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## Report of Independent Auditors

The Plan Committee and Participants

### **Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit**

We were engaged to perform audits of the financial statements of the Stamford Health System Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes (collectively referred to as the “financial statements”).

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of the financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from qualified institutions as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

### **Disclaimer of Opinion**

We do not express an opinion on the accompanying financial statements of the Plan. Because of the significance of the matter described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we have not been able to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on the financial statements.



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### **Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion**

The Plan has not maintained sufficient accounting records and supporting documents relating to certain annuity contracts and custodial accounts issued to current and former employees prior to January 1, 2009. Accordingly, we were unable to apply auditing procedures sufficient to determine the extent to which the financial statements may have been affected by these conditions.

### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements**

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the Plan, and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Our responsibility is to conduct an audit of the Plan's financial statements in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and to issue an auditor's report. However, because of the matter described in the Basis for Disclaimer of Opinion section of our report, we were not able to obtain sufficient appropriate evidence to provide a basis for an audit opinion on these financial statements.

We are required to be independent of the Plan, and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit.



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**Other Matters**

*Supplemental Schedule Required by ERISA*

## Notes to Financial Statements

December 31, 2024

### 1. Plan Description

The following description of the Stamford Health System Defined Contribution Retirement Plan (the Plan) provides general information about the Plan's provisions. Prior to April 1, 2016, The Stamford Hospital (the Hospital) was the Plan Sponsor. Effective April 1, 2016, Stamford Health, Inc. (Stamford Health), ultimate parent of the Hospital, became the Plan Sponsor. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions, copies of which may be obtained from the Plan Sponsor.

#### General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established by the Plan Sponsor which satisfies Internal Revenue Code (the Code) Section 403(b), covering substantially all employees of Stamford Health. The effective date of the Plan was January 1, 2003. The Plan was amended and restated effective January 1, 2010. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (ERISA).

All non-excluded employees are eligible to participate in the Plan for the purpose of salary reduction contributions immediately upon commencement of employment. An employee will become eligible for any form of employer contribution following completion of one year of eligible service (975 hours of service in the 12 months following the employee hire date or in any Plan year).

The Plan Committee (the Committee) is responsible for the general administration of the Plan. State Street Bank and Trust Company, Transamerica Life Insurance Company (TLIC) and Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (TFLIC) are the custodians of the Plan. Transamerica Retirement Solutions, LLC (TRS) is the recordkeeper of the Plan.

#### Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. The Hospital and Stamford Health Medical Group, Inc. (SHMG; a subsidiary of Stamford Health) (collectively, the subsidiaries) contribute 4% of each participant's eligible compensation (nonelective contributions), plus 50% of the first 2% of the employee's elective contribution (matching contributions). All contributions are subject to certain limitations of the Code.

# Stamford Health System Defined Contribution Retirement Plan

## Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

### 1. Plan Description (continued)

#### Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions and the subsidiaries' matching and nonelective contributions and allocations of Plan earnings (losses) and is charged with the participant's share of net earnings or losses of his/her respective elected investment options. Allocations of administrative expenses are based on the participant's account balances, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

#### Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions, plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the subsidiaries' matching and nonelective contributions is based on years of vesting service. A participant is 100% vested after three years of vesting service. Years of vesting service are determined using an hours of service based crediting method.

#### Forfeitures

Upon termination of employment, participants forfeit their non-vested balances. If a participant is rehired, the forfeited contributions are reinstated. Forfeited balances of terminated participants' non-vested accounts are used to reduce future employer contributions. Unallocated forfeitures balances as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, were approximately \$1,089,000 and \$376,000 respectively. Forfeitures of approximately \$284,000 were used to reduce employer contributions for 2024.

#### Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts in increments of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance. Loan terms range from 1–5 years or up to 15 years for the purchase of a primary residence. The \$50,000 limit is reduced by the participant's highest outstanding loan balance during the preceding 12-month period. A participant may not have more than two loans outstanding at any point in time. Principal and interest is paid through monthly payroll deductions. Interest is determined at the time of the loan at a rate of 1% plus the Prime Lending Rate on the date the loan application is approved. If a participant terminates employment with Stamford Health, he/she may not continue to make loan payments through a pre-authorized check agreement.

# Stamford Health System Defined Contribution Retirement Plan

## Notes to Financial Statements (continued)

### **1. Plan Description (continued)**

#### **Payment of Benefits**

Normal retirement is upon attainment of 65 years of age. A participant may remain employed past the normal retirement date and continue to contribute to the Plan. Upon retirement and having attained the normal retirement age, a participant will be entitled to 100% of the participant's account balance, beginning at a reasonable time after retirement. Upon separation from service with Stamford Health due to death, disability, retirement or termination, a participant whose vested account balance exceeds \$5,000 may elect to receive either a lump sum or installment payments. A participant whose vested account balance is \$5,000 or less will automatically receive an immediate lump sum distribution equal to his/her vested account balance.

In-service withdrawals are available in certain limited circumstances, as defined by the Plan. Hardship withdrawals are allowed for participants incurring an immediate and heavy financial need, as defined by the Plan. Hardship withdrawals are strictly regulated by the Internal Revenue Service (the IRS), and a participant must exhaust all available loan options and available distributions prior to requesting a hardship withdrawal.

#### **Administrative Expenses**

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or Stamford Health, as provided by the Plan's provisions. Administrative expenses paid by the Plan include recordkeeping and trustee fees. Expenses relating to purchases, sales or transfers of the Plan's investments are charged to the particular investment fund to which the expenses relate. All other administrative expenses of the Plan are paid by Stamford Health.

#### **Plan Termination**

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, Stamford Health has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event the Plan terminates, participants will become 100% vested in their accounts.

### **2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies**

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements of the Plan have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (US GAAP).

#### **Benefit Payments**

Benefits are recorded when paid.

#### **Contributions**

Participant and employer matching contributions are recorded in the year in which the participant contributions are withheld from compensation.

#### **Notes Receivable from Participants**

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded when it is earned. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. If a participant ceases to make loan repayments and the plan administrator deems the participant loan to be a distribution, the participant loan balance is reduced, and a benefit payment is recorded.

#### **Investment Valuation and Income Recognition**

Investments held by the Plan (except for fully benefit-responsive contracts) are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). The Plan's Investment Committee determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodians, and insurance company. See Note 4 for a discussion of fair value measurements. Fully benefit-responsive contracts are valued at contract value (see Note 5). Contract value is the relevant measurement as contract value is the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions plus earnings, less participant withdrawals, and administrative expenses.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation in fair value of investments includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (continued)

#### Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with US GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes and supplemental schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### 3. Investments

Certain investment and participant notes receivable information disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule, including investments at fair value, fully benefit-responsive investment contracts at contract value and notes receivable from participants at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the net appreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends and interest income on notes receivable from participants for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained or derived from information provided to the plan administrator and certified as complete and accurate by State Street Bank and Trust Company (on behalf of TRS), TLIC and TFLIC, the custodians of the Plan.

### 4. Fair Value Measurements

For assets and liabilities required to be measured at fair value, the Plan measures fair value based on the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. In order to increase consistency and comparability in fair value measurements, the Plan follows a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes observable and unobservable inputs used to measure fair value into three broad levels, which are described below:

*Level 1:* Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets that are accessible at the measurement date for identical assets or liabilities.

*Level 2:* Observable inputs that are based on inputs not quoted in active markets, but corroborated by market data.

*Level 3:* Unobservable inputs are used when little or no market data is available. Level 3 inputs include management's own assumptions about the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability (including assumptions about risk).

### 4. Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is determined based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

- Mutual funds: Fair values are based upon quoted market prices in active markets for identical assets.
- Self-directed brokerage accounts: These accounts may include money market funds and mutual funds. The carrying amount of money market funds approximates fair value, because of the short maturity of these instruments. The fair value of mutual funds are based upon quoted market prices.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

#### 5. Guaranteed Investment Option and Insurance General Account

The Plan has an investment in a Guaranteed Investment Option (GIO) provided under a group annuity contract issued by TLIC. The contract is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant-initiated withdrawals or transfer requests. The contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

The contract value is reported to the Plan by TLIC. TLIC may terminate the contract and settle transactions at amounts different from contract value if the Plan ceases to comply with Section 403(b) of the Code or fails to fulfill its obligations under the contract. Additionally, distributions due to employer initiated events (e.g., mergers, layoffs, plan terminations, retirement incentive programs, etc.) that exceed a certain percentage may be subject to a 5% withdrawal charge. The contract contains a minimum guaranteed interest rate of 1% during 2024 and 2023. At the beginning of each calendar year, TLIC determines the declared interest rate which will be applicable to all monies invested in the GIO during such calendar year. Assets under the GIO contract will be credited with the greater of the declared interest rate and the applicable minimum guaranteed interest rate. There are no reserves against contract values for credit risk of contract issues or otherwise. The Plan also holds an investment in the General Account of TFLIC. This investment is reported at contract value and qualifies as a fully benefit-responsive investment contract. The General Account is credited with interest and subject to similar withdrawal and liquidity provisions as the GIC.

#### **5. Guaranteed Investment Option and Insurance General Account (continued)**

Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers. Examples of such events include the following:

- The Plan's failure to qualify under Section 401(a) of the Code or the failure of the trust to be tax-exempt under Section 501(a) of the Code
- Premature termination of a contract
- Plan termination or merger
- Creation of a new competing fund
- Layoffs
- Employee communications that influence Contributions to or withdrawals or loans from the plan option
- Bankruptcy of the Plan Sponsor or other plan sponsor events (e.g., divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that significantly affect the Plan's normal operations

The Plan Sponsor does not believe that the occurrence of any such events that would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuers and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants is probable.

#### **6. Income Tax Status**

The underlying volume submitter plan has received an advisory letter from the IRS dated March 31, 2017, stating that the form of the Plan is qualified under Section 401 of the Code and, therefore, the related trust is tax-exempt. The plan administrator has determined that it is eligible to, and has chosen to, rely on the current IRS volume submitter advisory letter. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualified status. The Plan Sponsor identified certain operational failures and is taking the necessary steps to bring the Plan to compliance with the Code.

### **6. Income Tax Status (continued)**

US GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. Plan management has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### **7. Risks and Uncertainties**

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market volatility and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **8. Related-Parties and Parties-In-Interest Transactions**

Certain of the Plan's assets are invested in funds managed by TFLIC, one of the custodians of the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions; however, they are exempt from the prohibited transactions rules under ERISA.

Participants who are active employees may borrow from their accounts and such loans qualify as exempt party-in-interest transactions under ERISA. These loans are recorded as notes receivable from participants in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

### **9. Subsequent Events**

Plan management has evaluated subsequent events for the Plan through October 13, 2025, the date the accompanying financial statements were available to be issued. As previously approved by the Committee on July 2, 2024, a change in recordkeeper from TRS to Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower) and changes in custodians from TRS, TLIC and TFLIC to Empower took effect May 1, 2025. No other subsequent events have occurred that require disclosure in, or adjustment to, the financial statements.
