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## INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Participants and Plan Administrator of

**NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of The Macomb Group, Inc. Employees' 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing plan and trust with a qualified cash or deferred 401(k) arrangement covering all eligible employees of The Macomb Group, Inc. (the "Company") who have three months of service and are 18 or older. The defined contribution 401(k) plan and trust was established January 1, 1995, and restated on August 1, 2023, and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Fidelity Management Trust Company is the Plan's trustee and Fidelity Workplace Services, LLC. provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. The plan administrator has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The 401(k) Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act 2.0 of 2022 (the SECURE Act 2.0) was signed into law December 29, 2022. This law, among other things, includes several required and optional provisions that will impact employee benefit plans that go into effect at various times through 2027. The provisions that were required to be implemented during the year ended December 31, 2024 are; 1) pre-death RMDs are not required from Roth accounts, 2) surviving spouse can elect to be treated as deceased employee for purposes of RMD rules, 3) correction period for employee deferral failures is extended to 9 ½ months after the end of the Plan year in which the error was made. The optional provisions that could be implemented during the year ended December 31, 2024 are; 1) the ability to offer non-highly compensated employees an emergency savings account, 2) to increase the cash-out balance to \$7,000, 3) to allow distributions for domestic abuse victim, 4) to allow for emergency expense distribution of up to \$1,000 and 5) to allow auto portability of amounts in that were rolled into an IRA due to cash out rules to be rolled into a new employer's plan.

Effective November 12, 2024, the plan elected the following optional provisions:

- The plan will allow participants to take a disaster related distribution.
- The plan will allow participants to take a domestic abuse related distribution.
- The plan adopted the optional provision available under SECURE 1.0 allowing birth or adoption distributions of up to \$5,000 to not be subject to the 10% early withdrawal penalty provided that the distribution must be made within one year of the birth of the child or the finalization of the adoption. This provision is modified at the time of adoption by SECURE 2.0 which limits the time to recontribute the amounts taken for qualified birth or adoption distributions from an unlimited time period to 3 years.

**Plan Amendments**

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan was amended to permit participation for employees of new subsidiaries as follows:

- Woodhill Supply Acquisition LLC, Effective May 1, 2024
- Trident Acquisitions LLC, Effective June 28, 2024
- Leonhardt Acquisitions LLC, Effective August 30, 2024

These amendments allow for service with predecessor employers West Penn Supply Company, Inc., HD Baker Sales Co., Ohio Pipe and Supply, Herman Goldner Co.-Industrial Supply Division, Deacon Industrial Supply Co. Inc., Woodhill Supply, Inc., and Leonhardt Pipe & Supply, Inc. to count toward eligibility requirements.

**Contributions**

Participants may contribute up to 100% of annual eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, and designate those contributions as either pre-tax or Roth. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

The Company's matching contributions are discretionary and determined as a percentage of participant elected deferrals. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 25% of participant contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain IRS limits. Participants direct the investment of their contributions, including their employer contribution, into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company matching contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the employer contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service. After one year of service, a participant becomes 30% vested in employer contributions in the Plan; the vesting increases by 30% after the second year. A participant is 100% vested after three years of credited service, or upon reaching plan retirement age of sixty-five, death, or disability.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of Vested Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, participants may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the vested interest in their accounts in either a lump-sum amount or in installments. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum distribution. Participants with a vested account balance of less than \$5,000 must take a lump-sum distribution. The account of a participant with a vest account balance between \$1,000 and \$5,000 who does not request a distribution will be rolled into an individual retirement account.

In-service distributions are allowed when a participant reaches age 59½. Rollover contributions may be withdrawn at any time. The Company may authorize certain withdrawals from a participant's account in the event of proven financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals are subject to specific statutory and regulatory requirements.

**Forfeited Accounts**

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$15 and \$7,603, respectively. These accounts will be used to pay Plan expenses, restore participant accounts, or reduce employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts in the amount of \$34,941 were used to reduce employer contributions and forfeited nonvested accounts in the amount of \$5,532 were used to pay Plan expenses.

**NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

**Payments of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Personnel and facilities of the Company have been used by the Plan for its accounting and other activities at no charge to the Plan.

**Subsequent Events**

The plan sponsor has performed a review of events subsequent to the statements of net assets available for benefits date through October 3, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that there are no material events that have occurred during this period other than as described in Note 9.

**NOTE 3 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS**

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution.

**NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1            Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2            Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3            Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Money market fund:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The money market fund is an open-end fund that is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). This fund is required to publish its daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The money market fund is deemed to be actively traded.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the SEC. These funds must publish their daily NAV and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Self-directed brokerage accounts:* Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

*Common/collective trusts:* Valued at the NAV of units of the fund, which is based on the estimated market value of the underlying investments less its liabilities. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

**NOTE 5 – PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan, including the Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were direct fees of \$148,565, and transactions involving the investment of plan assets in investment funds maintained by Fidelity Management Trust Company, advisory services related to the Plan charged by Stifel Nicolaus & Co. Inc, and audit services related to the Plan charged by UHY LLP, parties-in-interest as defined in section 3(14) of ERISA. Indirect fees paid by the Plan for investment management services are included in the net appreciation of the fair value of investments.

**NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

**NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS**

On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualified under IRC Section 401(a). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan was designed and was being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service for the statutory period.

**NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

**Secure 2.0**

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan implemented the required provisions of the SECURE Act 2.0 related to including long-term, part-time employees in the Plan, and increasing catch-up contributions limits for employees between ages 60 – 63.

**NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN**

The following description of The Macomb Group, Inc. Employees' 401(k) Plan (the "Plan") provides only general information. Participants should refer to the plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

**General**

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing plan and trust with a qualified cash or deferred 401(k) arrangement covering all eligible employees of The Macomb Group, Inc. (the "Company") who have three months of service and are 18 or older. The defined contribution 401(k) plan and trust was established January 1, 1995, and restated on August 1, 2023, and is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Fidelity Management Trust Company is the Plan's trustee and Fidelity Workplace Services, LLC. provides recordkeeping services to the Plan. The plan administrator has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. The 401(k) Committee determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act 2.0 of 2022 (the SECURE Act 2.0) was signed into law December 29, 2022. This law, among other things, includes several required and optional provisions that will impact employee benefit plans that go into effect at various times through 2027. The provisions that were required to be implemented during the year ended December 31, 2024 are; 1) pre-death RMDs are not required from Roth accounts, 2) surviving spouse can elect to be treated as deceased employee for purposes of RMD rules, 3) correction period for employee deferral failures is extended to 9 ½ months after the end of the Plan year in which the error was made. The optional provisions that could be implemented during the year ended December 31, 2024 are; 1) the ability to offer non-highly compensated employees an emergency savings account, 2) to increase the cash-out balance to \$7,000, 3) to allow distributions for domestic abuse victim, 4) to allow for emergency expense distribution of up to \$1,000 and 5) to allow auto portability of amounts in that were rolled into an IRA due to cash out rules to be rolled into a new employer's plan.

Effective November 12, 2024, the plan elected the following optional provisions:

- The plan will allow participants to take a disaster related distribution.
- The plan will allow participants to take a domestic abuse related distribution.
- The plan adopted the optional provision available under SECURE 1.0 allowing birth or adoption distributions of up to \$5,000 to not be subject to the 10% early withdrawal penalty provided that the distribution must be made within one year of the birth of the child or the finalization of the adoption. This provision is modified at the time of adoption by SECURE 2.0 which limits the time to recontribute the amounts taken for qualified birth or adoption distributions from an unlimited time period to 3 years.

**Plan Amendments**

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan was amended to permit participation for employees of new subsidiaries as follows:

- Woodhill Supply Acquisition LLC, Effective May 1, 2024
- Trident Acquisitions LLC, Effective June 28, 2024
- Leonhardt Acquisitions LLC, Effective August 30, 2024

These amendments allow for service with predecessor employers West Penn Supply Company, Inc., HD Baker Sales Co., Ohio Pipe and Supply, Herman Goldner Co.-Industrial Supply Division, Deacon Industrial Supply Co. Inc., Woodhill Supply, Inc., and Leonhardt Pipe & Supply, Inc. to count toward eligibility requirements.

**Contributions**

Participants may contribute up to 100% of annual eligible compensation, as defined in the Plan, and designate those contributions as either pre-tax or Roth. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. The Plan includes an auto-enrollment provision whereby all newly eligible employees are automatically enrolled in the Plan unless they affirmatively elect not to participate in the Plan. Automatically enrolled participants have their deferral rate set at 5% of eligible compensation and their contributions invested in a designated balanced fund until changed by the participant. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollover).

The Company's matching contributions are discretionary and determined as a percentage of participant elected deferrals. For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company contributed 25% of participant contributions.

Contributions are subject to certain IRS limits. Participants direct the investment of their contributions, including their employer contribution, into various investment options offered by the Plan.

**Participant Accounts**

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, Company matching contributions, and Plan earnings. Participant accounts are charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

**Vesting**

Participants are vested immediately in their contributions plus earnings thereon. Vesting in the employer contribution portion of their accounts is based on years of service. After one year of service, a participant becomes 30% vested in employer contributions in the Plan; the vesting increases by 30% after the second year. A participant is 100% vested after three years of credited service, or upon reaching plan retirement age of sixty-five, death, or disability.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to \$50,000 or 50% of the participant's vested account balance, whichever is less. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Principal and interest is paid ratably through payroll deductions.

**Payment of Vested Benefits**

On termination of service due to death, disability or retirement, participants may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the vested interest in their accounts in either a lump-sum amount or in installments. For termination of service due to other reasons, a participant may receive the value of the vested interest in his or her account in a lump-sum distribution. Participants with a vested account balance of less than \$5,000 must take a lump-sum distribution. The account of a participant with a vest account balance between \$1,000 and \$5,000 who does not request a distribution will be rolled into an individual retirement account.

In-service distributions are allowed when a participant reaches age 59½. Rollover contributions may be withdrawn at any time. The Company may authorize certain withdrawals from a participant's account in the event of proven financial hardship. Hardship withdrawals are subject to specific statutory and regulatory requirements.

**Forfeited Accounts**

As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$15 and \$7,603, respectively. These accounts will be used to pay Plan expenses, restore participant accounts, or reduce employer contributions. During the year ended December 31, 2024, forfeited nonvested accounts in the amount of \$34,941 were used to reduce employer contributions and forfeited nonvested accounts in the amount of \$5,532 were used to pay Plan expenses.

**NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

**Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Plan's investment committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors and trustee.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

**Contributions**

Contributions from Plan participants and the matching contributions from the employer are recorded in the year in which the employee contributions are withheld from compensation.

**Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred.

**Payments of Benefits**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

**Expenses**

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan, unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments. Personnel and facilities of the Company have been used by the Plan for its accounting and other activities at no charge to the Plan.

**Subsequent Events**

The plan sponsor has performed a review of events subsequent to the statements of net assets available for benefits date through October 3, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and has determined that there are no material events that have occurred during this period other than as described in Note 9.

**NOTE 3 – CERTIFIED INVESTMENTS**

Certain information related to investments and notes receivable from participants disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments and notes receivable from participants held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation in fair value of investments, dividends, and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information supplied to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by Fidelity Management Trust Company, a qualified institution.

**NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS**

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1            Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2            Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specific (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3            Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

*Money market fund:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. The money market fund is an open-end fund that is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC). This fund is required to publish its daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The money market fund is deemed to be actively traded.

*Mutual funds:* Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds registered with the SEC. These funds must publish their daily NAV and transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

*Self-directed brokerage accounts:* Accounts primarily consist of mutual funds and common stocks that are valued on the basis of readily determinable market prices.

*Common/collective trusts:* Valued at the NAV of units of the fund, which is based on the estimated market value of the underlying investments less its liabilities. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

**NOTE 5 – PARTY IN INTEREST TRANSACTIONS**

The Plan allows for transactions with certain parties who may perform services or have fiduciary responsibilities to the Plan, including the Company. During the year ended December 31, 2024, there were direct fees of \$148,565, and transactions involving the investment of plan assets in investment funds maintained by Fidelity Management Trust Company, advisory services related to the Plan charged by Stifel Nicolaus & Co. Inc, and audit services related to the Plan charged by UHY LLP, parties-in-interest as defined in section 3(14) of ERISA. Indirect fees paid by the Plan for investment management services are included in the net appreciation of the fair value of investments.

**NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

**NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS**

On June 30, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service stated that the prototype adopted by the Plan, as then designed, qualified under IRC Section 401(a). The Plan has not received a determination letter specific to the Plan itself; however, the plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan was designed and was being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

The Plan is subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service for the statutory period.

**NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

**NOTE 9 – SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

**Secure 2.0**

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan implemented the required provisions of the SECURE Act 2.0 related to including long-term, part-time employees in the Plan, and increasing catch-up contributions limits for employees between ages 60 – 63.
