To the Participants and Plan Administrator of

Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Allied Mechanical Services, Inc. Profit-Sharing and Retirement Savings Plan (the Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits for the year ended December 31, 2024, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have audits of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's (DOL) Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audits need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the Plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency (qualified institution), provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the qualified institution in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the DOL's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA.

Management has obtained certifications from a qualified institution as of December 31, 2024 and 2023, and for the year ended December 31, 2024, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 3 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion

In our opinion, based on our audits and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section—

- The amounts and disclosures in the accompanying financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP).
- The certified investment information in the accompanying financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAS). Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with U.S. GAAP, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current Plan instrument, including all Plan amendments; administering the Plan; and determining that the Plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the Plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with GAAS will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of U.S. GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with U.S. GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF THE PLAN

The following description of the Allied Mechanical Services, Inc. Profit-Sharing and Retirement Savings Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan agreement for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

General

The Plan is a defined contribution retirement plan which covers all non-collective bargaining employees of Allied Mechanical Services, Inc. and its subsidiaries, Air Components & Engineering, Inc., ControlNET, LLC, Engineering Plus, Inc., and AMS MEG Investment, LLC (collectively, the “Company”). The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Capital Bank and Trust Company (CBTC) is the Plan’s trustee. CBTC invests all participant and employer contributions, as well as earnings thereon, pursuant to the terms of the Plan. The plan administrator has overall responsibility for the operation and administration of the Plan. CBTC determines the appropriateness of the Plan’s investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

The Setting Every Community Up for Retirement Enhancement Act 2.0 of 2022 (the SECURE Act 2.0) was signed into law December 29, 2022. This law, among other things, includes several required and optional provisions that will impact employee benefit plans that go into effect at various times through 2027. The provisions that were required to be implemented on or after December 29, 2022 are: 1) the change of the required minimum distribution (RMD) age from 72 to 73, 2) a reduction in the excise tax due for failure to take a RMD, 3) the ability for fiduciaries to not have to recoup inadvertent overpayments to plan participants (though the Plan must still be made whole), and 4) limits the time to recontribute amounts taken for qualified birth or adoption distributions from an unlimited time period to 3 years. The optional provisions that could have been implemented on or after December 29, 2022 are: 1) the ability to give de minimis incentives to boost employee participation in an employee benefit plan, 2) to allow employer match or non-elective contributions to be made on a Roth basis; 3) to allow an employer to elect if hardship withdrawals can be self-certified by participants; and 4) to allow for distributions related to disasters and terminal illness.

The Plan will be amended to reflect any changes made in response to SECURE Act 2.0 prior to the deadline set by law or applicable regulations.

Eligibility

Employees are eligible to participate in the Plan when they have attained the age of 21, completed one year of service and worked over 1,000 hours during the year, provided they are not a union employee or nonresident alien.

Contributions

Each year, participants may elect to contribute up to 100% of annual compensation, as defined by the Plan. Participants may designate these deferrals to be pre-tax or Roth contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the Plan year are eligible to make catch-up contributions. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans (rollover). The Company may make discretionary matching contributions and profit-sharing contributions determined annually by management. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company matched 25% of the first 5% of compensation contributed by employees in the amounts of approximately \$230,000 and \$216,000, respectively. For the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, the Company also elected to make a discretionary profit-sharing contribution of approximately \$1,300,000 for both years allocated as a uniform percentage of participant compensation.

Contributions are subject to certain IRS limits. Participants direct the investment of their contributions, including their employer contribution, into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts

Each participant's account is credited with the participant's contributions, allocations of the Company's contributions, if any, and Plan earnings and losses and charged with an allocation of administrative expenses. Allocations are based on participant compensation, account balances or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account. Participants may direct the investment of their account balances into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Vesting

Participants are immediately vested in their contributions plus actual earnings thereon. Company contributions, plus actual earnings thereon, are subject to a six-year vesting schedule.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Participants may borrow from their account balance a minimum of \$1,000 up to a maximum equal to the lesser of \$50,000 or 50% of their account balance. Loans are secured by the balance in the participant's account and bear interest at a rate commensurate with local prevailing rates. Interest rates currently in use in the Plan range from 4.25% to 9.50%. Principal and interest are paid ratably through payroll deductions. Loans must be repaid within five years unless used for the purchase of a principal residence, in which case the loan must be repaid within 15 years.

Payment of Benefits

Upon termination of service due to death, disability, separation or retirement, participants may elect to receive a lump-sum amount equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in their account, or monthly installments not to extend beyond the life expectancy of the participant. If a terminated participant's account balance is less than \$5,000, the Plan reserves the right to immediately make a lump-sum distribution. In-service distributions, as defined by the Plan, are allowed from all types of contributions. Hardship withdrawals, as defined by the Plan, are allowed from participant's elective deferrals account only.

Forfeitures

Forfeitures resulting from the nonvested portions of accounts of participants who terminate employment prior to being fully vested may be used to pay administrative expenses of the Plan, or to reduce the Company's future contributions. Forfeitures of \$3,021 were used during 2024 to reduce Company contributions. At December 31, 2024 and 2023, forfeited account balances totaled approximately \$53,300 and \$36,600, respectively.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared using the accrual method of accounting.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires the Plan administrator to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of Plan assets and liabilities and changes therein, and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Notes Receivable from Participants

Loans to participants are reported at their unpaid principal balances plus any accrued but unpaid interest. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Related fees are recorded as administrative expenses and are expensed when they are incurred. No allowance for credit losses has been recorded as of December 31, 2024 or 2023. For participant loans that are in default, the amount of the unpaid loan principal and interest due to the Plan is treated as a deemed distribution. Deemed distributions are reported as taxable distributions and remain part of the participant's account balance until a distributable event occurs (i.e., termination of employment).

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

Purchases and sales of investments are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year. Plan management determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the Plan's investment advisor and custodian. See Note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Payment of Benefits

Benefits are recorded when paid.

Expenses

Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid by the Plan unless otherwise paid by the Company. Expenses that are paid by the Company are excluded from these financial statements. Fees related to the administration of notes receivable from participants and benefit payments to participants are charged directly to the participant's account and are included in administrative expenses. Investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments.

Subsequent Events

Subsequent events were evaluated through October 13, 2025, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

The plan administrator has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. Accordingly, the trustee, CBTC, has that the following data included in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule is complete and accurate:

- Investments, as shown in the accompanying statements of net assets available for benefits as of December 31, 2024 and 2023.

At the request of the plan administrator, the Plan's independent auditors did not perform auditing procedures with respect to this information, except for comparing such information to the related information included in the financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Inputs to valuation techniques refer to the assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset. The Plan utilizes a fair value hierarchy for valuation inputs that gives the highest priority to quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). A financial instrument's level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

The following valuation methodologies were used to measure the fair value of the Plan's investments:

Mutual funds: Valued at daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (NAV) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

Common collective trust: Valued at the NAV of units of a bank collective trust. The NAV, as provided by the trustee of the Common Collective Trust (CCT), is used as a practical expedient to estimate fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments held by the fund less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. Participant transactions (purchases and sales) may occur daily. Were the Plan to initiate a full redemption of the collective trust, the investment adviser reserves the right to temporarily delay withdrawal from the trust in order to ensure that securities liquidations will be carried out in an orderly business manner. Investments using the NAV as a practical expedient are not required to be categorized within the fair value table. There are no participant redemption restrictions for these investments, the redemption notice period is applicable only to the Plan.

NOTE 4 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS (CONTINUED)

The Plan's valuation methods may result in a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Although the Plan's management believes the valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with the market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

There have been no changes in the methodologies used for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

NOTE 5 – RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

CBTC is the trustee as defined by the Plan and therefore fees paid to CBTC qualify as party in interest transactions. Fees incurred by the Plan for investment management services are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of the investments. The Plan made direct payments to the trustee of approximately \$33,000 and \$27,000 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively. Notes receivable from participants also qualify as party in interest transactions.

NOTE 6 – PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed any intent to do so, the Company has the right under the Plan to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants would become 100% vested in their discretionary profit-sharing employer contributions, plus actual earnings thereon.

NOTE 7 – TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has determined and informed the trustee by a letter dated June 30, 2020, that the Prototype Non-Standardized Profit-Sharing Plan with cash or deferred arrangement (the prototype plan on which the Plan is based) is designed in accordance with the applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (IRC). Although the Plan has been amended since receiving the opinion letter, the Plan administrator believes the Plan is designed, and is currently being operated, in compliance with the applicable requirements of the IRS and therefore, believes the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

The Plan is subject to examination by the Internal Revenue Service for the statutory period.

NOTE 8 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
