INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Trustees
ATL Hawks LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the financial statements of the ATL Hawks LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024 and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024 and 2023

Note 1 - Description of plan:

The following description of the ATL Hawks LLC 401(k) Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan Sponsor is Atlanta Hawks LLC (the Company, Plan Sponsor, Plan Administrator). The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of the Company who have completed three months of service as defined in the Plan document and have attained age 19. On August 1, 2023, the Plan was amended to establish a one year service requirement for matching contributions for employees hired on or after August 1, 2023. The Plan excludes bargaining, part-time, temporary and seasonal employees from participating in the Plan until the employee works 1,000 hours of service in a 12-month period. Individuals employed as a head coach, assistant coach, head trainer, or an employee who is participating in any other qualified plan of the NBA are not eligible to participate in the Plan. Employees are permitted to enter the Plan at any date upon attaining eligibility requirements. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute from 2% to 100% of pre-tax or after-tax (ROTH) compensation, as defined in the Plan document. Participants who are 50 years and older are eligible to make catch-up contributions subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limits. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans. The Company makes a matching contribution of 50% of the first 6% of eligible compensation that a participant contributes to the Plan. The Company may also make discretionary profit sharing contributions and discretionary additional matching contributions. The Company did not fund discretionary profit sharing contributions for 2024. The Company made a discretionary additional matching contributions, totaling \$149,623, for 2024.

The Plan includes an auto-enrollment feature. Unless an eligible employee affirmatively makes a separate election, the employee is enrolled at a deferral contribution equal to 6% of compensation on his or her eligibility date, and the deferral contribution is increased by 1% of compensation, annually, on January 1, up to a maximum automatic deferral contribution of 15% of compensation. A participant may direct contributions in 1% increments to any of the Plan's investment options.

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company discovered errors in previous years' employer match contributions and made qualified non-elective contributions of \$223,019.

Note 1 - Description of plan - continued:

Participant accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, the matching contribution, discretionary additional matching, an allocation of the Company's profit sharing contribution, and Plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined by the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in all employer contributions and earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service, as defined by the Plan document. The participants begin vesting in all employer contributions at a rate of 25% per year upon completion of their second year of service. A participant is 100% vested after five years of service.

Participants are immediately vested upon termination of the Plan, upon reaching the normal retirement age of 65, or upon reaching the early retirement age of 55 who have completed five years of service. Participants are immediately vested in the case of disability or death while an employee of the Plan Sponsor.

Payment of benefits

A participant is entitled to withdraw all or part of his or her vested account balance upon attainment of age 65 (normal retirement age), upon reaching the early retirement age of 55 who have completed five years of service, termination of service, disability, or death. Upon attainment of age 59½, a participant may elect to withdraw all or part of his or her vested account balance while the participant is still employed by the Company. A participant may also request a withdrawal from the Plan while still under the employment of the Company for reasons of rollover or financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals are limited to the amount required to meet the immediate and heavy financial need of the participant.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures may be used to restore previously forfeited amounts to participant's accounts, to pay administrative expenses or to reduce all employer contributions, as defined by the Plan. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$451 and \$9, respectively. During the year ended December 31, 2024, \$265,668 of forfeitures were used to reduce employer matching contributions.

Note 1 - Description of plan - continued:

Notes receivable from participants

Participants may borrow from the Plan in any amount greater than \$1,000 up to 50% of the participant's vested account balance, not to exceed \$50,000, reduced by the highest outstanding note balance, if any during the one year period ending on the day before the note is made. Note terms are for a period not exceeding five years unless for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the note repayment period may not extend beyond 30 years. Notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at an agreed upon percentage based on prevailing market rates. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deduction in most cases. Participants are allowed up to two outstanding notes.

Administrative expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. The Company reserves the right to elect to pay, or have the Plan pay, administrative costs in the future. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Note 2 - Summary of significant accounting policies:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Note 2 - Summary of significant accounting policies - continued:

Common/collective trust

Investments in the common/collective trust (CCT) are required to be reported at fair value. The CCT is composed primarily of investment contracts held by the fund's custodian that are fully benefit-responsive at the fund level. These contracts are not considered fully benefit-responsive to the Plan as the underlying contracts are not direct investments between the Plan and the issuer. The Plan has elected to value the CCT using net asset value (NAV) as the practical expedient to determine fair value.

Investment valuation and income recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and Principal Life Insurance Company (Principal).

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is accrued when earned. Dividend income is recorded on the ex-dividend date.

Payment of benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Notes receivable from participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance

for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make note repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant note to be in default, the participant note balance is reduced and a benefit payment is recorded.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate risk, market risk, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits.

Recent accounting pronouncements

The AICPA Financial Reporting Executive Committee (FinREC) approved enhanceive accounting updates related to accounting for revenue sharing arrangements in accordance with Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) ASC No. 606, Revenue from Contracts with Customers. Revenue sharing amounts are not considered revenue under ASC No. 606 due to the fact that they are intended to reduce administrative costs for the plan and not paid to the plan for delivering or producing goods, rendering services or undertaking other activities for the investment manager. A plan should consider all relevant facts and circumstances, including the terms of the agreement to determine the appropriate presentation of revenue sharing amounts. The presentation should be applied on a consistent basis and the plan should consider whether the presentation of revenue sharing amounts is a significant accounting policy that should be disclosed in the notes to the financial statements. If significant, the notes to the financial statements include a description of revenue sharing arrangements including how such arrangements are presented in the financial statements. The adoption did not have a material impact to the Plan's financial statements.

Recent legislative developments

In The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022. This legislation includes a vast array of provisional changes to retirement plans, becoming effective in 2023 and beyond. Plan management adopted mandatory provisions effective for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Plan management continues to evaluate the impact of the optional provisions of SECURE 2.0 and awaiting additional regulatory guidance from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and Department of Labor. The application of SECURE 2.0 Act did not have a material effect on the Plan's financial statements for the plan years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan Sponsor operationally implemented various changes and timely amended the Plan in accordance with IRS guidelines.

Subsequent events

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through September 29, 2025, which is the date these financial statements were available to be issued. All subsequent events, if any, requiring recognition as of December 31, 2024, have been incorporated into these financial statements.

Note 3 - Investments and information certified by Principal:

Principal is the trustee for the Plan. Principal holds the Plan's investment assets and executes investment transactions. Management has determined that Principal is a qualified institution and the information prepared and certified by Principal meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the Plan Administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Principal.

Note 4 - Fair value measurements:

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Note 4 - Fair value measurements - continued:

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets and liabilities measured at fair value. There have been no significant changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Shares of registered investment companies are valued at year end by obtaining quoted market prices on nationally recognized securities exchanges.
- Units of participation in the pooled separate accounts are valued using the NAV of the underlying investments in the fund, provided by the fund's custodian as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient would not be used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV.
- Units of participation in the CCT are based on the fair value of the contractual terms of the underlying assets/investment contracts. The CCT's are priced daily. The price is calculated based on the contract value which is based on the specific provisions of the contract, and at the Plan level is reported at fair value, as determined by the trustee. A daily mil-rate is provided for income accretion. The daily mil-rate is a blend of the contracts' rate of return and the liquidity component's daily mil-rate. The contracts' rate of return is typically reset on a quarterly basis.

The methodologies described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Note 5 - Related party transactions:

The Plan invests in shares of registered investment companies, pooled separate accounts, and a common/collective trust fund managed by an affiliate of Principal. Transactions in such investments qualify as party-in-interest transactions and are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

Note 6 - Plan termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

Note 7 - Income tax status:

Effective July 1, 2022, the Plan adopted a non-standardized pre-approved plan that has received an opinion letter from the IRS dated June 30, 2020 stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the IRC and; therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The Plan Administrator has determined that it is eligible to and has chosen to rely on the current IRS non-standardized pre-approved plan opinion letter. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the IRC to maintain its qualification. The Plan Administrator believes the Plan is being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and; therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax-exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
