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Independent Auditors' Report

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN:

The following description of the Courtesy Automotive Group 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

GENERAL

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Courtesy Chevrolet, Courtesy Chevrolet Center, Courtesy Auto of Mesa, LLC, Courtesy Imports Auto of Mesa, LLC, Courtesy Auto of Scottsdale, LLC, Courtesy EV of Scottsdale, LLC, and Reigi Auto of Mesa, LLC (the "Company") who have 60 consecutive days of service and are age 18 or older. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The plan sponsor is responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Investment Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings, monitors investment performance and reports to the Plan's Board of Trustees.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Each year participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may elect to make Roth contributions with after-tax contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (roll-over). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Employer matching contributions are discretionary. During the year ended December 31, 2024 the Company made a \$461,773 matching contribution to the Plan. Employer profit sharing contributions are discretionary. No profit sharing contributions were made during the year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain IRS limitations.

PARTICIPANT ACCOUNTS

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and Company's matching contributions, as well as allocations of the Plan's earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN: (Continued)

VESTING

Participants of the Plan are vested immediately in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company's contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. A participant is also 100% vested upon retirement, disability or death if employed.

PAYMENTS OF BENEFITS

On termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement a participant may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or installments. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. If the vested balance in the terminated participant account is less than or equal to \$5,000, the balance will be automatically distributed.

In certain hardship situations, as described in the plan agreement, participants may withdraw part of their account balances while actively employed, but such withdrawals are limited to the amount dictated by the hardship. Participants' withdrawals are limited to deferred account balances and may not include any interest earned thereon.

FORFEITED ACCOUNTS

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$100,731 and \$73,431, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions or for administrative expenses. Also in 2024, expenses and employer contributions were reduced by \$66,240 from forfeited nonvested accounts.

2. SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

USE OF ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

INVESTMENT VALUATION AND INCOME RECOGNITION

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

CONTRIBUTIONS

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the Employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

NOTES RECEIVABLE FROM PARTICIPANTS

The Plan does not permit participant loans.

BENEFIT CLAIMS PAYABLE

Amounts payable to participants for contributions in excess of amounts allowed by the Internal Revenue Service are recorded as a liability with a corresponding reduction to contributions. The Plan had excess contributions of \$187 and \$186 in 2024 and 2023, respectively.

As of December 31, 2024, the Plan had \$341 in uncashed checks, which represent amounts distributed to participants but not yet cashed. The Plan monitors uncashed checks on an ongoing basis and reissues checks as necessary. In accordance with Plan policy, checks outstanding for more than 180 days are voided, and the funds are returned to the Plan.

PAYMENT OF BENEFITS

Benefits are recorded when paid.

EXPENSES

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 10, 2025, the date the financial statements were approved by management and were available to be issued.

3. INFORMATION PREPARED AND CERTIFIED BY CUSTODIAN:

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024; was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by John Hancock Life Insurance Company (the custodian of the Plan).

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS:

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to the access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Pooled separate accounts – Valued at the net asset value (NAV) of units of the pooled separate accounts. The NAV, as provided by the custodian, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

5. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS:

Certain plan investments are managed by John Hancock Life Insurance Company. John Hancock Life Insurance Company is the custodian and record keeper for the Plan, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions.

John Hancock Life Insurance Company provides certain administrative services to the Plan pursuant to a master plan services agreement between the Company and John Hancock Life Insurance Company. The Plan or plan sponsor may make payments to John Hancock Life Insurance Company for administrative expenses. Fees incurred and paid directly by the Plan for investment management services were \$293,081 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

6. PLAN TERMINATION:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

7. TAX STATUS:

The Company has adopted a volume submitter plan which is subject to a favorable tax opinion letter from the IRS. The letter dated June 7, 2021, states that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

8. PROHIBITED TRANSACTIONS:

During 2024 and 2023, the Company failed to remit to the Plan's custodian certain employee contributions totaling \$0 and \$219,328 respectively, within the period prescribed by Department of Labor regulations. Delays in remitting contributions to the custodian were due to administrative errors, and the Company has or will make contributions to the affected participants' accounts to compensate those participants for potential lost income due to the delays.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES:

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risk factors such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
