Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Colliers Engineering & Design, Inc. 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 - Description of Plan:

The following description of Colliers Engineering & Design, Inc. (the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor”) 401(k) Savings and Retirement Plan (the “Plan”) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). All employees are eligible other than non-benefit eligible employees, leased employees, bona fide residents of Puerto Rico, and interns.

Plan Administration - The Plan is administered by the Plan Sponsor. The Plan’s assets are held by Empower Annuity Insurance Company (the “Trustee”), who is responsible for the custody and management of the Plan’s assets.

Eligibility - Eligible employees hired on or after April 1, 2023 shall become participants eligible for elective deferrals, employer discretionary matching contributions, and employer nonelective contributions, and enter the Plan immediately upon meeting the eligibility requirements. Previously, an employee would become eligible to participate immediately and enter the Plan on the first day of each month upon meeting the eligibility requirements.

Contributions - Eligible participants may elect to contribute a portion of their compensation to the Plan, subject to the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”) limitations for 401(k) plans. Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. All new eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan, upon meeting the eligibility criteria as defined. These employees will automatically be enrolled at a default percentage of 3% unless they opt out or elect to change the default deferral percentage.

Employer Contributions - The Company may make discretionary matching contributions to the Plan in which all eligible employees will receive a portion of the Company’s contribution, of which the percentage is determined by the Company each year. The Company’s matching contribution was 50% and was limited to 6% of the participant’s eligible compensation. The Company may also make discretionary nonelective contributions to the Plan which are allocated to participant accounts based upon participants’ eligible compensation as compared to all participants’ eligible compensation. Employees must be employed on the last day of the Plan year in order to receive the discretionary nonelective contribution. The Company did not make a discretionary nonelective contribution to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Participant Accounts - Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocation of (a) the Company’s contribution, if any, (b) Plan earnings, and (c) charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

Vesting - Participants who become eligible to participate in the Plan are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the Company’s discretionary contribution portion of their accounts plus actual earnings thereon is based on years of continuous service. Company contributions vest in accordance with the following schedule:

Payment of Benefits - On termination of service due to death, disability, retirement, hardship or other reason a participant or its beneficiary with a vested balance greater than \$5,000 may elect to receive either a lump-sum or equal monthly installments over a reasonable time. A participant with a vested balance of less than \$5,000 will receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account as a lump-sum distribution.

Forfeitures - Forfeitures are created when participants terminate employment before becoming entitled to their full benefits under the Plan. Forfeitures can be used to reduce Plan administrative expenses and employer discretionary nonelective and matching contributions. Forfeitures used to reduce employer contributions will be allocated to the individual accounts of Plan participants based on a specific allocation method as defined in the Plan document. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$268,494 and \$36,699, respectively. Forfeitures totaling approximately \$281,470 were used in 2024 to reduce the employer's discretionary contributions to the Plan and \$153,653 were used to offset Plan expenses.

Note 2 - Summary of Accounting Policies:

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment contracts held by defined contribution plans are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for the portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan's management to use estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to and deductions in net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results, as determined at a later date, could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, Trustee and insurance companies. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants - Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the Plan Administrator deems the participant loan to be in default, the participant loan balance is reduced, and benefit payment is recorded.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. For the year ended December 31, 2024, fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Benefit Payments - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Hardship Withdrawals - The Plan provides for hardship withdrawals from participants' vested balances, not to exceed an amount required to meet an immediate need created by the hardship, and then only to the extent that such immediate need cannot be satisfied by other sources reasonably available to the participant. Permissible circumstances for hardship withdrawals include medical expenses, purchase of a home, tuition payments, amounts necessary to prevent eviction from the participants' personal residence, and such other circumstances as the Plan Administrator may determine in accordance with Internal Revenue Service rules and regulations.

Note 3 - Certified Investment Information:

The Plan Administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosures under ERISA. Accordingly, the Trustee of the Plan, a qualified institution, has certified that the following investment information included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- a) Investments, as shown in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.
- b) Investment income, as shown in the Statement of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024.
- c) Investment information included in Schedule H, Part IV, Line 4i - Schedule of Assets (Held at End of Year) as of December 31, 2024, as shown on the ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

At the request of the Plan Administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this certified information, except for comparing such certified investment information to the related investment information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

Note 4 - Fair Value Measurements:

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures FASB ASC 820, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under FASB ASC 820 are described as follows:

- *Level 1* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

- *Level 2* - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:
 - Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
 - Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
 - Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
 - Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

- *Level 3* - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- *Mutual funds* - Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the U.S Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

- *Pooled separate accounts* - Valued at their "accumulation unit value" (AUV). The separate accounts are valued daily as the number of accumulation units held multiplied by the AUV. See Note 5.

The preceding methods may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Transfers Between Levels

The availability of observable market data is monitored to assess the appropriate classification of financial instruments within the fair value hierarchy. Changes in economic conditions or model-based valuation techniques may require the transfer of financial instruments from one fair value level to another. In such instances, the transfer is reported at the beginning of the reporting period. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, there were no significant transfers in or out of Levels 1, 2, or 3.

Note 5 - Pooled Insurance Contract with Insurance Company:

The Plan entered into pooled investment contracts with the Trustee. The Trustee maintains the contributions in a pooled account. The pooled account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for Plan withdrawals and administrative expenses charged by the Trustee. Redemptions are allowed for participants daily, however, in the event of a complete redemption, the Plan is subject to a one-year redemption notice period which may be waived by the Trustee. There are no unfunded commitments at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Note 6 - Group Annuity Contract:

The Plan holds a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract with Empower Annuity Insurance Company that comprises a traditional investment contract. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

The contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and interest at a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. The average yield and crediting interest rates were approximately 2.08% and 1.93% for 2024 and 2023, respectively. The contract value of the group annuity insurance contract was \$27,642,922 and \$28,336,787 for 2024 and 2023, respectively. Interest is credited on contract balances using a single “portfolio rate” approach. Under this methodology, a single interest crediting rate is applied to all contributions made to the product regardless of the timing of those contributions. Such interest crediting rates are reviewed on a semi-annual basis for resetting.

The Plan’s ability to receive amounts due in accordance with fully benefit-responsive investment contracts is dependent on the third-party issuer’s ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer’s ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by economic and regulatory developments.

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer. These events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. The Plan’s failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the IRC or the failure of the Trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the IRC.
2. Premature termination of the contracts.
3. Plan termination or merger.
4. Changes to the Plan’s prohibition on competing investment options.
5. Bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other Plan Sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spinoffs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan’s normal operations.

No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events that allow the issuer to terminate the contracts with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Those events may be different under each contract. Examples of such events include the following:

1. An uncured violation of the Plan’s investment guidelines.
2. A breach of material obligation under the contract.
3. A material misrepresentation.
4. A material amendment to the agreements without the consent of the issuer.

The group annuity contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Note 7 - Risks and Uncertainties and Concentration of Investment Risk:

Investment securities, in general, are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, credit and overall market volatility. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is reasonably possible that changes in the value of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participant’s account balances and the amounts reported in the financial statements.

The Plan may invest in securities with contractual cash flows, such as asset backed securities, collateralized mortgage obligations and commercial mortgage-backed securities, including securities backed by sub-prime mortgage loans. The value, liquidity and related income of these securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions, including real estate value, delinquencies or defaults, or both, and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates.

The Plan's investment in four funds comprises approximately 50% of total investments for benefits for 2024 and five funds comprises approximately 61% of total investments for 2023.

Note 8 - Plan Termination:

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants' contributions remain fully vested and Company contributions, if any, become fully vested. Under no circumstances may the Company take ownership of any of the Plan's assets as a result of such termination.

Note 9 - Notes Receivable from Participants:

Participants may obtain loans from the Plan at a minimum of \$1,000 and maximum of one-half of a participant's vested account balance, or \$50,000 whichever is less. Loans bear interest at a reasonable interest rate as reflected by local banks, the Prime Rate +1%, and are collateralized by the participant's account balance. Loans are payable through payroll deductions generally within five years. Two loans are permitted to be outstanding at a given time.

Note 10 - Tax Status:

The Plan was written on an Internal Revenue Service (IRS) non-standardized pre-approved document, which obtained its latest opinion letter on September 16, 2022, in which the IRS stated that the Plan as then designed, was in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan Administrator believes that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC, and therefore believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax period in progress.

Note 11 - Related Party Transactions:

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee, which provides investment management, portfolio advisory services, and administrative services to the Plan and, therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest. The fees paid by the Plan for such services for the year ended December 31, 2024 were \$28,000.

Note 12 - Subsequent Events:

The Plan Administrator has reviewed and evaluated all events and transactions from December 31, 2024, through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. The effects of those events and transactions that provide additional pertinent information about conditions that existed at the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits date have been recognized in the accompanying financial statements.

On December 31, 2024, Colliers Engineering & Design, Inc. approved the adoption of the Plan by Hilgartwilson, LLC. (“Adopting Employer”). The merger of the Adopting Employer’s Plan became effective January 1, 2025, and assets of the Adopting Employer’s Plan transferred into the Colliers Engineering & Design, Inc. 401(k) Savings & Retirement Plan during the first quarter of 2025 totaled approximately \$9.5 million.

Effective September 15, 2025, Colliers Engineering & Design, Inc. approved the adoption of the Plan by Terra Consulting Group, Ltd. (“Adopting Employer”). The merger of the Adopting Employer’s Plan became effective September 15, 2025, and assets of the Adopting Employer’s Plan transferred into the Colliers Engineering & Design, Inc. 401(k) Savings & Retirement Plan during the third quarter of 2025 totaled approximately \$12.8 million.
