Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Sun Gro Holdings Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the "Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA"), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statements of changes in net assets available for benefits for the years then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. PLAN DESCRIPTION:

General

The following description of the Sun Gro Holdings Inc. Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan is a defined contribution plan established January 1, 1986 to provide benefits to all eligible employees of Sun Gro Holdings Inc. (the “Company” or the “Plan Sponsor”). The Plan is a flexible non-standardized prototype 401(k) profit sharing plan and is subject to the provisions of the Employment Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Eligibility

The Plan covers all employees of the Company who have completed 300 hours of service within three months following their date of hire. Employees who do not complete 300 hours of Service within the 3-month time period of employment, they will have satisfied the service requirement if they are credited with a year of service.

Contributions

An eligible employee may make salary deferral contributions of up to 100% of eligible compensation as defined by the Plan. Employee contributions are made through payroll deductions. A participant’s contribution shall not exceed certain limits as provided by the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Participants direct the investment of their contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan. Eligible participants may make “catch-up” contributions subject to certain limitations as defined by the IRC. Rollover contributions from other qualifying plans, as determined by the Plan administrator, may be contributed to the Plan. Participants shall be 100% vested in the value of their rollover account at all times.

The Plan includes an automatic deferral provision, whereby an eligible participant who is not deferring or is deferring below the initial automatic deferral percentage of 3%, will automatically have 3% of their compensation withheld and contributed to the Plan for the first two years of eligibility, increasing annually by 1% until a maximum of 10% of their compensation is withheld. A participant may complete a deferral change agreement at any time to elect an alternative deferral amount or to elect not to defer under the Plan.

The Plan allows the Company to make a discretionary qualified matching contribution. Effective January 1, 2023, the Company matches 100% of the first 3% of employee eligible compensation contributed to the Plan and an additional 1.5% for individuals contributing 6% or higher.

Participant accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and an allocation of (a) the Company’s contribution, (b) Plan earnings (losses) and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participants’ account balances, participant earnings or compensation, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

1. PLAN DESCRIPTION: (CONTINUED)

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Vesting in the remainder of their accounts is based on years of continuous service. To earn a year of service, a participant must be credited with at least 1,000 hours of service during the Plan year. A participant becomes 100% vested upon death, disability, retirement or after five years of credited service in the following increments:

Forfeited accounts

If a participant terminates employment at a time when the participant is less than 100% vested, the non-vested portion of employer contributions is forfeited. Forfeitures of the non-vested portion of terminated participants' accounts are maintained in a separate account and are used to reduce future employer contributions or pay Plan expenses. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited accounts totaled \$108,646 and \$80,192, respectively. Total accounts forfeited during 2024 and 2023 were \$44,229 and \$35,558, respectively. The Plan used \$17,131 and \$53,102 of forfeited accounts to reduce the Company matching contributions during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Plan termination

The Company presently expects to continue the Plan indefinitely but reserves the right to amend or terminate it, subject to the provisions of ERISA. If the Plan were terminated, all amounts credited to participants would be fully vested and non-forfeitable.

Payment of benefits

Upon termination, death, disability, or attainment of normal retirement age, participants may receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of their account. Distributions may also be made in installments to comply with minimum distribution rules required under the IRC. If a participant terminates employment and holds an account balance of \$7,000 (\$5,000 prior to 2024) or less, a single lump-sum payment will be distributed without the participant's written consent. Upon termination of employment, if the participant's account balance exceeds \$7,000, the participant may defer distribution up to the date determined by the required minimum distribution provisions of the Plan. In addition, during employment, a participant may withdraw all or a portion of their vested account balance upon attaining normal retirement age or to the extent necessary to meet a qualifying financial hardship.

1. PLAN DESCRIPTION: (CONTINUED)

SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022

The SECURE 2.0 Act of 2022 was signed into law on December 29, 2022, to increase retirement savings, improve retirement rules, and lower employer costs of setting up a retirement plan. Plan amendments required by the Act generally need not to be made until the end of the first plan year beginning on or after January 1, 2026, however, plans must operate in accordance with effective date of each new provision.

Major provisions of this Act that may affect the Plan include:

- Effective January 1, 2024, the limit for mandatory cash outs was raised from \$5,000 to \$7,000.
- Effective January 1, 2025, further expansion of eligibility to long-term part-time workers, which will allow participation after two consecutive years of 500 or more hours.
- Effective January 1, 2026, catch up contributions for any participants over age 50 who earn over \$145,000 are now required to be made on a Roth basis.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared under the accrual method of accounting in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Use of estimates

The preparation of the Plan's financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America and Department of Labor ("DOL") rules and regulations for reporting and disclosure under ERISA require the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments held by the Plan are stated at fair value, with the exception of fully-benefit responsive investment contracts which are stated at contract value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (an exit price). Contract value reflects the amount participants would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan and is the relevant measure for the portion of assets attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. All investments are participant directed.

The Plan administrator is responsible for determining the Plan's valuation policies and analyzing information provided by the investment advisors and record keeper that is used to determine the fair value of the Plan's investments. See Note 4 for further discussion of fair value measurements.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES: (CONTINUED)

Investment valuation and income recognition (continued)

In accordance with the policy of stating investments at fair value, net unrealized appreciation in fair value is reflected in the Statements of Changes in Net Assets Available for Benefits. The net appreciation in the fair value of its investments consists of realized gains or losses and unrealized appreciation on those investments.

Purchase and sale of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Interest and other investment income is recorded as earned on an accrual basis.

Earnings on investments are allocated on a pro rata basis to individual participant accounts based on the type of investment and the ratio of each participant's individual account balance to the aggregate of participant account balances.

Payment of benefits

Benefit payments are recorded when paid.

Administrative expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses may be paid by the Plan, the Plan Sponsor, or deducted from participants' investment returns. Certain asset-based fees are deducted directly from each participant's investment returns. Certain other fees, including investment management fees, are paid by the Plan at the discretion of the Plan administrator from revenue sharing that the Plan receives from Empower Trust Company, LLC ("Empower"), as per a revenue sharing agreement. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan Sponsor paid certain administrative expenses of the Plan. Fees paid directly by the Plan Sponsor are not included in these financial statements.

Risks and uncertainties

The Plan offers a variety of investment vehicles. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market, and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

3. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS:

The Plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974. Accordingly, Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC, the custodians, certified to the Plan administrator the fair value and physical custody of investments and investment transactions to be complete and accurate as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, investments and participant loans included in the Statements of Net Assets Available for Benefits and investment income, and net appreciation of investments included in the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits; and the information contained in Notes 2, 4 and 5 concerning accounting policies for investments and the types of investments held and information included in the supplemental schedule of assets (held at end of year).

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS:

The Plan follows established guidelines for a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs used to measure fair value. An asset or liability's classification within the hierarchy is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement. This hierarchy prioritizes the inputs into three broad levels as follows:

- Level 1 Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets or liabilities. Market price is generally obtained from exchange or dealer markets.
- Level 2 Inputs other than Level 1 that are observable, either directly or indirectly, such as quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities; quoted prices in markets that are not active; or other inputs that are observable or can be corroborated by observable market data for substantially the full term of the assets or liabilities. Inputs are obtained from various sources including market participants, dealers and brokers.
- Level 3 Unobservable inputs that are supported by little or no market activity as they trade infrequently or not at all and that are significant to the fair value of the assets or liabilities.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at their daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are negotiated with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are valued at the closing price recorded in the active market in which these individual securities are traded.

Common collective trust fund – Valued at the net asset value (“NAV”) of units of the collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee, is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment advisor reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

5. INVESTMENT IN GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT:

The Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract with Empower. Empower maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The group annuity contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan and is not permitted to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date.

Because the Guaranteed Portfolio Fund is fully benefit-responsive, contract value is the relevant measurement attribute for that portion of the net assets available for benefits attributable to the Guaranteed Portfolio Fund. Contract value, as reported to the Plan by Empower, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the contract issuer or otherwise. For 2024 and 2023, the rate credited to participants was 1.41% and 1.23%, respectively. Such interest rates are reviewed on an annual basis for resetting.

5. INVESTMENT IN GROUP ANNUITY CONTRACT: (CONTINUED)

Certain events limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Plan sponsor or other Plan sponsor events (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, or (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA. The Plan administrator believes that any events that would limit the Plan's ability to transact at contract value with participants are probable of not occurring.

6. TAX STATUS:

The Plan has adopted a prototype profit sharing plan that is sponsored by an affiliate of the custodians and record keeper that received an opinion letter dated November 14, 2022, in which the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") stated that the prototype plan, as designed, complied with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code. Although the Plan has amended since receiving the letter, the Plan administrator believes that the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

During the year ended December 31, 2023, Plan management discovered an operational failure whereby the Plan failed to match certain employees' contributions for two payroll periods. Plan management has taken the necessary steps to correct the error prior to year end. Plan management believes the final outcome of the correction process will not have a material impact on the Plan's financial statements or the Plan's qualified tax status.

Plan management is required to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the Plan and has concluded that as of December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes the Plan is no longer subject to income tax examinations for years prior to 2021.

7. RELATED PARTY AND PARTIES-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS:

Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America and Empower Trust Company, LLC are the custodians of the Plan's investments; therefore, fees paid by the Plan to Empower qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

Under the terms of a revenue sharing agreement, each quarter Empower refunds and deposits into the Plan's expense budget account certain excess fees, as defined by the agreement. These deposits were included as an offset to administrative expenses in the accompanying financial statements. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan received revenue sharing amounts of \$40,237 and \$38,365, respectively, which may be used to offset investment management fees or allocated to eligible participants. There was no funding allocated to eligible participants for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Plan used \$45,238 and \$51,003 of forfeitures to offset investment management fees, respectively. As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, \$7,576 and \$12,381 remained in the expense budget account, respectively.

Certain employees and officers of the Company, who may also be participants in the Plan perform administrative services at no cost to the Plan.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES:

The Plan provides for various investment fund options in any combination of mutual funds and other investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

9. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS:

Management has evaluated subsequent events through October 2, 2025, the date on which the financial statements were available to be issued.
