Opinion

Note 1. Description of Plan

The following description of the Orndorff & Spaid, Inc. Profit Sharing Plan (Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees (except certain groups described in the plan document) of Orndorff & Spaid, Inc. (Company) who have completed one year of service and have completed 1,000 hours of service during the first participating Plan year. To receive a profit-sharing contribution, the participant must have completed 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year and be employed on December 31 of the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

The Plan permits the Company to contribute to the Plan each year, at the discretion of the boards of directors. Contributions are subject to certain limitations. The Plan does not permit participants to contribute to the Plan. There were profit-sharing contributions of \$500,000 made in the 2025 Plan year which relate to the 2024 Plan year.

Investment Options

All Plan investments are trustee-directed.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with an allocation of (a) the Company's contributions, (b) distributions, (c) forfeitures of terminated participant's nonvested accounts, (d) Plan earnings (losses) and (e) administrative expenses. The Company's contributions and forfeitures are allocated based on participant-eligible compensation. Plan earnings (losses) and administrative expenses are allocated among the participants in the proportion that each participant's beginning account balance bears to the total, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's account.

Vesting

Vesting in the Company's contribution plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of service. A participant is 100% vested after six years of credited service. A participant is 0% vested for the first two years of service and 20% for each year of service after that.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate (quoted by *The Wall Street Journal* on the date of the note) plus 1%. The loans have maturity dates equal to or less than five years from the date of the loans, unless the purpose of the loan is to purchase their principal residence, in which instance the loan maturity date cannot exceed 15 years. No such loans to purchase a principal residence were outstanding at December 31, 2024 and 2023. At December 31, 2024, outstanding loans bore interest rates ranging from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures of Company contributions are reallocated to participants in the same manner as profit-sharing contributions. During 2024, the Plan reallocated forfeitures of \$26,407. The forfeiture balance as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 was \$0.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service and after incurring a break-in-service (more than 500 hours in a Plan year), or upon death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or an annuity.

Retirement and Payment Options

The Plan's normal retirement date is the later of (i) attainment of age of 59½ or (ii) the fifth anniversary of the commencement of Plan participation. If participants delay retirement past the attainment of age of 59½, withdrawals from the Plan are also delayed until the participant retires, unless the participant qualifies for an in-service withdrawal as noted below.

In-Service Withdrawals

The Plan permits annual in-service withdrawals of vested plan accounts, up to a current limit of 25% of the vested amount in any plan year. Participants who have either attained the age of 59½ and have participated in the Plan for at least six years or who have been employed by the Company for at least 20 years, regardless of age, are permitted to make these withdrawals.

Subsequent Events

In preparing these financial statements, the Plan has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through June 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Note 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP").

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of net assets available for benefits and changes therein. Actual results could differ from those estimates and assumptions.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income from notes receivable from participants is accrued. Other interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant loans are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan documents. Certain administrative functions are performed by employees of the Company. No such employee receives compensation from the Plan. Expenses relating to specific participant transactions (notes receivable from participants and distributions) are charged directly to the participant's account.

Note 3. Fair Value Measurements

Fair value as defined under GAAP is an exit price, representing the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. GAAP establishes a three-tier fair value hierarchy, which prioritizes the inputs used in measuring fair value. These tiers include:

- Level 1** Observable inputs such as quoted prices in active markets.
- Level 2** Inputs other than quoted prices in active markets that are either directly or indirectly observable.
- Level 3** Unobservable inputs about which little or no market data exists, therefore, requiring an entity to develop its own assumptions.

Assets and liabilities are classified in their entirety based on the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The Plan's assessment of the significance of a particular input to the fair value measurement requires judgment and may affect the valuation of fair value assets and liabilities and their placement within the fair value hierarchy levels.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023. The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Mutual Funds

Mutual funds are publicly traded investments and are valued daily at the closing price reported on the active market on which the funds are traded.

Common Stock

Common stocks are valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded.

Corporate Bonds

Corporate bonds are publicly traded investments and are valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the bonds are traded.

Investments in LLC

The Plan invests in investment partnerships for which quoted prices are not available in active markets for identical instruments. The Plan utilizes the net asset value (NAV) per share, as determined by the managing member, as the estimated fair value. Because quoted prices in active markets for identical assets are not available, these prices are determined using observable market information such as quotes from less active markets and/or quoted prices in securities with similar characteristics.

Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 4. Exempt Party-in-Interest Transactions

The Plan's assets were invested in funds managed by various investment custodians who made investment decisions on behalf of the trustee. The Plan paid \$101,880 to these custodians during 2024 for these services. These are not deemed to be party in interest transactions.

Note 5. Plan Termination

Although the Company has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

Note 6. Tax Status

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the Company by letter dated October 19, 2022, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with the applicable regulations of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). The Plan administrator therefore believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable provisions of the IRC. Also, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan was qualified and the related trust was tax-exempt as of the financial statement date.

GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the Internal Revenue Service. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

Note 7. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, credit, and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
