1. The Plan

The following brief description of the A. Duie Pyle, Inc. Savings Plan (the "Plan") is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the most current Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General – The Plan is a defined contribution plan established as a savings plan for employees of A. Duie Pyle, Inc. and N995DP, LLC (collectively the "Company"). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA").

Eligibility – Employees of the Company are eligible to make deferral contributions to the Plan upon their date of hire.

Contributions – Each Participant may elect to defer an amount of eligible pre-tax and after-tax compensation to be contributed to the Plan subject to limitations determined by the Plan committee or by statute, which amount shall be deemed the Participant's Deferral Contribution. These Deferral Contributions do not include additional catch-up contributions allowed by the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS"). A Participant's compensation, for federal tax purposes, shall be reduced by the amount of the elected pre-tax contributions. The Plan includes an automatic enrollment and an automatic increase deferral feature. Under these features, an employee is automatically enrolled into the Plan at a deferral rate of 2% unless the employee specifies otherwise or opts out of the Plan. On an annual basis, the employee's deferral rate under the automatic increase feature will be increased by 2% up to a ceiling of 12%; although, an employee may elect to defer more than 12% into the Plan.

The Company shall make a matching contribution of up to 25% of the first 12% of each Participant's Deferral Contributions to the Plan, which amount shall be deemed the Employer's Matching Contribution. A participant is eligible to receive Employer Matching Contributions once they have completed 1,000 hours of service within a consecutive 12-month period or one year of service since their date of hire. Total Employer Matching Contributions (net of forfeitures) for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$4,211,298 and \$3,559,887, respectively.

To be eligible for a Nonelective Employer Contribution, Participants must work 1,000 hours in a Plan year and be an employee on the last day of the Plan year. Total Nonelective Employer Contributions (net of forfeitures) for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$9,330,520 and \$8,964,093, respectively.

The Plan allows Rollover Contributions from prior employer qualified tax deferred plans and from Individual Retirement Accounts. Company Matching Contributions are not allowed on Rollover Contributions.

Vesting – Participants are fully vested in their Deferral and Rollover Contributions. Nonelective Employer Contributions are discretionary and contain a cliff vesting provision whereas after three years the participant becomes 100% vested.

Participant Accounts – Each Participant's account is credited with the Participant's contribution and the Participant's share of the Company's contribution and earnings and losses on Participant account investments. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are not paid by the Company. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a Participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the Participant's vested account.

Investment Options – Upon enrollment, the Plan permits Participants to designate the investment of their funds in any of the investment options offered by the Plan at the time. Participants may change or transfer their investment options at any time. Individual Participant accounts are maintained by the trustee.

Forfeitures – Forfeited nonvested accounts may be used to pay Plan administrative expenses or to reduce future Employer Contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$1,017,915 and \$758,901, respectively. No forfeitures were used to reduce expenses for 2024 and 2023. In February 2025, forfeitures of \$933,135 were used to offset Employer Contributions relating to 2024. In February 2024, forfeitures of \$740,000 were used to offset Employer Contributions relating to 2023.

Payment of Benefits – Participants are entitled to benefits at the time of normal retirement, early retirement, late retirement, upon death or disability or upon termination of employment equal to 100% of the Participant's vested account. Participants may also make in-service withdrawals upon a showing of hardship as defined by the Plan document. Generally, any benefit due shall be paid as soon as administratively feasible.

Notes Receivable from Participants – The trustee may make loans from the Plan to Participants in accordance with the Plan document. All loans to Participants are considered notes receivable of the Plan and will bear a reasonable rate of interest as determined by the plan administrator. Participants may borrow a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum of the lesser of one-half of their vested account balance under the Plan or \$50,000 reduced by the highest outstanding loan balance in the Participant's account during the prior 12-month period. All loans are to be repaid within five years unless the loan is used to acquire a principal place of residence, in which case the loan period is not to exceed ten years. Principal and interest are to be repaid ratably through weekly payroll deductions.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (“U.S. GAAP”) requires the plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition – Investments are carried at fair value. See Note 3 for a discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Capital gain distributions are included in dividend income. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan’s gains and losses on investments purchased and sold, as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants – Notes receivable from Participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. Delinquent notes receivable from Participants are treated as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits – Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses – Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Company and are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from Participants are charged directly to the Participant’s account and are included in administrative expenses. In addition, certain fees are charged by the trustee to Participants who are no longer employed by the Company. These fees are deducted directly from such Participants’ accounts. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. If the Company should elect not to pay administrative expenses, they would have to be paid by the Plan.

3. Fair Value Measurements

Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, defines fair value as the price that would be received from selling an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. When determining the fair value measurements for assets and liabilities required to be recorded at fair value, the Plan considers the principal or most advantageous market in which it would transact and considers assumptions that market participants would use when pricing the asset or liability, such as inherent risk, transfer restrictions, and risk of nonperformance.

ASC 820 also establishes a fair value hierarchy that requires the Plan to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs when measuring fair value. A financial instrument's categorization within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of input that is significant to the fair value measurement. ASC 820 establishes three levels of inputs that may be used to measure fair value as follows:

Level 1: quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities;

Level 2: inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices in active markets for similar assets or liabilities, quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in markets that are not active, or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities;

Level 3: unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for investments measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual Funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities Exchange Commission (“SEC”). These funds are required to publish their daily NAV and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Money Market Fund: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The money market fund is an open-end mutual fund that is registered with the SEC. This fund is required to publish its daily NAV and to transact at that price. The money market fund held by the Plan is deemed to be actively traded.

Common Collective Trust Funds: Valued at NAV at year-end, based on information provided by the trustee and using the audited financial statements of the trust at year-end. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities and is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

4. Information Certified by the Trustee

Certain information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule related to investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, participant notes receivable, net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments, interest and dividends, and investment expenses for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Vanguard Fiduciary Trust Company (“VFTC”) (a qualified institution), the trustee of the Plan.

5. Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, Participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

6. Income Taxes

The IRS has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated June 30, 2020 that the Plan, as evidenced by a prototype document, and the related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable authorities. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

7. Related-Party Transactions and Party-In Interest Transactions

Plan investments are investments managed by an affiliate of VFTC. VFTC acts as trustee for only those investments as defined by the Plan. Transactions in such investments qualify as party in interest transactions. Additionally, notes receivable from participants and fees incurred by the Plan and paid to VFTC and its affiliates also qualify as party in interest transactions. These party in interest transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

8. Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect Participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan investments include a variety of investments that may directly or indirectly invest in securities with contractual cash flows. The value, liquidity, and related income of these securities are sensitive to changes in economic conditions and may be adversely affected by shifts in the market's perception of the issuers and changes in interest rates.
