Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the Alliance Material Handling, Inc. Notes to the Financial Statements As of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and For the Year Ended December 31, 2024

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Alliance Material Handling, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

Alliance Material Handling, Inc. (the Company) established the Plan effective as of January 1, 2004 for the benefit of eligible employees of the Company. The Plan operates as a non-contributory employee stock ownership plan as defined in Section 4975(e)(7) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the Code). The Plan is administered by a committee appointed by the Company's Board of Directors, and an independent third party serves as the Plan's Trustee.

In 2004, the Plan acquired 200,000 shares of the Company's stock in exchange for a note payable to the Company. In 2007, the Plan acquired the remaining shares of the Company's stock totaling 414,762 shares in exchange for a note payable to the Company. On November 1, 2022, the Company entered into a plan of merger with Valley Industrial Trucks, Inc. (VIT), the former owner of VIT, and the Valley Industrial Trucks, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Trust (the VIT ESOT). Prior to the date of merger, VIT was owned by the Valley Industrial Trucks, Inc. Employee Stock Ownership Plan (the VIT ESOP). Upon the date of the merger, the VIT ESOT was issued 35,294 shares of common stock in the Company. Pursuant to the merger, the Plan issued a note payable to the Company in the amount of \$24,800,000 (Note 3). The borrowing is collateralized by the unallocated shares of common stock and is guaranteed by the Company. The lender has no rights against shares of common stock once they are allocated to participants in accordance with the terms of the Plan. Accordingly, the financial statements of the Plan as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024 present separately the assets and liabilities and changes in net assets available for benefits pertaining to the accounts of employees with rights in allocated common stock (allocated) and common stock not yet allocated to employees (unallocated), including shares that are committed to be released. Shares are released from collateral and become allocated generally in the period in which debt service is actually paid.

Employees must be 21 years of age and complete one year of service to become eligible participants. A participant must be an employee as of the last day of the Plan year, complete 1,000 service hours during the Plan year, and receive compensation during the Plan year to participate in the allocation of shares during the Plan year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA) and was most recently amended effective January 1, 2024 to allow the Plan to make payment of benefits to participants in the form of cash, shares of Company stock, or a combination thereof.

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN – cont’d.

Contributions

Contributions are made monthly by the Company and may be made for each Plan year in cash, forgiveness of debt, or issuance of Company stock. The Company is required to make contributions in an amount sufficient to enable the Plan to make payments on the note payable to the Company. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, an aggregate of 617,586 and 616,174 shares have been released and allocated to the participants, respectively. Shares are released and allocated annually, over the term of the note payable (Note 3), as loan principal is repaid and shares are no longer necessary to collateralize the note balance. No participant shall be required or permitted to make contributions to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

The Plan is a non-contributory plan under which a separate individual account is established for each participant. Each participant’s account is credited as of the last day of each Plan year with an allocation of shares of the Company’s stock released from the unallocated account and forfeitures of terminated participants’ non-vested accounts. Only those participants who are eligible employees of the Company as of the last day of the Plan year will receive an allocation. Allocations are based on a participant’s eligible compensation relative to total eligible compensation. Plan earnings are allocated to each participant’s account based on the ratio of the participant’s beginning of the year account balance to all participants’ beginning of the year account balances.

Vesting

A year of service is a Plan year during which an employee completes 1,000 hours of service. All employees that had completed three or more years of service as of the effective date of the Plan automatically became 20% vested and became 100% vested four years from the Plan’s effective date. For all employees that had not completed three or more years of service as of the effective date of the Plan, and for all participants who were hired after the establishment of the Plan, the vesting schedule is as follows:

Vesting – cont'd.

Any unvested portion of the final balances in a participant's account will be forfeited as of the earlier of a break in service of five consecutive years or following a cash-out distribution. Non-vested participants shall forfeit their balances immediately at termination of employment. Participant accounts become fully vested and nonforfeitable upon death, permanent disability, attainment of early retirement age (age 62 and 10 years of service with the Company), or normal retirement age (the later of age 65 and the completion of 5 years of participation in the Plan).

Forfeited Accounts

Forfeitures of Company contributions are reallocated to active participants' accounts in the same manner as Company contributions.

Plan Expenses

All administrative expenses are paid with the assets of the Plan, unless paid by the Company, at its discretion. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company paid all administrative expenses of the Plan.

Payment of Benefits

Effective January 1, 2024, upon retirement, disability or death, each participant is entitled to receive the full value of their account in the form of cash, shares of Company common stock, or a combination thereof. The value of Company common stock is determined using the most recent independent appraisal of the common shares of the Company. In the event of termination other than retirement, disability or death, a participant is entitled to their vested benefits, equal to the sum of their vested Company contributions and earnings thereon.

A distribution of shares allocated to a participant's account following the termination of service will be computed in accordance with the Plan document. During the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan paid benefits to participants totaling \$6,341,900. Of this amount, \$1,350,605 was paid in cash representing shares distributed and subsequently repurchased by the Plan, and 30,291 shares of Company common stock were distributed, which were valued at \$4,991,295 based on the fair value of the shares as of the date of the distribution.

Terminated participants with a vested balance of \$5,000 or less are paid a lump sum equal to their vested account balance by the end of the Plan year following their termination. Terminated participants with a vested balance greater than \$5,000 are paid in substantially equal periodic installments over five years.

Payment of Benefits – cont'd.

Diversification is offered to participants close to retirement so that they may have the opportunity to liquidate their investment in Company common stock into investments which are more diversified. Participants who are at least 55 and have been participating in the Plan for at least 10 years may elect to diversify a portion of their account. Diversification is offered to each eligible participant over a six year period. For the first five years after the employee becomes eligible to direct the investments, a participant may direct the investment of up to 25% of their account balance. Beginning with the sixth year after the employee becomes eligible to direct investments, the employee may direct the investments of up to 50% of their account balance. Participants who elect to diversify will receive a cash distribution.

Put Option

Effective January 1, 2024, under federal income tax regulations, the Company common stock that is held by the Plan and its participants and is not readily tradable on an established market, or is subject to trading limitations, includes a put option. The put option is a right to demand that the Company buy any shares of its stock distributed to participants for which there is no market. The put price is representative of the fair market value of the stock. The Company can pay for the purchase either with a single payment or over a period of five years. The purpose of the put option is to ensure that the participant has the ability to ultimately obtain cash.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of additions to net assets available for benefits and deductions from net assets available for benefits during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Risks and Uncertainties

The Company stock is valued at fair market value as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Fair market value is determined on an annual basis by an independent appraisal. The appraiser utilizes historical and projected financial data provided by the Company as well as relevant industry information to estimate the fair market value of the investment. Because of the subjectivity inherent in any estimate of fair market value, amounts ultimately realized from the investments may vary significantly from the fair market values presented, and the differences could be material to the financial statements.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Company's common stock was valued at \$166.60 and \$164.78 per share as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Shares held by the Plan totaled 619,765 and 650,056 with an aggregate cost basis of \$16,416,046 and \$17,125,168 as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Realized gains and losses from securities transactions are reported on the average cost method. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Fair Value Measurement

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) 820, *Fair Value Measurement*, defines fair value and establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

Level 1 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

Level 3 Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

Fair Value Measurement – cont’d.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based upon the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

The following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value:

Interest in Company common stock: Valued based on an annual third-party valuation performed by independent corporate financial analysts using a combination of the market and income valuation techniques.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Benefit payments to participants are recorded when paid.

Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated for disclosure any subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined there were no material events that warrant disclosure.

3. NOTE PAYABLE

On October 31, 2022, the Plan obtained a consolidated term loan in the amount of \$24,800,000 from the Company. The proceeds of the loan were used to fund the Company's acquisition of VIT. The loan is payable in 25 equal annual installments of principal and interest, each in the amount of \$1,501,727 each December 30, starting on December 30, 2023 and ending on December 30, 2047. The note bears interest at a rate of 3.43% per annum. Unallocated shares are collateral for the loan. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, outstanding principal on the note payable was \$23,625,082 and \$24,293,541, respectively.

4. TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

The Plan's assets consist solely of the Company's shares, which are held by the Trustee. The Company provides certain accounting and administrative services to the Plan, for which no fees are charged. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions, which are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules.

5. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company may amend or terminate the Plan at any time. If the Plan is terminated, participation of all participants will end and the accounts of each participant shall become 100% vested. Participant accounts will be distributed in accordance with provisions of the Plan.

6. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan has received a determination letter from the Internal Revenue Service dated June 30, 2020, stating that the Plan is qualified under Section 401(a) of the Code and therefore, the related Trust is exempt from taxation. Once qualified, the Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain its qualification. The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed and currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Code. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

6. INCOME TAX STATUS – cont’d.

ASC 740, *Income Taxes*, prescribes a recognition threshold and a measurement attribute for the financial statement recognition and measurement of tax positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return as well as guidance on de-recognition, classification, interest and penalties and financial statement reporting disclosures. For these benefits to be recognized, a tax position must be more-likely-than-not to be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. As the Plan is tax exempt and did not have any unrelated business taxable income, the provisions of ASC 740 do not have an impact on the Plan’s financial statements. The Plan recognizes interest and penalties accrued on any unrecognized tax exposures as a component of income tax expense. The Plan does not have any amounts accrued relating to interest and penalties as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS and the Department of Labor; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.
