Opinion

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Seventh District Retirement Benefit and Trust Fund's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date that the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments, administering the plan, and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with GAAS, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Seventh District Retirement Benefit and Trust Fund's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Seventh District Retirement Benefit and Trust Fund's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.



NOTE 1 DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Seventh District Retirement Benefit and Trust Fund (the Plan) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution plan benefiting union members covered by the collective bargaining agreements between the West Texas Chapter, Red River Valley Chapter and El Paso Chapter of the National Electrical Contractors Association, Inc. (NECA), and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Locals 583, 602, 681 and 898. The Plan is subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as amended.

Eligibility

Participants are immediately eligible to participate in the Plan upon the date an Employer first makes a contribution on behalf of the employee by the collective bargaining agreements.

Contributions

Each month, participating employers contribute to the Plan, on behalf of their eligible employees, a fixed amount per hour of service, as determined by the collective bargaining agreements. The fixed amount per hour of service is based on various categories of participants, as defined in the collective bargaining agreements. No contributions are made to the Plan by participants and there are no minimum age or service requirements for eligibility.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the Employer's contributions and an allocation of Plan earnings and fees on an annual basis through June 30, 2024. Effective July 1, 2024, the Plan earnings and fees are allocated on a daily basis. Allocations are based on a formula as set forth in the Plan document. Participants may elect to allocate their accounts between two investment funds managed by the board of trustees, Fund A, a diversified balanced portfolio designed for long term investment and Fund B a stable value investment. Investment income was allocated to participants at 6.53% for Fund A and 1.48% for Fund B for the period ended June 30, 2024 and 11.31% for Fund A and 2.90% for Fund B for the year ended December 31, 2023. During the period ended June 30, 2024 and year ended December 31, 2023, a fee of \$78.46 and \$88.19, respectively, per participant was assessed for administrative fees. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided by the participant's vested account.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in contributions plus actual earnings thereon.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are paid to participants or their beneficiaries as soon as administratively feasible upon attainment of retirement age (55) or one year after the participant terminates employment. The Plan allows for hardship distributions in an immediate and heavy financial need subject to Plan provisions.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP) requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The board of trustees determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisers and custodians. See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

NOTE 2 SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Contributions Receivable

Contributions due but not paid prior to year-end are recorded as contributions receivable. Contributions are due from employers as specified in the collective bargaining or participation agreement. In general, contributions are due on the 15th day of each month following the work month. Delinquent contributions and payroll audit findings are individually analyzed for collectability. The estimate for expected credit losses considers historical loss experience, current economic conditions, and forward-looking information, including factors such as payment history, employer financial condition, and labor trends. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, the allowance for credit losses was insignificant.

Reciprocal Contributions

The Plan has entered into various reciprocal agreements with other union pension plans. In accordance with these agreements, the Plan is required to remit funds received, and is entitled to receive funds, from participating employers on behalf of temporary employees to and from the employee's participating local unions.

Benefit Payments

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

Administrative expenses are paid by the Plan.

Subsequent Events

The Plan has evaluated subsequent events through October 7, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 FAIR VALUE OF INVESTMENTS

The framework for measuring fair value provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 – Inputs other than quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly, such as:

- quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 – Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair market value measurement.

The asset or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques maximize the use of relevant observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. There have been no changes in the valuation methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual Funds – Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective Fund – Valued at NAV of units of the bank collective trust. NAV is a readily determinable fair value and is the basis for current transactions.

Limited Partnership – Valued at NAV per unit (or its equivalent) based upon the fair value of the underlying investments. NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value.

Interest Bearing Deposits – Valued based on cost, which approximates fair value in a noninflationary economy.

NOTE 5 RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of the investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 6 PLAN TERMINATION

The Plan may be terminated at any time by mutual consent of the contributing employers, affected unions, and the board of trustees. In the event of Plan termination, the participant accounts would be distributed in a manner determined by the board of trustees.

NOTE 7 PLAN TAX STATUS

Through December 31, 2019 the Plan placed reliance on an opinion letter dated March 31, 2014, received from the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) on the volume submitter plan indicating that the Plan was qualified under Section 401 of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) and was, therefore, not subject to tax under current income tax law. The volume submitter Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter. Effective January 1, 2020 the Plan adopted an individually designed Plan. The Plan has not applied for a determination letter for that document. However, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax exempt.

U.S. GAAP requires Plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 8 PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain plan investments are managed by various investment managers and therefore, these transactions qualify as party in interest transactions. Certain fees paid by the Plan for investment management services were included as a reduction of the return earned on each fund. Certain investment and administrative fees related to the investment and administration of the Plan were paid by the Plan. These transactions are exempt from the prohibited transaction rules of ERISA.

NOTE 9 CONCENTRATION

During the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, two employers represented 25% of total employer contributions and one employer individually represented 10% of total employer contributions, respectively.
