curves.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.
