We have performed an audit of the financial statements of SACYR 401(k) Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). ### **NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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#### **NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the SACYR 401(K) (the “Plan”) provides only general information. More complete information regarding items such as employee and employer contributions, eligibility vesting and benefit provision may be found in the Plan agreement. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

#### **General**

The Plan is a 401(k) deferred compensation plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and is administered by the certifying entity appointed by management of SACYR Construction USA, LLC. (the “Company”).

#### **Eligibility**

To become eligible, participants must be employees of the Company and must be at least 21 years of age and complete six (6) months of service. The primary purpose of the Plan is to provide employees of the Company with financial benefits upon retirement.

#### **Contributions**

Participants may elect to make voluntary pre-tax contributions of annual compensation including regular salary and wages, overtime pay and commissions through payroll deductions. Such contributions are excluded from the participant’s taxable income for federal income tax purposes until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. All contributions are subject to certain limitations established by the Internal Revenue Service. The maximum pre-tax contribution was \$23,000 and \$22,500 for December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Additionally, if a participant has attained age 50, the participant is eligible to make an additional catch-up contribution. This age-50 catch-up contribution cannot exceed \$7,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Company will make a matching contribution if a participant has made an employee contribution during the plan year. The Plan provides for employer safe harbor matching contributions in order to maintain its “safe harbor” status under the Internal Revenue Code. Under the terms of the Plan, the Company makes a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of each participant’s elective salary deferrals that do not exceed 5% of the participant’s eligible compensation. These safe harbor matching contributions are fully vested at all times. Employer contributions are made in accordance with the requirements of the Plan document and applicable regulations.

#### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, allocations of the Company's contribution and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### **Investment Options**

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their contributions to be vested in one or more of the investment options available to the Plan.

### **NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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#### NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

##### **Vesting**

Participants are 100% vested in their accounts attributable to the following contributions:

- Salary deferrals including Roth 401(k) deferrals and "catch-up contributions"
- Safe harbor contributions
- "Rollover" contributions

A participant will also be 100% vested under any of the following circumstances:

- Death before retirement date.
- Disability before retirement date.
- Attainment of normal retirement age.
- Termination of the Plan.

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Participants may receive an amount equal to the value of their vested interest upon termination of employment, death, disability or retirement. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest as a lump sum distribution.

##### **Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

#### NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. In September 2009, the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") implemented the Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") which establishes FASB ASC as the source of authoritative U.S. accounting and reporting standards for nongovernmental entities. Presented below is a summary of significant accounting principles followed in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements.

##### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions to net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

##### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### **Plan Expenses**

Certain expenses to maintain the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the Company. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

##### **Income Taxes**

The Plan uses a prototype adoption agreement provided by the Plan certifying entity. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is a qualified trust under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan certifying entity has obtained a favorable tax determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service regarding the prototype adoption agreement and therefore believes it to be exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(a).

The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress, the plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

##### **Risk and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options. These investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of such investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for plan benefits and statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

##### **Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

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#### NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN’S CERTIFYING ENTITY

Certain information related to investments from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the certifying entity of the plan. The certifying entity for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company.

#### NOTE 4 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company is the certifying entity of the Plan and qualifies as a party-in-interest per Department of Labor guidelines. All fees and expenses of the Plan relating to legal, accounting, and other administrative services are paid by the Company.

#### NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan’s investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits.

ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs were used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

ASC 820 establishes a three-level valuation hierarchy for measurement and disclosure of fair value. The valuation hierarchy is based upon the transparency of inputs used to measure fair value. The three levels are as follows:

Level 1 – asset value is based on actual quoted prices in active markets for identical securities (mark-to-market).

Level 2 – other significant observable inputs are used to arrive at fair value (including yield, quality, coupon rate, maturity, issue type, quoted prices for similar securities, prepayment speeds, trading characteristics, etc.).

Level 3 – significant unobservable inputs (including management’s own assumptions in determining the fair value of investments).

*Registered Investment Companies/Mutual Funds:* Valued at the daily closing price reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed actively traded.

NOTE 6 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (Continued)

*Common/collective trusts:* Valued at the net asset value of units held by the Plan at year-end. The net asset value, as provided by the certifying entity, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The net asset value is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The Plan’s investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023 are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

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**NOTE 7 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS**

The Plan entered into fully a benefit-responsive investment contract with VOYA Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company's (VOYA). The contract meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the contract value of the fully benefit-responsive investment contract was \$14,961 and \$0, respectively. The average yield earned by this contract, based on actual earnings for the year ended December 31, 2024 was approximately 3%. The average yield earned by this contract, based on interest rate credited to participants was approximately 3% as of December 31, 2024. The guaranteed minimum interest rate for the life of the contract is 1%.

The traditional investment contract held by the plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than one percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

**NOTE 8 – CORRECTIVE CONTRIBUTIONS**

During 2024, the Company, through the availability of additional information, identified certain operational errors related to the deferral elections of certain participants. The operational errors are estimated to result in potentially incorrect contribution amounts deferred by participants and incorrect employer matching contributions. The Company is in the process of determining the effects of operational errors for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 for each of the related participants.

In order to avoid disqualification of the plan by the IRS, the plan intends to utilize the Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System (EPCRS) of the IRS. The Company has determined that the errors qualified for correction under the self-correction provisions of the EPCRS. The amount due to participants, including lost earnings, will be contributed to the Plan upon a final determination of the effects of the operational errors as a Company

### **NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

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#### **NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN**

The following description of the SACYR 401(K) (the “Plan”) provides only general information. More complete information regarding items such as employee and employer contributions, eligibility vesting and benefit provision may be found in the Plan agreement. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

#### **General**

The Plan is a 401(k) deferred compensation plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and is administered by the certifying entity appointed by management of SACYR Construction USA, LLC. (the “Company”).

#### **Eligibility**

To become eligible, participants must be employees of the Company and must be at least 21 years of age and complete six (6) months of service. The primary purpose of the Plan is to provide employees of the Company with financial benefits upon retirement.

#### **Contributions**

Participants may elect to make voluntary pre-tax contributions of annual compensation including regular salary and wages, overtime pay and commissions through payroll deductions. Such contributions are excluded from the participant’s taxable income for federal income tax purposes until received as a withdrawal or distribution from the Plan. All contributions are subject to certain limitations established by the Internal Revenue Service. The maximum pre-tax contribution was \$23,000 and \$22,500 for December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Additionally, if a participant has attained age 50, the participant is eligible to make an additional catch-up contribution. This age-50 catch-up contribution cannot exceed \$7,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

The Company will make a matching contribution if a participant has made an employee contribution during the plan year. The Plan provides for employer safe harbor matching contributions in order to maintain its “safe harbor” status under the Internal Revenue Code. Under the terms of the Plan, the Company makes a safe harbor matching contribution equal to 100% of each participant’s elective salary deferrals that do not exceed 5% of the participant’s eligible compensation. These safe harbor matching contributions are fully vested at all times. Employer contributions are made in accordance with the requirements of the Plan document and applicable regulations.

#### **Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution, allocations of the Company's contribution and Plan earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### **Investment Options**

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct their contributions to be vested in one or more of the investment options available to the Plan.

#### NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN (Continued)

##### **Vesting**

Participants are 100% vested in their accounts attributable to the following contributions:

- Salary deferrals including Roth 401(k) deferrals and "catch-up contributions"
- Safe harbor contributions
- "Rollover" contributions

A participant will also be 100% vested under any of the following circumstances:

- Death before retirement date.
- Disability before retirement date.
- Attainment of normal retirement age.
- Termination of the Plan.

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Participants may receive an amount equal to the value of their vested interest upon termination of employment, death, disability or retirement. On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest as a lump sum distribution.

##### **Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA.

#### NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

##### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. In September 2009, the Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") implemented the Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") which establishes FASB ASC as the source of authoritative U.S. accounting and reporting standards for nongovernmental entities. Presented below is a summary of significant accounting principles followed in the preparation of the accompanying financial statements.

##### **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions to net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

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#### **NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)**

##### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

##### **Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

##### **Plan Expenses**

Certain expenses to maintain the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the Company. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

##### **Income Taxes**

The Plan uses a prototype adoption agreement provided by the Plan certifying entity. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is a qualified trust under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Plan certifying entity has obtained a favorable tax determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service regarding the prototype adoption agreement and therefore believes it to be exempt from Federal income taxes under Section 501(a).

The plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC).

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress, the plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

##### **Risk and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options. These investments are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of such investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for plan benefits and statement of changes in net assets available for plan benefits.

##### **Subsequent Events**

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

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**NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE PLAN’S CERTIFYING ENTITY**

Certain information related to investments from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by the certifying entity of the plan. The certifying entity for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 was Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company.

**NOTE 4 – PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company is the certifying entity of the Plan and qualifies as a party-in-interest per Department of Labor guidelines. All fees and expenses of the Plan relating to legal, accounting, and other administrative services are paid by the Company.

**NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The Plan’s investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits.

ASC 820, *Fair Value Measurements*, establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs were used only when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs were not available.

ASC 820 establishes a three-level valuation hierarchy for measurement and disclosure of fair value. The valuation hierarchy is based upon the transparency of inputs used to measure fair value. The three levels are as follows:

Level 1 – asset value is based on actual quoted prices in active markets for identical securities (mark-to-market).

Level 2 – other significant observable inputs are used to arrive at fair value (including yield, quality, coupon rate, maturity, issue type, quoted prices for similar securities, prepayment speeds, trading characteristics, etc.).

Level 3 – significant unobservable inputs (including management’s own assumptions in determining the fair value of investments).

*Registered Investment Companies/Mutual Funds:* Valued at the daily closing price reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed actively traded.

*Common/collective trusts:* Valued at the net asset value of units held by the Plan at year-end. The net asset value, as provided by the certifying entity, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The net asset value is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. Participant transactions (purchased and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The Plan’s investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023 are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

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**NOTE 7 – FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE INVESTMENT CONTRACTS**

The Plan entered into fully a benefit-responsive investment contract with VOYA Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company's (VOYA). The contract meet the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the contract value of the fully benefit-responsive investment contract was \$14,961 and \$0, respectively. The average yield earned by this contract, based on actual earnings for the year ended December 31, 2024 was approximately 3%. The average yield earned by this contract, based on interest rate credited to participants was approximately 3% as of December 31, 2024. The guaranteed minimum interest rate for the life of the contract is 1%.

The traditional investment contract held by the plan is a guaranteed investment contract. The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than one percent. The crediting rate is reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting. The contract cannot be terminated before the scheduled maturity date. The Plan's ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments.

**NOTE 8 – CORRECTIVE CONTRIBUTIONS**

During 2024, the Company, through the availability of additional information, identified certain operational errors related to the deferral elections of certain participants. The operational errors are estimated to result in potentially incorrect contribution amounts deferred by participants and incorrect employer matching contributions. The Company is in the process of determining the effects of operational errors for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 for each of the related participants.

In order to avoid disqualification of the plan by the IRS, the plan intends to utilize the Employee Plans Compliance Resolution System (EPCRS) of the IRS. The Company has determined that the errors qualified for correction under the self-correction provisions of the EPCRS. The amount due to participants, including lost earnings, will be contributed to the Plan upon a final determination of the effects of the operational errors as a Company
