Note 1—Description of the Plan

The following brief description of the Joseph Management Group 401(k) Retirement Savings Plan and Trust (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan established for the benefit of the employees of Pond Realty Company d/b/a Joseph Management (the "Plan Sponsor") and related entities who have elected to be a participating employer in the Plan (collectively, the "Company"). Employees become eligible to participate in the Plan on the first day of each quarter following completion of 3 months of service and attainment of age 21. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Administration – The Plan Sponsor has designated certain employees, who serve without additional compensation, to administer the Plan. The Plan administrator has the overall responsibility and authority as the named fiduciary to manage and control the operations and administration of the Plan and may designate one or more individuals to perform those responsibilities.

Contributions – Upon meeting eligibility requirements as defined in the Plan agreement, participants of the Plan are permitted to make pre-tax and after-tax Roth contributions to the Plan up to 100% of their annual eligible compensation. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Contributions are subject to certain limitations as outlined in the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

The Company may also make discretionary contributions to the Plan. For the 2024 Plan year, the Company made a discretionary matching contribution equal to the lesser of 25% of each eligible participant's contributions to the Plan (excluding catch up contributions) not exceeding 6% of compensation, or \$1,500. No additional contributions were made for the 2024 Plan year.

Participant Accounts – Individual accounts are maintained for each Plan participant. Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Company's profit-sharing contribution and Plan earnings, as applicable. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, specific transaction costs or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting – Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant becomes 100% vested after three years of credited service.

Investment Options – Upon enrollment in the Plan, participants may direct the investment of their accounts into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan also offers a self-directed brokerage account. Participants may change their investment options among those investments provided at any time during the Plan year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Participants are permitted to borrow from their individual fund balances. Participant loans can be for any purpose, classified as either a general purpose or residential purpose loan (as defined in the Plan agreement), and are limited to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of the vested portion of the participant's account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest is repaid ratably through payroll deductions.

Note 1—Description of the Plan (continued)

Payment of Benefits – Upon termination of service or attaining normal retirement age, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or periodic payments not exceeding the participant's life expectancy. In-service and hardship withdrawals are also allowed as defined in the Plan agreement.

Forfeited Accounts – The nonvested portion of former participants' accounts may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan or to reduce the amount of Company contributions. Forfeited accounts totaled \$33,956 and \$23,752 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. During the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, no forfeitures were used by the Plan.

Note 2—Summary of significant accounting policies

Basis of Presentation – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). U.S. GAAP defines fair value as the exchange price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the Plan year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan administrator deems the loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payments of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid. There were no benefit payments requested and not yet disbursed at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Administrative Expenses – Administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by the Company or Plan participants, as defined in the Plan agreement.

Corrective Distributions Payable – Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the IRC, and related earnings thereon, that are required to be refunded prior to December 31 of the subsequent year.

Investment Management Fees and Operating Expenses – Investment management fees and operating expenses charged to the Plan for certain investments are deducted from income earned on a daily basis and are not separately reflected. Consequently, management fees and operating expenses are reflected as a reduction of investment return for such investments.

Note 3—Information certified by the qualified institutions (unaudited)

The Plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America ("Empower Annuity") and Empower Trust Company, LLC, qualified institutions, have certified to the completeness and accuracy of the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule.

- Investments at fair value, investments at contract value, and notes receivable from participants as shown in the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- Net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants as shown in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) – Form 5500, Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i as of December 31, 2024.

At the request of the Plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditor did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and supplemental schedule.

Note 4—Fair value measurements

U.S. GAAP provides a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs to the valuation methodology include quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Note 4—Fair value measurements (continued)

The following are descriptions of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value, including the general classification of such assets pursuant to the valuation hierarchy. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are therefore classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

Self-Directed Brokerage Accounts – Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and corporate stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices and, therefore, classified within Level 1 of the valuation hierarchy.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5—Fully Benefit-responsive investment contract

The Plan has a fully Benefit-responsive traditional investment contract with Empower Annuity that invests contributions in the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund. Empower Annuity maintains the contributions in a general account. The general account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by Empower Annuity. Contract value is the relevant measurement attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all, or a portion, of their investment at contract value. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise.

Empower Annuity's determination of credited interest rates reflects a number of factors, including mortality and expense risks, interest rate guarantees, the investment income earned on invested assets and the amortization of any capital gains and/or losses realized on the sale of invested assets. A market value adjustment may apply to amounts withdrawn at the request of the contract holder.

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include the following: (i) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan) (ii) changes to Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions; or (iii) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator does not believe that the occurrence of any such event which would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants is probable.

Note 6—Related party and party-in-interest transactions

Certain administrative services are provided by the Company at no cost to the Plan and certain administrative costs incurred by the Plan are paid by the Company. The Plan has entered into various agreement with parties-in-interest. It invests in a guaranteed investment contract managed by Empower Annuity, the custodian of the Plan. These transactions as well as notes receivable from participants and related activity qualify as party--in-interest.

Note 7—Income tax status

The Internal Revenue Service ruled on November 11, 2022, that the non-standardized pre-approved plan of Empower Retirement LLC upon which the Plan is based, is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC.. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 8—Plan termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions and to terminate the Plan at any time, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 9—Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participant account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

Note 11—Late remittance of participant contributions

During the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, participant contributions totaling \$167,541 were not remitted to the Plan within the appropriate amount of time by the Company. These transactions constitute prohibited transactions as defined by ERISA. The Company remitted the withholdings during 2024 and will remit the lost earnings during 2025.

Note 12—Subsequent events

The Plan has evaluated all subsequent events through October 10, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued and has determined there are no subsequent events that require disclosure.
