Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Marwood Group & Co. USA LLC 401(k) Plan, an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) [ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit]. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 1 - Description of the Plan

The following description of Marwood Group & Co. USA LLC 401(k) Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan, established on October 1, 2003, and restated on January 1, 2016, is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of Marwood Group & Co. USA LLC and its subsidiaries (the “Sponsor” or “Employer”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (“ERISA”).

Eligibility

All eligible employees become a participant of the Plan on or after reaching the age of 21 upon completing the participation requirements of the Plan. There is no service requirement for eligibility. Participants in the Plan are immediately 100% vested in their contributions and are vested over six years for employer contributions (see Vesting).

Contributions

Each year, participants may contribute a specific percentage or dollar amount of their salary, up to the maximum amount permitted by the Internal Revenue Code (“IRC”). Participants’ tax-free contributions per Section 402(g) of the IRC for the year ended December 31, 2024 were limited to \$23,000. The annual base salary for the purposes of the Plan is limited by the IRC to \$345,000. Employees who attain age 50 by the end of the year are eligible to make catch-up contributions of up to \$7,500. Eligible employees who neither make an affirmative salary deferral election nor affirmatively opt out of the Plan are automatically enrolled in the Plan with a deferral contribution equal to 3% of eligible compensation. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified defined benefit or defined contribution plans (rollovers).

The Employer, at their discretion, may make a matching contribution equal to a discretionary percentage, to be determined by the Employer, on a uniform basis for all participants each pay period. Such contributions are allocated to all participants regardless of service completed or employment status at the end of the Plan year. The matching contributions for the year ended December 31, 2024 was \$325,624.

Participants direct the investment of their contributions and the discretionary employer’s contribution into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant’s account is credited with the participant’s contribution and allocations of (i) employer’s discretionary matching contribution, if any, and (ii) plan earnings net of an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant earnings or account balances, as defined in the Plan. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant’s vested account.

NOTE 1 - Description of the Plan (continued)

Investment Options

Amounts contributed to the Plan are held in a trust created under the Plan. Contributions allocated to participant accounts are invested according to each participant's direction. Different investment funds are offered with each having a different investment objective. Participants may make changes to their investment funds in the time and manner determined by the Employer. As of December 31, 2024, there were various investment funds available to the participants.

Vesting

Participants are immediately 100% vested in their own contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Participants become fully vested in the employer's matching contributions plus related earnings according to the following schedule:

<u>Years of Service</u>	<u>Vesting %</u>
Less than 2 years	0%
At least 2 years, but less than 3	20%
At least 3 years, but less than 4	40%
At least 4 years, but less than 5	60%
At least 5 years, but less than 6	80%
6 years or more	100%

Upon the date a participant becomes disabled, deceased, attains the age of 65, the Plan's normal retirement age, or attains the Plan's early retirement age of 55, and has completed at least 6 years of service for vesting purposes, the participant shall be 100% vested in their account.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their accounts a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50 percent of their vested account balance. The notes are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at the prime rate plus one percentage point. The interest rates charged on the participant loans range from 5.25% to 10.50%. Principal and interest is paid ratably through monthly or bi-weekly payroll deductions.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, or retirement, participants may elect to receive either a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account, or annual installments not exceeding the life expectancy of the participant or his or her designated beneficiary. Participants must receive benefits by April 1st following the year in which they reach the age of 73, even if still employed by the Employer.

Forfeitures

In accordance with the Plan documents, forfeitures by participants may be used to pay Plan expenses or to reduce amounts otherwise required to be contributed to the Plan. For the year ended December 31, 2024, there were \$56,225 of forfeitures, and forfeitures of \$117,285 were used to reduce plan sponsor contributions. Unapplied forfeitures remaining as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 were \$23,632 and \$82,189, respectively.

Administration of the Plan

The Plan's trustee, Newport Trust Company ("Trustee"), maintains the Plan's assets and makes investments according to participant's directions. Officers or employees of the Employer perform certain administrative functions. No such officers or employees received compensation from the Plan. Administrative expenses are paid by the Plan. During the year ended December 31, 2024, administrative expenses charged to the Plan were \$110,107.

NOTE 2 - Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The Plan's financial statements are prepared under the accrual basis of accounting.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

Investments are reported at fair value. Fair Value is the price that would be received upon the sale of an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See note 4 for fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Notes receivable from participants are measured at their unpaid principal balance plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Delinquent participant notes are reclassified as distributions based upon the terms of the Plan document.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses

All expenses relating to the Plan's investment administration are borne on a pro-rata basis by each Plan participant and are paid by the Plan.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP") requires the Plan to make estimates and assumptions that effect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual amounts could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 3 - Information Prepared and Certified by Trustee

The plan administrator has elected the method of compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. The following information included in the accompanying financial statements and supplemental schedule was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Newport Trust Company, the Trustee of the Plan, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023 and for the year ended December 31, 2024:

NOTE 4 - Fair Value Measurements

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification 820, "Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures" ("ASC 820") establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include:

- Quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets;
- Quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets;
- Inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability;
- Inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.

If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The asset's or liability's fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used need to maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value.

Mutual funds: Valued at the daily closing price as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-ended mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value ("NAV") and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded and are considered Level 1 investments.

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NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

NOTE 4 - Fair Value Measurements (continued)

The preceding methods described above may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, while the Plan believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The following tables set forth by level, within the fair value hierarchy, the Plan's assets at fair value, as of December 31, 2024 and 2023. Classification within the fair value hierarchy table is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

NOTE 5 – Party-In-Interest Transactions

Certain administrative functions are performed by officers or employees of the Employer. No such officer or employee receives compensation from the Plan. Additionally, certain administrative expenses are paid by the Plan.

Certain Plan investments are managed by the Trustee of the Plan; accordingly, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. Fees paid by the Plan for the investment management services are included in administrative fees. The total administrative fees considered to be party-in-interest transactions amounted to \$110,107 for the year ended December 31, 2024.

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NOTE 6 - Plan Termination

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Employer has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of the Plan's termination, participants would become 100% vested in their accounts.

NOTE 7 - Tax Status

The Plan uses a prototype plan document sponsored by the plan administrator. The plan administrator received an opinion letter from the Internal Revenue Service ("IRS") dated March 31, 2014, which states that the prototype document satisfied the applicable provision sections of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC"). The Plan itself has not received a determination letter from the IRS. Although the Plan has been amended since the prototype plan document, sponsored by Marwood Group & Co. USA LLC and used by the Plan, received its opinion letter from the IRS, the Plan administrator and the Plan's tax counsel believe that the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRC and therefore believe that the Plan is qualified and the related trust is tax exempt. Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been included in the Plan's financial statements.

Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the plan and recognize a tax liability (or asset) if the Plan has taken an uncertain tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authorities. The plan administrator has analyzed the tax positions taken by the plan, and has concluded that at December 31, 2024, there are no uncertain tax positions taken or expected to be taken that would require recognition of a liability (or asset) or disclosure in the financial statements. If the Plan were to incur an income tax liability from an uncertain tax position in the future, interest on any income tax liability would be reported as interest expense and penalties on any income tax liability would be reported as income tax expense. Management's conclusions regarding uncertain tax positions may be subject to review and adjustment at a later date based upon ongoing analysis of tax law regulations, and interpretations thereof as well as other factors.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress. The Plan administrator believes it is no longer subject to income tax examinations for the years prior to 2021.

NOTE 8 - Risks and Uncertainties

The Plan provides for investment options in various mutual funds. Investment securities are exposed to various risks, such as interest rate, market and credit risk. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities and the level of uncertainty related to changes in the value of investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in risks in the near term would materially affect the participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

NOTE 9 - Reconciliation of Financial Statements to Form 5500

The Plan files its Form 5500 on a cash basis and maintains its financial statements on an accrual basis in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and the rules and regulations of the DOL.

NOTE 10 - Implementation Error

Subsequent to the year ended December 31, 2022, Plan management discovered an operational error related to the implementation of its automatic enrollment provision on January 1, 2022 whereby eligible participants were not automatically enrolled in the Plan. In order to correct the error, for the year ended December 31, 2024, the Plan Sponsor made a qualified non-elective contribution that totaled \$60,000. This amount was accrued on the statements of net assets available for benefits in 2023.

NOTE 11 - SECURE Act 2.0

On December 23, 2022, Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2023, which included SECURE Act 2.0. SECURE Act 2.0 contains over 90 new retirement provisions, with varying effective dates through 2027. Since SECURE Act 2.0 provisions include both required and optional elements, the plan administrator will determine the optional provisions to elect and amend the Plan document accordingly. Most of the significant provisions became effective in 2024 and thereafter. There is no material impact to the Plan's 2024 financial statements.

NOTE 12 - Subsequent Events

The Plan evaluated subsequent events through October 9, 2025, the date which the financial statements were available to be issued, for potential recognition and disclosure in the financial statements. No events have occurred that would require adjustment or disclosure in the financial statements.
