As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

As disclosed in Note 1 to the 2024 Financial Statements, the Board of Managers of Sanitas of New Jersey 401(k) Plan approved the Plan's termination effective October 31, 2024 and determined that liquidation is imminent. As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the full accrual basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2024 financial statements. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the 2024 Financial Statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the 2024 Financial Statements.

In preparing the 2024 Financial Statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about Sanitas of New Jersey 401(k) Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for at least one year following the date that the 2024 Financial Statements are available to be issued.

1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Sanitas of New Jersey 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established on January 1, 2018, and its Plan Document was restated on May 1, 2022. The Plan covers all employees, excluding nonresident aliens who have no earned income from sources within the United States, and residents of Puerto Rico, of Sanitas of New Jersey, LLC (the "Plan Sponsor", "Employer" or "Company") who have completed 3 months of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended ("ERISA"). The Board of Managers are responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Plan Administrator determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance, and reports to the Plan's Board of Managers.

Effective December 29, 2022, the Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement ("SECURE") 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law. The Act is inclusive of approximately 90 provisions which offer many new benefits to employers and Plan participants. Certain provision changes are related to the following, but not limited to: changes to auto-escalation, age of required minimum distributions, catch-up contributions, and increased dollar threshold for mandatory distributions. Depending on the specific provision, some will take effect immediately, while others begin in a future year. Subsequently, the Plan adopted certain provisions of the SECURE 2.0 Act and is in the process of formally amending the Plan Document.

Plan Termination

Effective October 31, 2024, the Board of Managers approved the termination of the Plan due to the sale of the Plan Sponsor and determined that liquidation is imminent. As a result, the Plan has changed its basis of accounting from the full accrual basis used in presenting the 2023 financial statements to the liquidation basis used in presenting the 2024 financial statements. The Board of Managers and Plan Administrator are responsible for oversight of the subsequent distribution of Plan assets to the remaining participants. As of the date the financial statements were available to be issued, the Board of Managers and Plan Administrator are in the process of distributing all remaining assets to Plan participants.

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 90 percent of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan Document, up to the maximum limits of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Participants also may designate all or a portion of their deferral contributions as after-tax contributions into a Roth account. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants also may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans ("Rollovers"). As the Plan was terminated effective October 31, 2024, no participant contributions after such termination were allowed.

The Plan includes an automatic enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 2 percent of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in designated lifecycle fund until changed by the participant. As the Plan was terminated effective October 31, 2024, no participants were enrolled after such termination.

The Company contributes a discretionary match of 30 percent of the first 3 percent of base compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. Additional non-elective amounts may be contributed at the option of the Board of Managers. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company did not elect to make a non-elective contribution to the Plan.

Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") limitations.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, and Rollovers into the Plan, Company matching contributions, allocations of the Company's non-elective contributions, if any, and an allocation of the Plan's earnings or losses. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined by the Plan Document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions, including Rollovers, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. Participants vest in Company contributions plus actual earnings thereon whereby a participant is 0 percent vested until reaching 2 years of credited service. A participant is 20 percent vested after 2 years of credited service and continues to vest in increments of 20 percent until 100 percent vested after 6 years of credited service.

Upon termination of employment, a participant's nonvested amounts are forfeited in accordance with the Plan Document. A participant which terminates employment due to death or disability, as defined by the Plan Document, becomes 100% vested in all contribution types.

Due to the termination of the Plan, all participant accounts became fully vested effective October 31, 2024.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account balances a minimum of \$500 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined monthly, is set at 2 percent above the prime rate, as defined by the Plan Document. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Terms range from 1 month to 5 years or greater for the purchase of a primary residence.

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, approximately \$11,100 and \$10,500 (compiled), respectively, in outstanding notes receivable from participants have defaulted, which are included in notes receivable from participants in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits. For financial statement presentation purposes, an outstanding defaulted note balance is considered a deemed distribution once a distributable event occurs, such as employment termination, death, or disability.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or installment payments as provided in the Plan Document. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. If a terminated participant's vested balance is less than or equal to \$5,000, the amount may be automatically distributed in the form of lump sum cash payment. In addition, the Plan allows for hardship distributions if certain criteria are met.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$7,377 and \$1,528 (compiled), respectively. Forfeitures of non-vested account balances are first used to pay Plan expenses and then to reduce the Company's contributions. During 2024, Employer contributions were reduced by \$3,360, from forfeited nonvested accounts, in accordance with Plan provisions.

2. Summary of Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the liquidation basis of accounting as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024. As of December 31, 2023, the financial statements of the Plan were prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. There are no significant differences between the accrual basis of accounting and the liquidation basis of accounting for this Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan Administrator and Board of Managers determine the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisers and Plan Trustee. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed as incurred.

Excess Contributions Payable

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRS are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan distributed the 2024 excess contributions of approximately \$9,000 to the applicable participants prior to March 15, 2025. There were no 2023 excess participant contributions.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. Fair Value Measurements

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation technique include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation technique are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation techniques used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the techniques used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Stable Value Fund: Valued on the basis of the relative interest of each participating investor in the fair value of the underlying assets of the Fund. The NAV, as provided by the investment account manager via the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

4. Information Certified by Trustee

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's ("DOL") Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2024. Accordingly, Reliance Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits and the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4(i) - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity and interest income on notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year then ended. This information has not been audited by the Plan's independent auditors.

5. Related-Party and Party In Interest Transactions

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Additionally, the Plan issues loans to participants, which are secured by the participant's account balances. These transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

6. Tax Status

The Plan adopted a pre-approved plan offered by ADP, LLC. The pre-approved plan received an IRS Opinion Letter dated October 6, 2020, stating that the Plan and related trust, as then designed, were in accordance with the applicable sections of the IRC. Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the IRS Opinion Letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and, therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

6. Tax Status (Continued)

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits.
