We have performed audits of the financial statements of Finastra USA Salary Savings 401(k) Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following brief description of the Finastra USA Salary Savings 401(k) Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General - Finastra USA Corporation (the Company) established the Plan on August 16, 2013. The Plan is subject to the applicable provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligibility - The Plan is a defined contribution retirement plan maintained for the benefit of all eligible employees of the Company, and its subsidiaries. Full-time employees are eligible to participate in the Plan after one hour of service except for those individuals who are leased employees, nonresident aliens, employees of an affiliate that is not a participating employer, or members of a collective bargaining unit for which participation has not been elected.

Contributions - Contributions consist of employee pretax elective deferrals, Roth elective deferrals, after-tax deferrals, and safe-harbor matching contributions. Employees may voluntarily contribute up to 100% of their compensation for the Plan year, limited to \$23,000 and \$22,500 in 2024 and 2023, respectively, as prescribed by the IRC. Participants aged 50 and over could elect to make additional catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500 in 2024 and 2023. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified retirement plans (rollover). The Company contributes a safe-harbor matching contribution to each eligible participant's account equal to 100% of the first 3% and 50% of the next 2% of a participant's compensation that the participant contributes to the Plan.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in all contributions and the earnings thereon.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company matching contributions, and an allocation of the Plan's earnings, and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Separate accounts are maintained for each participant by investment fund and type of contribution. Allocations are based on applicable account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and Company matching contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Participants may change their investment options daily.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 and up to a maximum of \$50,000 reduced by their highest outstanding loan balance over the last 12 months, or 50% of the value of their vested account balance. A participant may not request more than one loan per year and may only have one loan outstanding at a time. The loans are secured by the vested balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the *Wall Street Journal* prime rate, plus 2.00%. Interest rates on loans outstanding on December 31, 2024 ranged from 4.25% to 10.50%, and the notes mature through 2034. Loan terms range from up to five years for general loans, or up to 10 years for the purchase of a primary residence. Longer terms are allowed for loans transferred in from other plans that have existing terms in excess of 10 years. Principal and interest payments are collected through semi-monthly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits - Upon attainment of age 59½, termination of service, retirement, death, or disability, participants may receive a lump-sum distribution or installment payments as a form of benefit distribution. Participants with a vested account balance less than \$5,000 will receive a lump-sum distribution. Financial hardship withdrawals, as defined in the Plan document, are permitted up to the amount of a participant's elective salary deferrals.

Expenses - Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No employee of the Company receives compensation from the Plan. The Company pays a portion of the direct administration expenses of the Plan.

Fee Holding Account - Participants are charged a quarterly recordkeeping fee of up to \$31 per participant. These fees, which are accumulated and paid out of the Plan's fee holding account, are intended to cover administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Amounts collected from participants in excess of current year expenses are accumulated in the Plan and used to fund future administrative expenses. The amounts available to fund administrative expenses in subsequent plan years amounted to \$83,270 and \$70,316 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During 2024 and 2023, the Plan used \$105,131 and \$110,749, respectively, from the fee holding account to pay administrative expenses.

Forfeitures - Forfeited accounts amounted to \$97,712 and \$3,255 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited accounts generally are the result of Company matching contributions made to ineligible employees and include earnings thereon. The accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or fund administrative expenses. Administrative expenses were reduced by \$0 and \$56 respectively, from forfeited nonvested accounts in 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest income is recorded when earned. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

Contributions - Employer and participant contributions are accrued by the Plan in the year in which they are withheld from compensation or become obligations of the Company.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid. Accordingly, benefits payable to persons that have elected to withdraw from the Plan but are not yet paid at year-end have not been accrued. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, no payments were due to participants who had elected to withdraw from the Plan.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of Plan assets and liabilities, and changes therein during the reporting period, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Reclassifications and Restatement - Certain reclassifications have been made to the 2023 financial statements in order to conform to the 2024 presentation.

Additionally, subsequent to the issuance of the 2023 financial statements it was determined that the employer and employee contributions amounts were reversed in the statements of changes of net assets for the year ended December 31, 2023. Accordingly, these amounts have been restated in the accompanying financial statements.

Subsequent Events - The Plan's management has performed an evaluation of subsequent events through October 1, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Basis of Fair Value Measurement

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset; and
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Interest-bearing cash: The carrying amount is a reasonable estimate of fair value.

Self-directed brokerage accounts: Accounts primarily consisting of mutual funds, common stock and interest-bearing cash that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

Collective trust funds: Valued at the NAV of units held by the Plan at year end as reported by the investment managers. The fixed income common trust funds are comprised primarily of fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. The NAV provided by the trustee is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. Units in common collective trust funds are not publicly traded, but rather, are redeemable only by the issuer. The value of the Plan's investment in common trust funds represents the value of the Plan's interests in the overall value of the common trust fund. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal to ensure that securities liquidation will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There were no investments held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 that were valued using level 3 inputs.

NOTE 5 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

Upon termination, the Company may continue the Plan to pay benefits as they mature or liquidate and distribute the relevant portion of the Plan to a successor defined contribution plan, or in the absence of a successor plan, to the participants.

NOTE 6 – CONCENTRATIONS, RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Market risks include global events which could impact the value of investment securities, such as a pandemic or international conflict. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits. There was one investment that individually represented more than 10% of the investments held as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. See the Supplemental Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) for the complete listing of investments held as of that date.

NOTE 7 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan is an adoption of the Merrill Lynch Prototype Non-Standardized Pre-Approved Profit Sharing/Money Purchase/CODA Plan Document (Prototype Document). Merrill Lynch received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on June 30, 2020, in which the IRS stated that the Prototype Document, as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRS. The Plan has been amended since the date of the opinion letter; however, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income tax is included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however; there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 – PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS

During 2023, 2020, and 2018, elective deferrals and loan repayments from the employees' payroll in the aggregate amount of \$11,759, \$58,275 and \$585,624, respectively, were not remitted to the Plan within the appropriate time period required by the Department of Labor. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company is aware of the occurrences and is in the process of taking the appropriate steps to fully correct the occurrences.
