Note 1 - Plan Description

The following description of Portillo's Hot Dogs, LLC 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all full-time employees of Portillo's Hot Dogs, LLC (the "Company") who have completed three months of service and are age 21 or older. The Plan does not cover leased employees, nonresident aliens, temporary employees, and employees covered by certain collective bargaining agreements unless provided for under the provisions of the Plan. Effective August 1, 2024, employees who have attained the age requirement are eligible to participate in the Plan following two months of service. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Plan provides for employee salary 401(k) deferral contributions up to a maximum of 50 percent of annual compensation subject to maximum tax-deferred limitations established by the Internal Revenue Code. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions in addition to their regular deferral contributions. Participants may also make contributions to the Plan in the form of a rollover of funds from another qualified plan.

The employer may elect to make a discretionary matching contribution. In 2024, the match was equal to the lesser of \$2,500 or 50 percent of a participant's deferral up to 5 percent of annual compensation.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contributions and plan earnings and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses and plan losses. Allocations are based on participants' compensation or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investments of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100 percent vested in employee salary and rollover contributions and any income or loss thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts, plus actual earnings thereon, is based on years of service. Participants vest in contributions made by the Company 20 percent per year until they become fully vested after five years of service.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participants may borrow from their accounts a maximum of 50 percent of their account balances, not to exceed \$50,000. Notes receivable are collateralized by the participant's account balance and bear interest at a market rate.

Benefit Payments

Distributions are payable upon retirement, death, disability, or termination of employment in the form of a lump-sum amount equal to the vested balance of a participant's account. In-service distributions may be made from a participant's vested account at any time after the attainment of age 59½.

Participants may request that all or a portion of their accounts be distributed in the case of financial hardship, as defined in the plan document.

Note 1 - Plan Description (Continued)

Forfeitures

If a participant is not fully vested on his or her termination date, the nonvested amount of the account is forfeited. Forfeitures are used to reduce future employer contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited account balances totaled \$57,176 and \$30,489, respectively.

The Plan used \$0 of forfeitures for the year ended December 31, 2024 to reduce employer contributions.

Termination

While it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in the plan document and ERISA.

Upon termination of the Plan, participants become 100 percent vested in their account balances.

Party-in-interest Transactions

Fidelity Management Trust Company and Bank of America, N.A. and Merrill Lynch, Pierce, Fenner & Smith, Inc. Retirement Services (Merrill Lynch) provide custodial and record-keeping services to the Plan and, therefore, qualify as parties in interest. Certain employees of the Company provide administrative and trustee services to the Plan, and the Company is not reimbursed for their services from the Plan.

The Plan provides for loans to participants, which are party-in-interest transactions that are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded as earned. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Participant Notes Receivable

Participant notes receivable are recorded at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued interest. Participant notes receivable are written off when deemed uncollectible.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Various administrative costs are paid by the Company.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions and deductions during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Subsequent Events

The financial statements and related disclosures include evaluation of events up through and including October 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 3 - Certified Information

Effective August 1, 2024, the Plan changed its trustee from Bank of America, N.A. to Fidelity Management Trust Company (collectively, the "Trustees"). The Trustees of the Plan hold the Plan's investments and execute all related transactions. The investment and participant notes receivable balance and related income and losses included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of assets held at end of year are based solely on information provided by the Trustees.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Accounting standards require certain assets and liabilities be reported at fair value in the financial statements and provide a framework for establishing that fair value. The framework for determining fair value is based on a hierarchy that prioritizes the valuation techniques and inputs used to measure fair value.

Level 1

Fair values determined by Level 1 inputs use quoted prices in active markets for identical assets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2

Fair values determined by Level 2 inputs use other inputs that are observable, either directly or indirectly. These Level 2 inputs include quoted prices for similar assets in active markets, quoted prices for identical or similar assets in markets that are not active, and inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset.

Level 3

Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs, including inputs that are available in situations where there is little, if any, market activity for the related asset. These Level 3 fair value measurements are based primarily on management's own estimates using pricing models, discounted cash flow methodologies, or similar techniques taking into account the characteristics of the asset.

In instances where inputs used to measure fair value fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy, fair value measurements in their entirety are categorized based on the lowest level input that is significant to the valuation. The Plan's assessment of the significance of particular inputs to these fair value measurements requires judgment and considers factors specific to each asset.

The following valuation methodologies have been used to value the Plan's investments:

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are valued at quoted prices reported in active markets.

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements (Continued)

Common Collective Trust Fund

The common collective trust fund is valued at net asset value (NAV) per share or its equivalent of the fund, which is based on the fair value of the fund's underlying assets. There are no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

Money Market Fund

The fair value of these investments is based on their outstanding balances.

Section I - Internal Control Related Matters Identified in an Audit

In planning and performing our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit of the financial statements of Portillo's Hot Dogs, LLC 401(k) Plan as of and for the year ended December 31, 2024, we considered the Plan's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) other than those controls over investments and related investment activity. Our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit was performed in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America except, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, we did not perform any auditing procedures with respect to certified investment information except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We considered internal control as a basis for designing our procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses, and, therefore, material weaknesses or significant deficiencies may exist that were not identified. However, as discussed below, we identified a certain deficiency in internal control that we consider to be a significant deficiency.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent, or detect and correct, misstatements on a timely basis.

A material weakness is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the Plan's financial statements will not be prevented, or detected and corrected, on a timely basis.

A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance. We consider the following deficiency in the Plan's internal control to be a significant deficiency:

SOC-1 Report Review

During our audit, we noted plan sponsor staff do not review the SOC-1 reports for the third-party service providers. The plan sponsor places a great deal of reliance on the controls of its third-party vendors and, therefore, is required to monitor these third-party providers. We recommend that the plan sponsor review the SOC-1 reports on an annual basis to ensure that the applicable controls are operating effectively. We recommend that the plan sponsor follow up on any exceptions to control testing to determine if there has been any impact on the Plan. Furthermore, we recommend the plan sponsor ensure the applicable user controls identified in the SOC-1 reports are in place at the plan sponsor. The impact of not reviewing the SOC-1 reports is that the Plan's controls may not be appropriately adjusted to address controls not in place or not effective at the service providers; thus, controls may not be in place to detect or prevent material misstatement.

The following deficiency in internal control was also identified during our audit:

During our audit testing, we noted that eligibility for the true-up of employer discretionary matching contributions was not in accordance with the plan document as a result of the change in third-party administrators and, thus, the revised plan document. Management plans to correct such calculation for participants that were impacted. We recommend reviewing eligibility criteria in detail and implementing such criteria when reviewing eligibility for contributions.

Section II - Required Communications with Those Charged with Governance

Our Responsibility Under U.S. Generally Accepted Auditing Standards

As stated in our engagement letter dated July 15, 2025, we conducted our audit in accordance with professional standards except that, as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA and as instructed by you, we did not perform any auditing procedures with respect to certified investment information except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were audited by us in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP. The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, were subjected to tests of your accounting records and other procedures as we considered necessary to enable us to express an opinion as to whether they are presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Our audit of the financial statements does not relieve you or management of your responsibilities. As part of our audit, we considered the applicable internal controls of the Plan. Such considerations were solely for the purpose of determining our audit procedures and not to provide any assurance concerning such internal control.

We are responsible for communicating significant matters related to the audit that are, in our professional judgment, relevant to your responsibilities in overseeing the financial reporting process. However, we are not required to design procedures specifically to identify such matters.

Planned Scope and Timing of the Audit

We performed the audit according to the planned scope and timing previously communicated to you in our meeting about planning matters on July 15, 2025.

Significant Audit Findings

Qualitative Aspects of Accounting Practices

Management is responsible for the selection and use of appropriate accounting policies. In accordance with the terms of our engagement letter, we will advise management about the appropriateness of accounting policies and their application. The significant accounting policies used by the Plan are described in Note 2 to the financial statements. No new accounting policies were adopted, and the application of existing policies was not changed during 2024.

We noted no transactions entered into by the Plan during the year for which there is a lack of authoritative guidance or consensus.

We noted no significant transactions that have been recognized in the financial statements in a different period than when the transaction occurred.

Accounting estimates are an integral part of the financial statements prepared by management and are based on management's knowledge and experience about past and current events and assumptions about future events. Certain accounting estimates are particularly sensitive because of their significance to the financial statements and because of the possibility that future events affecting them may differ significantly from those expected. The most sensitive estimate affecting the financial statements was the Plan's valuation of investments.

Section II - Required Communications with Those Charged with Governance (Continued)

Management has informed us that, in determining the appropriateness of the estimate of investment values, they have recorded the fair values based on market values provided by the investment custodian, plus any applicable valuation adjustments. We performed no specific procedures related to the valuation of the investments due to the scope and nature of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit.

The disclosures in the financial statements are neutral, consistent, and clear.

Difficulties Encountered in Performing the Audit

We encountered no significant difficulties in performing and completing our audit.

Disagreements with Management

For the purpose of this letter, professional standards define a disagreement with management as a financial accounting, reporting, or auditing matter, whether or not resolved to our satisfaction, that could be significant to the financial statements or the auditor's report.

We are pleased to report that no such disagreements arose during the course of our audit.

Corrected and Uncorrected Misstatements

Professional standards require us to accumulate all known and likely misstatements identified during the audit, other than those that are trivial, and communicate them to the appropriate level of management.

We did not detect any misstatements as a result of audit procedures.

Significant Findings or Issues

We generally discuss a variety of matters, including the application of accounting principles and auditing standards and plans and strategies that may affect the risks of material misstatement, with management each year prior to our retention as the Plan's auditors. However, these discussions occurred in the normal course of our professional relationship, and our responses were not a condition of our retention.

Management Representations

We have requested certain representations from management that are included in the management representation letter dated October 8, 2025.

Form 5500 - Annual Return/Report of Employee Benefit Plan

Our responsibility for Form 5500 does not extend beyond the financial statements, and we do not express an opinion or any form of assurance on Form 5500. However, we read the Plan's Form 5500 filing, and nothing came to our attention that caused us to believe that such information, or its manner of presentation, is materially inconsistent with the information or manner of its presentation appearing in the financial statements.
