For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

**Note 1: Description of Plan**

The following description of the Bedford Reinforced Plastics, Inc. 401(k) Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for more complete information.

**General**

The Plan is a non-standardized defined contribution 401(k) plan covering those employees of Bedford Reinforced Plastics, Inc. that meet the eligibility requirements as stated in the Plan. To be eligible, an employee must have attained the age of 21 and completed 1,000 hours of service within the computation period.

**Contributions**

The Plan permits employee salary deferral contributions of 2% to 100% of their compensation up to the Internal Revenue Service determined annual limits plus any catch up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or contribution plans. The participants direct the contribution of monies allocated on their behalf into one or more separate investment funds.

The Plan provides for employer matching contributions up to a maximum of 6% of compensation as determined annually by the employer. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the employer matched 55% of qualifying deferrals. The employer may also make a discretionary contribution at the end of the plan year. There were no discretionary contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's voluntary contribution plus an allocation of plan earnings and realized and unrealized investment gains and losses. Allocations are based on participant account balances. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Investment Options**

The Plan is entirely participant-directed and, as such, upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant may direct employee and employer contributions in any investment option offered in the Plan. Participants may change their investment options at any time.

**Vesting**

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and investment earnings thereon. A participant is fully vested in employer contributions and investment earnings thereon after three years of credited service.

**Note Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 to a maximum of 50% of their vested balance or \$50,000. Loan terms are for a maximum of five years and bear interest at prime plus 2%. Interest received on participant notes for the year ended December 31, 2024 totaled \$11,251.

**Benefits**

On termination of service due to death or retirement, a participant receives a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account unless another form of payment is elected. For termination of service due to disability and other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Amounts allocated to withdrawing participants are recorded on the Schedule H of Form 5500 for benefit claims that have been processed and approved for payment prior to December 31, 2024 but not yet paid as of that date.

**Forfeited Accounts**

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$218 and \$6,162, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions. During 2024, employer contributions were reduced by the forfeited nonvested accounts in the amount of \$12,022.

**Secure Act and Secure Act 2.0**

The Plan is currently working with their third party administrator to ensure compliance and any required plan changes are made to comply with the Secure Act and the Secure Act 2.0.

**Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes Receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are charged directly to the borrowing participant's account and are included in administrative expenses when incurred. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, no allowance for credit losses has been recorded. If a participant does not make a loan repayment and the plan administrator considers the participant loan to be in default, the loan balance is reduced, and the delinquent participant note receivable is recorded as a benefit payment based on the terms of the Plan document.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP") requires management to make estimates and assumptions. Such estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

**Payment of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Nonvested accounts of terminated participants included in investment balances as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$204,579 and \$51,747, respectively, as reported on Form 8955-SSA.

**Investments Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Administrative Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are, therefore, excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net realized and unrealized appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

**Subsequent Events**

In preparing these financial statements, management has evaluated events and transactions for recognition or disclosure through \_\_\_\_\_, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

**Note 3: Tax Status**

The Company adopted a nonstandardized form of a prototype plan sponsored by Capital Group Retirement Plan Services. The prototype plan has received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the National Office of the Internal Revenue Service as to the prototype plan's qualified status. The prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. The Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, however, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. The Plan is exempt from federal and state income taxes under current regulations.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan. Management evaluated the Plan's tax positions and concluded that the Plan had maintained its tax-exempt status and had taken no uncertain tax positions that require recognition or disclosure in the financial statements. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the financial statements. With few exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. Federal, state, or local tax authorities for years before 2021.

**Note 4: Plan Termination**

Although there has not been any expressed intent to do so, Bedford Reinforced Plastics, Inc. has the right at any time to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan termination, amounts credited to a participant's account will become fully vested and nonforfeitable. Upon complete termination, assets of the Plan are to be distributed to the participants.

**Note 5: Information Prepared and Certified by the Trustee (Unaudited)**

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA for 2024 and 2023. Accordingly, Capital Bank and Trust Company, the trustee of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments and notes receivable from participants reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the supplemental Schedule H, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, and the related investment activity including interest on notes receivables from participants reported in the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.

**Note 6: Fair Value Measurement**

The Plan measures on a recurring basis its investments at fair value in accordance with FASB Codification, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, which provides the framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides fair value hierarchy used to classify the inputs used in measuring fair value. That hierarchy prioritizes the inputs used in determining valuations into three levels. The levels of fair value hierarchy are as follows:

**Level 1**

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices in active markets that are accessible to the Plan for identical assets. These generally provide the most reliable evidence and are used to measure fair value whenever available.

**Level 2**

Inputs to the valuation methodology include significant inputs, other than Level 1 inputs, that are observable either directly or indirectly for substantially the full term of the asset through corroboration with observable market data. Level 2 inputs included quoted market prices in active markets for similar assets, quoted market prices in markets that are not active for identical or similar assets, and other observable inputs.

**Level 3**

Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable inputs and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan's investments consist of a money market and mutual funds. Both money market and mutual funds are valued at unadjusted quoted net asset values of shares held by the plan at year end.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following table sets forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. There have been no changes in the methodologies used or level designations as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

**Note 7: Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan provides for various investment options. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit. Due to the level of risk associated with investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

**Note 8: Related Party and Party-In-Interest Transactions**

Certain plans investments are proprietary funds and managed by the Plan's third-party administrator, and therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in interest transactions.

Certain administrative functions of the Plan are performed by officers or employees of the Company. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan.

Fees paid by the Plan amounted to \$3,075 for the year ended December 31, 2024.
