INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Administrative Committee of

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of St. Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of St. Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.
- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of St. Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the St Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Administrator/Trustees

The Plan Administrator is St. Clair Specialty Physicians P.C., and the plan's Trustees are Ascensus, LLC and First Clearing, LLC. All record keeping functions were performed by Futureplan, LLC. Investment responsibilities, including safeguarding of assets and discretionary authority concerning the purchase and sale of those assets are handled by Ascensus, LLC and First Clearing, LLC.

General

St Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan became effective on December 1, 1976. The Plan's year end anniversary date is December 31st.

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing plan. Under the terms of the Plan, Employees who have reached age 21 and who have completed one year of service are participants in the plan. The net assets are allocated among "participant accounts", which consist of each participant's accumulated share of annual contributions and any adjustment for appreciation or depreciation on asset revaluations.

Contributions to the Plan

Each participant may elect to defer for each plan year up to 100% of eligible compensation not to exceed \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may elect either Pre-Tax 401(k) Deferrals or Roth 401(k) Deferrals. The Plan's Trustees reserve the right to amend or revoke a participant's election to defer compensation to ensure that contributions made by or on behalf of a participant for a plan year do not exceed the limitations of Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code or to insure that the discrimination tests of Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code are met for each plan year.

The Company has elected to make nonelective safe-harbor contributions to the Plan at the rate of 100% up to the first 3% of eligible compensation contributed by the participant. The Company must contribute an amount equal to at least 3% of each eligible participant's compensation in order to maintain its safe harbor status. The Company made safe harbor contributions of \$308,139 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company, in its sole discretion, may make matching contributions to the Plan. Discretionary matching contributions will be equal to a percentage of participant salary deferrals, not to exceed 4% of compensation in any Plan year. The Company did not make any discretionary matching contributions to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan. This contribution may be made by the employer for employees who have completed 500 hours of service during the Plan year and who are employed the last day of the Plan year. The Company did not make any profit sharing contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Vesting and Distributions

Participant deferral contributions, employer safe harbor contributions, employer matching contributions, employer profit sharing contributions and rollover contributions are always fully vested.

The Plan provides that the form by which a participant retirement benefit shall be paid is one lump-sum cash payment. For account balances that exceed \$5,000, partial withdrawals or installments are permitted for Participants who must receive required minimum distributions. In the event of death, the remaining balance in the participant's account shall be distributed to his/her beneficiaries.

Participant Loans

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account. The maximum number of Plan loans that a participant may have outstanding at any one time is 2. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when earned. Expenses are recorded in the accounting period in which they are incurred.

Investments

Fund investments are valued based on the market value of the underlying investments as of the last business day of the year. Realized gains and losses on investment transactions are recorded as the difference between proceeds received and carrying value. Net unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the fair market value of investments is recorded as the change in carrying value of the investment portfolio from the beginning of the year or date of purchase to the end of the year.

Allocation of Contributions, Investment Income, Gains and Losses, and Forfeitures

The Plan states that the discretionary employer contributions, if any, are allocated to the participants based on the ratio of a participant's current year compensation to the total compensation for all eligible participants. Compensation is limited to \$345,000 per participant for allocation purposes for the years ended December 31, 2024.

Funds contributed by employees and by the Company are invested in mutual funds, exchange traded funds or money market account at percentages elected by each participant.

The income, gains or losses in each fund are allocated on a daily basis to the applicable participants accounts in that fund based on the previously reported account balances, adjusted for current period contributions and withdrawals.

Forfeitures of terminated participant's nonvested accounts may be used to pay any Plan expenses or reduce any Employer contribution. During the year ended December 31, 2024, recordkeeping fees were reduced by \$11,874 from forfeited nonvested accounts. Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$93,506 as of December 31, 2024.

Expenses

Certain expenses for maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Income Taxes

The Plan has adopted accounting rules that prescribe when to recognize and how to measure the financial statement effects of income tax positions taken or expected to be taken on its income tax returns. Based on the results of management's evaluation, adoption of the rules did not have a material effect on the accompanying financial statements. Consequently, no liability is recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits for unrecognized income tax positions. Further, no interest or penalties have been accrued as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 or charged to expense for the year ended December 31, 2024. With limited exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to federal tax audits for years prior to 2021.

Participant Loans

Loans to participants are reported on their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Date of Management's Review

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Futureplan, LLC is the Plan's third-party administration and provides record keeping for the Plan's transactions. The transactions qualify as party-in interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for record keeping services amounted to \$3,520 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Ascensus, LLC. is a trustee of the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for trustee services amounted to \$15,240 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Raymond James Financial Services provides investment management and advisory services to the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for advisory services amounted to \$29,858 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

First Clearing, LLC is a trustee of the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for trustee services amounted to \$644 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

GAMCO Investors, Inc. provides investment management and advisory services to the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for advisory services amounted to \$90,656 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4: INVESTMENTS

Investments are held by Ascensus, LLC and First Clearing, LLC. First Clearing, LLC does not have a valid certification as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Therefore, ERISA Non-Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit procedures were performed on all investments held by First Clearing, LLC.

Unaudited Information Certified by the Plan Trustee

The plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Accordingly, Ascensus, LLC, as one of the trustees of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the net depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 5: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority and Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. No Level 3 inputs were available to the Plan.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. The fair values of common stocks, corporate bonds, and U.S. Government securities are based on the closing price reported on the active market where the individual securities are traded. Money market deposit accounts are valued at amortized cost that approximates fair value for the cash deposits.

NOTE 7: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8: TERMINATED PARTICIPANTS

Included in net assets available for benefits are amounts allocated to individuals who have withdrawn from the Plan. Amounts allocated to these participants were \$505,140 and \$699,353 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 9: DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the employer failed to remit certain employee, employer and loan repayments to the Plan in a timely manner according to DOL regulations. The amount of delinquent contributions was \$134,104.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Administrative Committee of
St. Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of St. Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of St. Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

- the information in the financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. NOTE 1: DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the St Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

Administrator/Trustees

The Plan Administrator is St. Clair Specialty Physicians P.C., and the plan's Trustees are Ascensus, LLC and First Clearing, LLC. All record keeping functions were performed by Futureplan, LLC. Investment responsibilities, including safeguarding of assets and discretionary authority concerning the purchase and sale of those assets are handled by Ascensus, LLC and First Clearing, LLC.

General

St Clair Specialty Physicians, P.C. Employees' 401(k) Profit Sharing Plan became effective on December 1, 1976. The Plan's year end anniversary date is December 31st.

The Plan is a defined contribution profit sharing plan. Under the terms of the Plan, Employees who have reached age 21 and who have completed one year of service are participants in the plan. The net assets are allocated among "participant accounts", which consist of each participant's accumulated share of annual contributions and any adjustment for appreciation or depreciation on asset revaluations.

Contributions to the Plan

Each participant may elect to defer for each plan year up to 100% of eligible compensation not to exceed \$23,000 and \$22,500 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may elect either Pre-Tax 401(k) Deferrals or Roth 401(k) Deferrals. The Plan's Trustees reserve the right to amend or revoke a participant's election to defer compensation to ensure that contributions made by or on behalf of a participant for a plan year do not exceed the limitations of Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code or to insure that the discrimination tests of Section 401(k) of the Internal Revenue Code are met for each plan year.

The Company has elected to make nonelective safe-harbor contributions to the Plan at the rate of 100% up to the first 3% of eligible compensation contributed by the participant. The Company must contribute an amount equal to at least 3% of each eligible participant's compensation in order to maintain its safe harbor status. The Company made safe harbor contributions of \$308,139 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company, in its sole discretion, may make matching contributions to the Plan. Discretionary matching contributions will be equal to a percentage of participant salary deferrals, not to exceed 4% of compensation in any Plan year. The Company did not make any discretionary matching contributions to the Plan for the year ended December 31, 2024.

The Company may also make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution to the Plan. This contribution may be made by the employer for employees who have completed 500 hours of service during the Plan year and who are employed the last day of the Plan year. The Company did not make any profit sharing contributions during the year ended December 31, 2024.

Vesting and Distributions

Participant deferral contributions, employer safe harbor contributions, employer matching contributions, employer profit sharing contributions and rollover contributions are always fully vested.

The Plan provides that the form by which a participant retirement benefit shall be paid is one lump-sum cash payment. For account balances that exceed \$5,000, partial withdrawals or installments are permitted for Participants who must receive required minimum distributions. In the event of death, the remaining balance in the participant's account shall be distributed to his/her beneficiaries.

Participant Loans

Participants may borrow from their fund accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account. The maximum number of Plan loans that a participant may have outstanding at any one time is 2. The loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at prime plus 1%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Tax Status

The IRS has determined and informed the Plan sponsor by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believe that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

NOTE 2: SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared using the accrual basis of accounting. Employer contributions and income from investments are recorded when earned. Expenses are recorded in the accounting period in which they are incurred.

Investments

Fund investments are valued based on the market value of the underlying investments as of the last business day of the year. Realized gains and losses on investment transactions are recorded as the difference between proceeds received and carrying value. Net unrealized appreciation or depreciation in the fair market value of investments is recorded as the change in carrying value of the investment portfolio from the beginning of the year or date of purchase to the end of the year.

Allocation of Contributions, Investment Income, Gains and Losses, and Forfeitures

The Plan states that the discretionary employer contributions, if any, are allocated to the participants based on the ratio of a participant's current year compensation to the total compensation for all eligible participants. Compensation is limited to \$345,000 per participant for allocation purposes for the years ended December 31, 2024.

Funds contributed by employees and by the Company are invested in mutual funds, exchange traded funds or money market account at percentages elected by each participant.

The income, gains or losses in each fund are allocated on a daily basis to the applicable participants accounts in that fund based on the previously reported account balances, adjusted for current period contributions and withdrawals.

Forfeitures of terminated participant's nonvested accounts may be used to pay any Plan expenses or reduce any Employer contribution. During the year ended December 31, 2024, recordkeeping fees were reduced by \$11,874 from forfeited nonvested accounts. Forfeited nonvested accounts totaled \$93,506 as of December 31, 2024.

Expenses

Certain expenses for maintaining the Plan are paid by the Company and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Investment-related expenses are included in net appreciation in fair value of investments. Fees for the administration of notes receivable from participants are included in administrative expenses and charged directly to the participant's account.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Income Taxes

The Plan has adopted accounting rules that prescribe when to recognize and how to measure the financial statement effects of income tax positions taken or expected to be taken on its income tax returns. Based on the results of management's evaluation, adoption of the rules did not have a material effect on the accompanying financial statements. Consequently, no liability is recognized in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits for unrecognized income tax positions. Further, no interest or penalties have been accrued as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 or charged to expense for the year ended December 31, 2024. With limited exceptions, the Plan is no longer subject to federal tax audits for years prior to 2021.

Participant Loans

Loans to participants are reported on their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest.

Date of Management's Review

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 8, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3: RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Futureplan, LLC is the Plan's third-party administration and provides record keeping for the Plan's transactions. The transactions qualify as party-in interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for record keeping services amounted to \$3,520 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Ascensus, LLC. is a trustee of the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for trustee services amounted to \$15,240 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

Raymond James Financial Services provides investment management and advisory services to the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for advisory services amounted to \$29,858 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

First Clearing, LLC is a trustee of the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for trustee services amounted to \$644 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

GAMCO Investors, Inc. provides investment management and advisory services to the Plan. The transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for advisory services amounted to \$90,656 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 4: INVESTMENTS

Investments are held by Ascensus, LLC and First Clearing, LLC. First Clearing, LLC does not have a valid certification as permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Therefore, ERISA Non-Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit procedures were performed on all investments held by First Clearing, LLC.

Unaudited Information Certified by the Plan Trustee

The plan management has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). Accordingly, Ascensus, LLC, as one of the trustees of the Plan, has certified to the completeness and accuracy of all investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedules, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the net depreciation in fair value of investments, interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024.

NOTE 5: FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority and Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on the available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments. When available, the Plan measures fair value using Level 1 inputs because they generally provide the most reliable evidence of fair value. No Level 3 inputs were available to the Plan.

Level 1 Fair Value Measurements

The fair value of mutual funds is based on quoted net asset values of the shares held by the Plan at year-end. The fair values of common stocks, corporate bonds, and U.S. Government securities are based on the closing price reported on the active market where the individual securities are traded. Money market deposit accounts are valued at amortized cost that approximates fair value for the cash deposits.

NOTE 7: RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 8: TERMINATED PARTICIPANTS

Included in net assets available for benefits are amounts allocated to individuals who have withdrawn from the Plan. Amounts allocated to these participants were \$505,140 and \$699,353 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

NOTE 9: DELINQUENT PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTIONS

During the year ended December 31, 2024, the employer failed to remit certain employee, employer and loan repayments to the Plan in a timely manner according to DOL regulations. The amount of delinquent contributions was \$134,104.
