Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the financial statements are issued or available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and, therefore, is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if, there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.

- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

Other Matter—Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA

The supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year) as of December 31, 2024, is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements but is supplementary information required by the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Such information is the responsibility of management and was derived from and relates directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements. The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audit of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

- The form and content of the supplemental schedule, other than the information in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, are presented, in all material respects, in conformity with the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.
- The information in the supplemental schedule related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of the Advisor360° 401(k) P/S Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Advisor360°, LLC (the “Company” or the “Sponsor”). The Plan was established on June 1, 2019. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”). The Plan was most recently amended effective February 3, 2025, to update the vesting schedule to allow participants to become 100% vested in employer contributions and discretionary nonelective contributions after completing one year of service.

An officer of the Company serves as the Plan Administrator (“Plan Administrator”) and Fidelity Management Trust Company (“Fidelity” or “Trustee”) is the Plan’s trustee. The Plan’s Retirement Plan Committee members are responsible for the oversight of the Plan, determining the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings, monitoring investment performance and reporting to the Company.

ELIGIBILITY

The Plan is a defined contribution plan that provides benefits defined for all eligible employees of the Company, as defined. Employees are automatically enrolled into the Plan at a 5% deferral rate and will enter the Plan 35 days after their date of hire. Employees who manually enroll are eligible immediately upon the next payroll period. The eligibility for an employer matching contribution follows the same eligibility requirements as employee contributions.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Participants may contribute up to 60% of pretax annual compensation and up to 10% of after-tax annual compensation to the Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) limitations and as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans (rollovers). The Company will contribute, at its discretion, a matching contribution equal to a percentage of the amount of the participant’s elective deferral. For the Plan year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 50% of the first 10% of base compensation that the participant contributed to the Plan. The IRS allows for “catch-up” contributions for participants who have reached age 50. The Sponsor may make a discretionary nonelective contribution; however, the Sponsor did not make such a contribution for 2024.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with participant-directed contributions, Company matching and discretionary nonelective contributions, if any, rollover contributions and allocations of Plan investment earnings and charged with withdrawals and allocations of Plan losses and administrative expenses. Allocations are based on each participant's proportionate share of earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

VESTING

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and rollover contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. A participant is 40% vested in the Company matching and discretionary nonelective contributions, if any, after two years and vests an additional 20% annually, becoming fully vested after five years of service.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

The Plan permits participants to borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum amount equal to the lesser of \$50,000 reduced by the participant's highest outstanding loan balance in the previous 12 months or 50% of their vested balance. Participants may have only two loans outstanding at any given time. Loan terms may not exceed five years unless used for the purchase of a primary residence, in which case the repayment period may not exceed 10 years. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates, as determined by the Plan Administrator. These rates range from 3.25% to 8.50% for loans outstanding as of December 31, 2024, and these loans mature through 2034. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

On termination of service, death, disability or retirement, participants may elect to receive the value of their accounts in the form of a lump sum equal to the value of the participant's vested amount in his or her account. Participants are allowed to take partial and installment withdrawals from their accounts. Distributions may also be made from the Plan in cases of financial hardship, as defined in the Plan document.

In addition, participants over age 59½ may withdraw all or a portion of their vested account balance while still employed. Participants over age 72 are required to receive minimum annual distributions, as required in the Plan document. Account balances less than \$5,000 at date of termination are paid in a lump sum upon termination.

Participants may apply for hardship withdrawal, as defined by the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"), to meet excessive medical or educational expenses, expenses incurred to purchase a new principal residence or to prevent the eviction from a principal residence. The Plan Administrator determines the existence of a hardship.

INVESTMENT OPTIONS

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct investment contributions, in 1% increments, in a variety of investment choices as more fully described in the Plan's literature. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

FORFEITURES

Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$123,528 and \$59,502 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Forfeited nonvested accounts are used to reduce Company contributions or pay administrative expenses. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were additional forfeitures of \$393,364 used to reduce Company contributions.

TRANSFERS FROM QUALIFIED PLAN

Transfers of participant-level assets between the Plan and the Commonwealth Financial Network 401(k) P/S Plan occur as the Company and Commonwealth Equity Services LLC ("CFN") are related parties due to common ownership. Transfers are recorded when a participant changes employment between CFN and the Company and are reflected on the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits in the Plan year incurred. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were no net transfers in/out of the Plan.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP") requires the Plan Administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes in net assets available for benefits and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (See Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements). The Plan's Retirement Plan Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

PAYMENTS OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

ADMINISTRATIVE FEES

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. Delinquent loans are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which participant compensation is earned.

SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY FIDELITY MANAGEMENT TRUST COMPANY

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NOTE 4 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under Financial Accounting Standards Board ("FASB") Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") 820 are described as follows:

LEVEL 1

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

LEVEL 2

Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

LEVEL 3

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

VALUATION METHODOLOGIES

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds and Money Market Fund

Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds and money market fund held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds and money market fund held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Self-Directed Brokerage

Fidelity Brokerage Link allows participants to invest in a wide array of securities. Traded securities consist of other fair value investments in the Fidelity Brokerage Link account and include common stocks, mutual funds, options and money market accounts and are determined by quoted active-market prices where available. These securities are categorized in Level 1 as they are actively traded and no valuation adjustments have been applied. Fidelity Brokerage Link assets represent less than 1% of the total fair value of Plan assets as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Common Collective Trust

This investment is valued based on the NAV of units of the collective investment trust. The NAV, as provided by the Trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based upon the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the Plan will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.

NOTE 5 – RELATED-PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of mutual funds managed by the Trustee and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Certain fees owed from the Plan for administrative services to the Trustee are paid by the Plan Sponsor. Income received from the trustee related to a revenue sharing arrangement totaled \$25,291 for the year ended December 31, 2024. This revenue is used to offset administrative expenses of the Plan. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Company for which no compensation is received from the Plan.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 - TAX STATUS

In their pre-approved plan letter dated June 30, 2020, the IRS determined that the non-standardized Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the IRC and, therefore, are tax- exempt.

The Plan has been amended since receiving the advisory letter. However, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the organization has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority.

The Plan Administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there are no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in a variety of investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, financial market risk and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

As of December 31, 2024, 16% of the Plan's assets are held in the Fidelity 500 Index Fund. As such, this is considered to be a concentration of credit risk.
