NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Plan provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan Adoption Agreement for a complete description of the Plan's provisions.

General

The Unión de Tronquistas de Puerto Rico, Local 901 - Plan Trust (hereinafter referred to as the Plan) is a defined contribution plan covering all employees of Unión de Tronquistas de Puerto Rico, Local 901 (hereinafter referred to as the Sponsor), and all unionized employees on which the employer had a collective bargaining agreement with the Sponsor who have worked 1,000 hours in a calendar year. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute not less than 1%, nor more than 10% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan and/or a fixed amount at the discretion of the participants.

The employer contribution to the plan was to be based on the collective bargaining agreement or other written agreement with the Sponsor.

Participants' accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contribution and an allocation of (a) the Sponsor's contribution, if eligible, (b) Plan earnings and (c) forfeitures of terminated participants' non-vested accounts. Except for forfeitures, allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined. Participants may change their investment options quarterly.

Investment option

Upon enrollment in the Plan, a participant directs the investment of his or her contributions into mutual funds, fixed annuities, collective trust funds and stable value funds.

Vesting

Participants are 100% vested at all times.

NOTE A - DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN - CONTINUED

Payment of benefits

Upon death, disability, retirement, or termination of service a participant may receive a distribution in an amount equal to the vested value of his or her account.

Distribution of benefits

Distribution of benefits to participants that are less than \$5,000 shall be made in a single lump sum payment. If the amount exceeds \$5,000, the participant shall have the option to decide how to receive the distribution.

The Plan shall permit distributions attributable to Sponsor contributions only upon the occurrence of one of the following events:

- a. retirement of the employee or attainment of normal retirement age.
- b. separation from service (for any reason, including death).
- c. permanent disability of the employee.
- d. termination of the plan.

Forfeiture/asset holding account

Forfeitures of matching contributions are used to pay administrative expenses and/or to reduce employer's contributions, as determined by the board of trustees for any Plan year.

Participant loans

The plan does not make loans to participants or beneficiaries.

Plan termination

In the event the Plan terminates, the net assets of the Plan will be allocated as prescribed by ERISA and its related regulations.

NOTE B - ORGANIZATION, BASIS OF PRESENTATION, AND ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

The Unión de Tronquistas de Puerto Rico, Local 901 – Plan Trust (formerly The Unión de Tronquistas de Puerto Rico, Local 901 – 1165(e) Plan) was organized on January 1, 1998.

Basis of presentation

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting. The Plan sponsor is Unión de Tronquistas de Puerto Rico, Local 901. The Plan's third party administrator is The 401(k) Company of Puerto Rico, Inc.

Accounting policies

Investment valuation and income recognition

Investments are participant-directed and are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note E for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade date basis. Interest income is recorded on an accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Administrative expenses

All expenses of maintaining the Plan are accounted for as they are incurred and paid by the Plan Sponsor.

Fair value measurements

Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. Fair value measurements are based upon observable and unobservable inputs. Observable inputs reflect market data obtained from independent sources while unobservable inputs reflect the Plan's view of market assumptions in the absence of observable market information. The Plan utilizes valuation techniques that maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs. In determining fair value, the Plan uses various methods including market, income and cost approaches. A variable return group annuity contract consisting of nearly 60 investment options with a range of investment objectives. The investment options in the Manager contract are fully benefit responsive and is reported at fair market value. Due to the valuation process used, this contract is within Level 2 of the Fair Value Hierarchy under FASB Statement No. 157.

The Plan categorizes its fair value measurements into a three-level hierarchy based on the priority of the inputs to the valuation technique. The fair value hierarchy gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). If the inputs used to measure fair value fall within different levels of the hierarchy, the category level is based on the lowest priority level input that is significant to the fair value measurement of the instrument in its entirety.

The Plan categorizes assets and liabilities carried at fair value in the accompanying statement of net assets available for benefits as follows:

- Level 1 - Unadjusted quoted prices accessible in active markets for identical assets or liabilities at the measurement date and mutual funds where the value per share (unit) is determined and published daily and is the basis for current transactions.
- Level 2 - Unadjusted quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets or inputs (other than quoted prices) that are observable or that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data through correlation or other means. Primary inputs to this valuation technique may include comparative trades, bid/asks, interest rate movements, U.S. Treasury rates, London Interbank Offered Rate ("LIBOR"), prime rates, cash flows, maturity dates, call ability, estimated prepayments, and/or underlying collateral values.

- Level 3 - Prices or valuation techniques that require inputs that are both unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement. Inputs reflect management's best estimate about the assumptions market participants would use at the measurement date in pricing the asset or liability. Consideration is given to the risk inherent in both the method of valuation and the valuation inputs. Primary inputs to this valuation technique include broker quotes and comparative trades.

Changes in observability of significant valuation inputs identified during these reviews may trigger reclassifications. Reclassifications are reported as transfers at the beginning of the period in which the change occurs.

Use of estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Sponsor to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results may differ from those estimates.

Reclassifications

Certain amounts from the prior year's financial statements were reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation. These reclassifications had no effect on previously reported net increase in net assets.

NOTE E - FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits. The fair value measurement accounting literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The Plan uses appropriate valuation techniques based on available inputs to measure the fair value of its investments.

These assets are valued daily based on the underlying investments (i.e., common stock, mutual funds). While the majority of the underlying assets values are based on quoted prices, the Net Asset Value (NAV) of the separate account is not publicly quoted. The net asset value is reported by the fund managers as of the financial statement date based on recent transaction prices. The net asset value is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported net asset value. The separate accounts held by the Plan provide for daily redemptions by the Plan at reported net asset value with no advance notice requirement. The Plan is permitted to redeem investment units at net asset value on the measurement date.

The methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

When available, the Plan measures fair value using level 1 and level 2 inputs because they are observable or are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data through correlation or other means. No level 3 inputs were available to the Plan.

Investments in the Collective Trust Funds

At December 31, 2024 and 2023, Investments in the Collective Trust Funds for \$18,807 and \$3,471, respectively, were measured using the Net Asset Value (NAV).

Share Prices (NAV's) reported on the Plan Summary Reports for Collective Trust Funds are generally obtained directly from the fund house or other investment provider.

If available, an attempt is made to receive share prices from more than one source, and before the share price is entered into the recordkeeping system, a systematic comparison is performed and any difference in quoted share prices for the same fund is resolved by contacting the investment provider directly to ensure the correct share price is recorded. Variance reports are also reviewed showing percentage of share price changes from the prior day. The internal pricing analyst and management will review the overall movement of market indices and will apply judgement in determining whether any further research with investment providers will be pursued for share price variances from the prior day. Daily, after all research and validation has been performed, and variances have been resolved, share prices are closed and loaded to the recordkeeping system.

NOTE F - INCOME TAX STATUS

The Department of the Treasury of the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico has ruled that the Plan qualifies under Section 1081.01 (e) of the Income Tax Act of 2011 (the Act) and is, therefore, not subject to income tax under the present income tax law. The Plan is required to operate in conformity with the Act to maintain its qualification. The Plan's Retirement Committee is not aware of any course of action or series of events that have occurred that might affect the Plan's qualified status.

NOTE G - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities (mutual funds and fixed annuities) which are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonable possible that change in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such change could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statement of net assets available for benefits.

NOTE H - TRANSACTIONS WITH PARTIES-IN-INTEREST

The custodian and trustee of the assets and the auditors of the Plan are considered parties-in-interest to the Plan. The sponsor is not aware of any prohibited transactions with parties-in-interest. Auditing fees were \$18,000 and \$19,000 and fees paid to the custodian, advisors and trustee amounted to \$39,000 and \$35,000 for the years ending December 31, 2024, and 2023, respectively, were reduced from investment income.

NOTE I - FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS AND CONCENTRATION

The Plan maintains cash in a financial institution. The balance of this account, at times, may exceed federally insured limits by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). The Plan has not experienced any losses in such account and management does not believe it is exposed to any significant credit risk on cash.

On December 31, 2024, and 2023, approximately 97% and 93% of total contributions receivable were from two employers, respectively.

NOTE J - DATE OF MANAGEMENT'S REVIEW

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 10, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
