As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institutions).

Management has obtained certifications from the qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and the procedures performed as described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section:

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP); and
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by the qualified institutions agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by the institutions that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements* section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities, in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the *Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit* section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certifications, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter —Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of Schedule H, Line 4i – Schedule of Assets Held at End of Year as of December 31, 2024 is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN:

The following brief description of the Elim Christian Services Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Summary Plan Document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a 403(b) retirement plan established September 1, 1985, covering all eligible employees of Elim Christian Services (the Organization). Employees are eligible to make contributions upon hire. Employees who are 21 years old and have attained one year of service are eligible to receive employer matching contributions. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The retirement committee is responsible for oversight of the Plan, determines the Plan's investments offerings, and monitors investment performance with contracted advisory services from Portfolio Design Services.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Participants may make elective deferral contributions up to limits prescribed by law. Participants who have attained age 50 and/or have 15 years of service before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. Effective October 25, 2021, a Roth option was made available for employee contributions. The Organization made discretionary contributions to the Plan of a dollar for dollar match up to 4% of compensation for 2024.

Contributions are subject to certain limitations prescribed by law. Participants direct the investment of all contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and allocations of (a) the Organization's contribution and (b) Plan earnings; and charged with an allocation of investment expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

VESTING

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon as well as employer matching contributions and earnings thereon.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN, continued:

PLAN LOANS

Participants may borrow from TIAA a minimum of \$5,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. The loans, totaling \$5,900 and \$13,822 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively, are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates from 4.38% to 5.68%. The loans are not considered assets of the Plan and therefore are not included on the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts held by AdvisorTrust, Inc. a minimum \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account. The loan interest rate, determined quarterly, is set at 1% above the prime rate, as defined. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Upon termination of service, disability, or attaining age 65, participants with vested account balances greater than \$1,000 generally receive payments in the form of a lump sum, partial payment, installment payments or purchase of annuity contracts. Participants with vested account balances of \$1,000 or less will receive a single lump-sum payment. Participants may also withdraw amounts from employee deferrals and related earnings upon reaching age 59 1/2, or in the event of a hardship.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, continued:

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

Investments are reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements and Note 5 for a discussion on fully benefit-responsive investment contracts.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Organization. Expenses that are paid by the Organization are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative fees. Administrative fees also include plan servicing fees from the recordkeeper. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

RECLASSIFICATION

Certain amounts in the prior year financial statements and disclosures have been reclassified to conform to current year presentation.

3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE QUALIFIED INSTITUTIONS:

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America and College Retirement Equities Fund (TIAA-CREF) and AdvisorTrust, Inc., the qualified institutions of the Plan.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS:

The *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosure* topic of the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. Level 3 inputs are only used when Level 1 or Level 2 inputs are not available.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS, continued:

Mutual funds and some variable annuity contracts are primarily valued using market quotations or prices obtained from independent pricing sources. Some variable annuity contract funds are valued at fair value using fair value of other data values or market prices that are similar to these funds. Non-benefit-responsive fixed annuity contracts are reported at contract value, which represents fair value. The contract value equals the accumulated cash contributions and interest credited to the Plan's contracts, less any withdrawals. Crediting rates are a combination of a guaranteed rate and an annually established discretionary rate. Additionally, the discretionary rate applied to contributions received during a reporting period may vary from the discretionary rate applied to account balances at the end of the prior reporting period. The fair value of the pooled separate account units is principally derived from the market value of the underlying mutual funds, real estate holdings, or other real estate-related investments.

Interest-bearing cash is held at cost plus interest.

5. GUARANTEED INVESTMENT CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANY:

The Plan has fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contracts with TIAA. TIAA maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan.

Because the guaranteed investment contracts are fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the guaranteed investment contract. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by TIAA, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investments at December 31, 2024 and 2023, was \$103,815 and \$123,319, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer, but it may not be less than three percent. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that any events which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of occurring.

The guaranteed investment contracts do not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

6. PLAN TERMINATION:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Organization has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA.

7. TAX STATUS:

The Plan has adopted a Plan document sponsored by PCS Retirement. The Plan document has obtained an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) dated June 30, 2020, which states that the document satisfies the applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. However, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is operating in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code.

8. PARTIES-IN-INTEREST:

Direct fees of \$120,813 were paid to Portfolio Design Services by the Plan for the recordkeeping and investment management services for the year ended December 31, 2024. In addition, \$30,893 of direct fees were paid to other parties-in-interest for advisory services. Indirect fees are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES:

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

10. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS:

Subsequent events have been evaluated through October 7, 2025, which represents the date the financial statements were available to be issued. Subsequent events after that date have not been evaluated.
