NOTE 1 - PLAN DESCRIPTION

The following description of the Moody.Nolan, Inc. 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Moody.Nolan, Inc. (the Company or Plan Administrator) who are age 21 or older. An employee may participate in the Plan as of the first day of the quarter following the date on which the employee completes the eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the ERISA. The Plan Administrator is responsible for the oversight of the Plan and determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investments offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions

Each year, eligible participants may contribute pre-tax 401(k) deferrals up to a portion of their eligible compensation, not to exceed the maximum allowable under the Internal Revenue Code of annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make additional catch-up contributions. Participants may contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). Participants may also contribute Roth elective deferrals on an after-tax basis in lieu of pretax salary deferrals that participants are otherwise eligible to make under the Plan. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

The Company, under safe harbor provisions, is required to make matching contributions at 50% of employee deferrals up to 3% of eligible wages for the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Company may make additional discretionary matching and profit sharing contributions to the Plan based on participant's hours worked during the Plan year. During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company made no additional discretionary matching or profit sharing contributions to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and allocations of the Company's contributions and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account balance.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000, subject to certain limitations, or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at rates that are equal to the prime interest rate as published on the 14th day of each month, plus one percent (1%). Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions, unless the loan was used to acquire a principal residence.

Vesting

Participant and employer contributions are fully vested immediately.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, a participant may elect to receive either a lump sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or an annuity. For termination of service for other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump sum distribution. Participants can also request hardship withdrawals for certain expenses as defined by the Plan.

Forfeited Accounts

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$7,986 and \$2,421, respectively. Forfeiture accounts may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or to reduce future Company contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$0 and \$0, respectively, from forfeited non-vested accounts was used to pay Plan expenses.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule of the Plan have been prepared in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Certain additions to net assets and related assets are recognized when received rather than when earned and certain deductions are recognized when paid rather than when incurred. Investments are recorded at fair market value, other than those reported at contract value.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements (modified cash basis) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements. Mutual funds are valued at the NAV of shares held by the Plan at year-end. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded when received. Dividends are recorded when paid. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

In accordance with Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 962-325, "*Fully Benefit – Responsive Investment Contracts*", the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund holds deposit interests in Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America ("Empower", formerly Great-West Life & Annuity Insurance Company) which is a guaranteed interest account. ASC 962-325 requires that investment contracts held by a defined-contribution plan be reported at fair market value. However, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined-contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. The fully benefit-responsive investment contract is stated at contract value which approximates fair value.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan paid administrative expenses of \$104,748 and \$33,425 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Certain professional fees for the administration and audit of the Plan are paid by the Company on behalf of the Plan. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Asset management fees are reported within net appreciation in fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Generally accepted accounting principles establishes a framework for measuring fair value. The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

- Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 inputs must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the SEC. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Common collective trust funds: Common collective trust funds ("CCTs") are privately managed through investment companies and are not publicly quoted. CCTs are comprised, primarily, of shares of registered investment companies held through sub-accounts of an insurance company. The CCTs are valued using NAV as a practical expedient to estimate fair value where NAV is based on the value of the underlying investment assets held through sub-accounts of a separate account of an investment company. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the account will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. The Plan has concluded that the NAVs reported by the investment companies approximate the fair value of the investments. There are currently no redemption restrictions or unfunded commitments on these investments.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

NOTE 4 - INVESTMENT IN FULLY BENEFIT-RESPONSIVE CONTRACT

The Plan contains a benefit-responsive investment contract with Empower (Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund). Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The contract is included in the financial statements at contract value as reported to the Plan by Empower. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value. The issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, fair value approximates the contract value of the Plan's investment.

The contract has no stated maturity date. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The contract value of the investment contract was \$787,189 and \$1,842,737, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. The crediting interest rate is based on a formula agreed upon with the issuer. The minimum rate was 1.41% and 1.23% for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Such interest rates are reviewed on a quarterly basis for resetting.

The repayment of principal and interest credited to participants holding the investments is a financial obligation of Empower. However, if an event should ever occur such that realization of full contract value for a particular investment contract is no longer probable, for example, a significant decline in the creditworthiness of Empower, the Key Guaranteed Portfolio Fund investment choice will no longer be considered fully benefit-responsive. The occurrence of an event that limits the ability of the investment to transact at contract value with Empower and participants holding the investment, is not probable.

NOTE 5 - RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTION

The Plan does not consider Company contributions to the Plan to be party-in-interest transactions. The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan for which no fees are charged.

Certain Plan investments are held in common collective trust funds managed by entities related to Empower Corporation. Empower Corporation provided investment management services to the Plan ending December 31, 2024, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Notes receivable from participants and the related interest income are considered party-in-interest transactions.

NOTE 6 - PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intention to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue contributions at any time and terminate the Plan subject to the provisions set forth in ERISA. In the event of plan termination, the accrued benefits in each participant's account are distributable by the trustees as soon as reasonably possible.

NOTE 8 - TAX STATUS

The Company adopted a Volume Submitter 401(k) Plan with CODA, which received its latest favorable opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service on June 30, 2020. The opinion letter stated that the Plan is designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code.

Internal Revenue Service guidelines allow adopting employers of a volume submitter plan to rely on a favorable opinion for qualification requirements without requesting a separate determination letter if the following three requirements are met: 1) the employer's plan is identical to an approved prototype plan, 2) the employer has chosen only the options permitted under the terms of the approved plan, and 3) the employer has followed the terms of the plan.

Management believes the Plan has met the three guidelines stated above and intends to continue following the provisions of the prototype plan. Thus, the Company has not requested a separate determination letter for the Plan. The Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is currently designed and being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require management of an organization to evaluate tax positions taken by the Company and recognize a tax liability if the organization has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan, and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no uncertain positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability or disclosure in the financial statements. There are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 9 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the Statement of Net Assets Available for Benefits (Modified Cash Basis).
