Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center 403(B) Retirement Savings Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audits of Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center 403(B) Retirement Savings Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 5 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center 403(B) Retirement Savings Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

The information included in the supplemental schedule, other than that agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, has been subjected to auditing procedures applied in the audits of the financial statements and certain additional procedures, including comparing and reconciling such information directly to the underlying accounting and other records used to prepare the financial statements or to the financial statements themselves, and other additional procedures in accordance with GAAS. For information included in the supplemental schedule that agreed to or is derived from the certified investment information, we compared such information to the related certified investment information.

In forming our opinion on the supplemental schedule, we evaluated whether the supplemental schedule, other than the information agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, including its form and content, is presented in conformity with the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
AS OF AND FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 2024 AND 2023

1. DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following brief description of the Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center 403(b) Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the Plan document for more complete information.

General

The Plan Sponsor is Wake Forest Baptist Medical Center (the Company).

The Company established the Plan to provide eligible employees with a systematic means of savings and investing for retirement. Eligible employees are eligible to participate in the Plan as of their date of hire for purposes of making voluntary employee contributions. After completion of three months of service, eligible employees are subject to mandatory voluntary contributions and are eligible for employer matching and non-elective contributions. The Plan is administered by the Advocate Health, Inc. Benefits Administration Committee.

Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA) and College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF), Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company (VALIC), Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower), Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower Insurance), State Street Bank and Trust Company (SSBT) and Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (TFLIC), serve as the custodians of the Plan. Transamerica serves as the record keeper for the Plan. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Eligible employees are required to contribute 2% of their eligible compensation (as defined in the Plan document) on a pre-tax basis after completion of three months of service. Participants also may contribute an additional amount of their eligible compensation as pretax and/or Roth post-tax annual contributions, subject to Internal Revenue Code (IRC) limitations. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans and certain individual retirement accounts.

The Plan provides for a dollar for dollar matching contribution up to 4% of a participant's eligible compensation. The Plan also provides for a non-elective employer contribution equal to 2% of each participant's eligible compensation up to the Social Security Wage Base (SSWB), plus 5% of the amount above the SSWB but less than the IRS salary limit. An additional 1% employer retirement contribution will be made after December 31, if the Company meets its performance goals for that year. The non-elective contribution will be made on behalf of all eligible employees, including employees who do not make elective contributions to the Plan. In addition, some of the Company employees will be grandfathered with additional employer contributions made to the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of the Company's contributions, plan earnings, and charged with benefit payments, transaction fees related to notes

receivable from participants and benefit payments and allocations of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan document. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested amount in the Plan.

Investment Options

Participants direct the investment of their account balance into various investment options offered by the Plan. The Plan offers a variety of mutual funds, insurance company general accounts and a pooled separate account (group annuity contract) as investment options.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions and any matching contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become 100% vested in their non-elective employer contributions after three years of service.

Notes Receivable from Participants

The Plan allows two types of loans, participant loans and plan loans. Participant loans occur when the participant borrows directly from their own account. In this case the loans are shown on the statement of net assets available for benefits as notes receivable from participants. Plan loans occur when the participant borrows funds from the custodian. In this case the funds are loaned from the custodian and a corresponding amount is reserved, or held in collateral, from the participant's account, and included in investments in the statement of net assets available for benefits. In either case, participants may borrow up to a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their vested account balance.

Participant loans - The notes bear interest rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. Principal and interest are paid directly by the participant to the record keeper over a period not to exceed five years, unless the loan proceeds are applied to the purchase of the principal residence of the participant. In such case, the loan may be repaid over fifteen years. In the case of default, the loan is not deemed distributed until the occurrence of a distributable event, as defined in the Plan document. Deemed loans not distributed total \$9,676,771 and \$8,008,686 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. At December 31, 2024, outstanding notes bore interest rates ranging from 3.25% to 9.50% and mature through November 2039.

Plan loans - The notes bear interest rates which are commensurate with local prevailing rates as determined by the Plan administrator. The participant does not have the right to take distributions from that portion of the account until the loan is repaid. As the loan is repaid corresponding amounts are made available for use in the participant's account. If a participant defaults, the account is distributed and treated as a deemed distribution. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, the total loans secured by plan assets were \$1,095,073 and \$1,374,660, respectively. These loans have interest rates ranging from 4.00% to 6.85% and mature through January 2028.

Payment of Benefits

On termination of service, a participant may elect to receive an amount equal to the value of the participant's account in either a lump-sum amount or various installment and annuity options as provided by the Plan.

Forfeitures

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited non-vested accounts totaled \$1,584,983 and \$891,051, respectively. These accounts will be used to reduce future employer contributions. In 2024, employer contributions were reduced by \$990,783 from forfeited non-vested accounts.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).

Investments held by a defined contribution plan are required to be reported at fair value, except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts. Contract value is the relevant measure for that portion of the net assets available for benefits of a defined contribution plan attributable to fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because contract value is the amount participants normally would receive if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements, accompanying notes and supplemental schedule. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value (except for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts, which are reported at contract value). Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date (i.e., an exit price). See Note 3 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Reinvested dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought, sold and held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants represent participant loans that are recorded at their unpaid principal balance, plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income on notes receivable from participants is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan's administrative expenses are paid by either the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

For the year ended December 31, 2024, the Company has evaluated subsequent events for potential recognition and disclosure through October 13, 2025, the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

3. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value and the assets are categorized based upon whether the inputs used to determine fair values are observable or unobservable. Observable inputs are inputs that are based on market data obtained from sources independent of the reporting entity. Unobservable inputs are inputs that reflect the reporting entity's own assumption about pricing the asset or liability, based on the best information available under the circumstances.

The fair value of all assets and liabilities recognized or disclosed at fair value is classified based on the lowest level of significant inputs. Assets and liabilities that are measured at fair value are disclosed and classified in one of three categories. Category inputs are defined as follows:

Level 1 - Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active markets for identical assets on the reporting date.

Level 2 - Inputs other than quoted market prices included in Level 1 that are observable for the asset, either directly or indirectly. If the asset has a specified (contractual) term, a Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset.

Level 3 - Inputs that are unobservable for the asset for which there is little or no market data.

The following section describes the valuation methodologies the Plan uses to measure fair value:

Level 1: The fair value of registered investment companies (mutual funds) is based on quoted net asset values of the shares as reported by the funds. The registered investment companies held by the Plan are open-end funds registered with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. The funds must publish their daily net asset value and transact at that price. The registered investment companies held by the Plan are considered to be actively traded.

Level 2: Pooled Separate Accounts (PSA): Valued daily based on the market value of the underlying net assets in each separate account. The majority of the underlying net assets have observable Level 1 and/or Level 2 quoted pricing inputs which are used to determine the unit value of the PSA which is not publicly quoted. This methodology is deemed to reflect quoted prices of similar assets in active markets. Real estate holdings are valued principally utilizing external appraisals, which are estimates of property values based on a professional's opinion.

Level 3: The TIAA Traditional Annuity holdings within the Retirement Annuity (RA) and Retirement Choice (RC) contracts (fully described in Note 4) have liquidity restrictions and are non-benefit responsive. Accordingly, they are presented in the financial statements at fair value. This account, including fair value measurement, is more fully described in Note 4. However, due to the contractual nature of the account, observable prices for identical or

similar investments do not exist and, accordingly, these investments are valued using unobservable inputs which meets the description of level 3 measurement. The value of TIAA Traditional Annuity account balances approximates a discounted cash flow value calculated using an appropriate risk-adjusted market discount rate which correlates closely with TIAA Traditional Annuity's historical crediting rates.

4. INVESTMENT AND ANNUITY CONTRACTS WITH INSURANCE COMPANIES

TIAA Traditional

The TIAA Traditional Annuity is a fixed-rate annuity contract. Contributions buy a contractual or guaranteed amount of future benefits for the investing participant. The contracts guarantee principal and a minimum interest rate (currently between 1.0% - 3.0% during the accumulation phase) and provide the opportunity for additional amounts in excess of the guaranteed rate. Allocations to the TIAA Traditional Annuity are backed by TIAA's claims paying ability. Any additional amounts, when declared by the TIAA Board of Trustees, remain in effect for the declaration year, which begins each March 1, and are not guaranteed for future years.

The TIAA Traditional Annuity holdings within the RA and RC contracts have liquidity restrictions and are non-benefit responsive. The RA contract does not allow lump-sum cash withdrawals and transfers must

be spread over a period of 10 annual installments. Participant withdrawals and transfers within the RC contract must be taken in 84 monthly installments, except that a lump-sum distribution is available, if permitted under the plan, in the 120-day period following termination of employment, subject to a 2.50% surrender charge. The TIAA Traditional Annuity holdings within the Group Supplemental Retirement Annuity (GSRA) and Supplemental Retirement Annuity (SRA) contracts contain no liquidity restrictions and are fully benefit-responsive. Contract value represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

New York Life Insurance Company Guaranteed Interest Account (NYLIC)

The Plan has a fully benefit-responsive group annuity contract with NYLIC. NYLIC maintains the contributions in its general account. The Plan's contract investment balance is credited with earnings based upon contractually determined interest rates, dividends (if any) and charged for plan withdrawals and administrative expenses. NYLIC establishes an effective interest rate semiannually. In no event will such effective annual interest rate, minus the deductions for expenses, be less than the minimum interest rate as defined by the contract. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit-responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the Plan. Contract value represents contributions made under each contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses.

Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investments at contract value. There are no reserves against contract value for credit risk of the Issuer or otherwise.

The Plan's guaranteed interest contract specifies certain conditions under which distributions from the contract would be payable at amounts below contract value. These conditions are defined in Section 1.5 (Payments to the Contract Holders), Section 1.6 (Transfer to Other Funding Media) and Section 1.7 (Limitations on Withdrawals and Transfers) of the contract and includes events initiated by the Company including, but not limited to, total or partial plan termination, mergers, spinoffs, layoffs, early retirement incentive programs and sales or closing of all or part of the Company's operations.

The contract specifies the circumstances under which the issuer may terminate the contract with a written notice to the contract holder at least 30 days but not more than 60 days prior to the intended termination date. Currently, management believes that the occurrence of an event that would cause the Plan to transact contract distributions at less than contract value is not probable.

VALIC Fixed Interest Option

The Plan has a traditional fully benefit-responsive guaranteed investment contract with VALIC. VALIC maintains the contributions in a general account. The account is credited with earnings on the underlying investments and charged for participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. The guaranteed investment contract issuer is contractually obligated to repay the principal and a specified interest rate that is guaranteed to the Plan. The crediting rate is based on a formula established by the contract issuer but may not be less than 3%. The crediting rate is reviewed on an annual basis for resetting.

The guaranteed investment contract does not permit the insurance company to terminate the agreement prior to the scheduled maturity date. This contract meets the fully benefit-responsive investment contract criteria and therefore is reported at contract value. Contract value is the relevant measure for fully benefit responsive investment contracts because this is the amount received by participants if they were to initiate permitted transactions under the terms of the plan. Contract value,

as reported to the Plan by VALIC, represents contributions made under the contract, plus earnings, less participant withdrawals and administrative expenses. Participants may ordinarily direct the withdrawal or transfer of all or a portion of their investment at contract value.

The Plan's ability to receive amounts due is dependent on the issuer's ability to meet its financial obligations. The issuer's ability to meet its contractual obligations may be affected by future economic and regulatory developments. Certain events might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the issuer. Such events include (1) amendments to the Plan documents (including complete or partial Plan termination or merger with another plan), (2) changes to the Plan's prohibition on competing investment options or deletion of equity wash provisions, (3) bankruptcy of the Company or other events of the Company (for example, divestitures or spin-offs of a subsidiary) that cause a significant withdrawal from the Plan, (4) the failure of the trust to qualify for exemption from federal income taxes or any required prohibited transaction exemption under ERISA or (5) premature termination of the contract. No events are probable of occurring that might limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the contract issuer and that also would limit the ability of the Plan to transact at contract value with the participants.

In addition, certain events allow the issuer to terminate the contract with the Plan and settle at an amount different from contract value. Such events include (1) an uncured violation of the Plan's investment guidelines, (2) a breach of material obligation under the contract, (3) a material misrepresentation and (4) a material amendment to the agreement without the consent of the issuer.

5. INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE CUSTODIANS

The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained from data that has been prepared and certified to as complete and accurate by the Plan's custodians, Teachers Insurance and Annuity Association of America (TIAA) and College Retirement Equities Fund (CREF), Variable Annuity Life Insurance Company (VALIC), Empower Trust Company, LLC (Empower), Empower Annuity Insurance Company of America (Empower Insurance), State Street Bank and Trust Company (SSBT) and Transamerica Financial Life Insurance Company (TFLIC), as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024. 6. PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are shares of guaranteed investment contracts, pooled separate accounts and mutual funds managed by the custodians as defined by the Plan. These transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions.

7. TAX STATUS

The Plan has been designed to qualify under Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (Code). The terms of the Plan have been prepared to conform with the sample language provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in Revenue Procedure 2007-71. The plan administrator intends to apply for a determination letter on the Plan once the IRS opens such a program. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status for plan participants under Section 403(b).

U.S. GAAP requires Plan's management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more-likely-than-not would not be sustained upon examination by taxing authorities. It is the opinion of the Company that the Plan has no uncertain tax positions that would be subject to change upon examination. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan's tax filings are generally subject to examination for three years after they are filed.

8. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any such intent, the Company may choose to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA and the Plan document.

9. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investments that are exposed to several risks, such as interest rate, market risks and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investments, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investments will occur in the near term. The changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.
