Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit for the Financial Statements

We have performed audits of the accompanying financial statements of Flowerwood Nursery, Inc. and Affiliates Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (Plan), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) (ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit). - Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audits did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of GAAP.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with GAAP.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audit.

1. DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

The following description of Flowerwood Nursery, Inc. and Affiliates (Sponsor) Profit Sharing Plan and Trust (Plan) is provided for general information purposes only. Participants should refer to the official plan documents for complete information.

General - The Plan is a defined contribution plan covering substantially all employees of the Sponsor who have completed one year of service and attained an age of twenty and one half years of age or older. The Plan does not cover union employees, leased employees, and temporary employees. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA). The Sponsor and Plan Administrator are responsible for oversight of the Plan. The Sponsor, utilizing the recommendations of advisors, determines the appropriateness of the Plan's investment offerings and monitors investment performance.

Contributions - Participants may contribute up to 100% of pretax annual compensation, as defined in the Plan. Participants may also contribute amounts representing distributions from other qualified plans. Such transfers from other qualified plans are reported as rollover contributions. Participants who have attained age 50 before the end of the year are eligible to make catch up contributions. The Sponsor made a safe harbor contribution of 100% of first 3% of deferrals and 50% of deferrals up to 5% during the year ended December 31, 2024. No additional discretionary matching or profit sharing contributions were made by the Sponsor during the year ended December 31, 2024. Contributions are subject to certain Internal Revenue Service (IRS) limitations. Participants direct the investment of contributions into various investment options offered by the Plan.

Participant Accounts - Each participant's account is credited with the participant's and the Sponsor's contributions, an allocation of net Plan earnings, and is charged with an allocation of administrative expenses that are paid by the Plan. Allocations are based on participant earnings, account balances, or specific participant transactions, as defined. The benefit to which a participant is entitled is the benefit that can be provided from the participant's vested account.

Vesting - Participants are immediately vested in their voluntary contributions and employer safe harbor contributions and any income or loss thereon. Participants become 100 percent vested in other Sponsor contributions after six years of service.

Payment of Benefits - Upon termination of service, due to death, disability, retirement or separation of service, a participant may elect to receive a lump-sum distribution equal to the value of the participant's vested interest in his or her account or partial withdrawals under certain circumstances. The Plan also permits in-service withdrawals when a participant attains the age of 59 ½ or due to circumstances of financial hardship in accordance with provisions specified in the Plan document.

Forfeitures - Forfeitures are used to reduce current year or future Sponsor contributions, pay Plan expenses or allocated to participants. Forfeited non-vested accounts totaled approximately \$6,950 and \$10 at December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting - The accompanying financial statements have been prepared in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (GAAP). In preparing the financial statements, management evaluated subsequent events through the date of the independent auditors' report, which is the date the financial statements were available to be issued.

Use of Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires plan management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition - Investments are reported at fair value. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The Sponsor determines the Plan's valuation policies utilizing information provided by the investment advisors, custodian and trustee. See note 4 for discussion of fair value measurements.

Purchases and sales of securities are recorded on a trade-date basis. Interest income is recorded on the accrual basis. Dividends are recorded on the ex-dividend date. Net appreciation or depreciation includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold, as well as held during the year. Realized gains and losses from security transactions are reported on the average cost method.

Concentration of Market Risk - As of December 31, 2024 and 2023, approximately 14% of the Plan's net assets were invested in one CCT. The underlying value of the investments are dependent on the performance of the individual investment holdings and the market's evaluation of such performance. It is at least reasonably possible that changes in the fair value of the investments and their investment holdings in the near term could materially affect participants' account balances and the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits and the statement of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Payment of Benefits - Benefits are recorded when paid.

Administrative Expenses - Certain expenses of maintaining the Plan are paid directly by the Sponsor and are therefore excluded from these financial statements. Administrative expenses include fees related to the administration of distributions that are charged directly to the participant's account and certain custodian fees, investment advisory fees, other plan fees, and other recordkeeping fees paid by the Plan. Certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation or depreciation of fair value of investments.

3. CERTIFIED INVESTMENT INFORMATION

Certain information related to investments disclosed in the accompanying financial statements and ERISA-required supplemental schedule, including investments held at December 31, 2024 and 2023, and net appreciation or depreciation in fair value of investments, and interest and dividends for the year ended December 31, 2024, was obtained by management and agreed to or derived from information certified as complete and accurate by Bank of America, N.A.

4. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENT

The framework for measuring fair value provides a hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy are described as follows:

Level 1 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access.

Level 2 - Inputs to the valuation methodology include: quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets; quoted prices for identical or similar assets or liabilities in inactive markets; inputs other than quoted prices that are observable for the asset or liability; and inputs which are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means. If the asset or liability has a specified (contractual) term, the Level 2 input must be observable for substantially the full term of the asset or liability.

Level 3 - Inputs to the valuation methodology are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement.

The fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement. Valuation techniques used maximize the use of observable inputs and minimize the use of unobservable inputs.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There were no changes in the methodologies used at December 31, 2024 or 2023.

Mutual funds: Valued at the closing price reported on the active market on which the individual securities are traded at the close of every business day.

Common collective trust (CCT): Valued at the net asset value (NAV) per share/unit reported at the close of every business day. The NAV is used as a practical expedient to estimating fair value. The NAV is based on the fair value of the underlying investments comprising the trust and accounts less its liabilities. This practical expedient is not used when it is determined to be probable that the fund will sell the investment for an amount different than the reported NAV. There are no unfunded commitments or redemption restrictions relative to the CCT at the participant level. Premature termination at the plan level requires notice and could result in a delay of transfer at the plan level.

The preceding methods described may produce a fair value calculation that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although management believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

Plan investments include a CCT which uses NAV as a practical expedient. This CCT is not categorized within the fair value hierarchy.

5. RELATED PARTY AND PARTY-IN-INTEREST TRANSACTIONS

Certain Plan investments are managed by Bank of America, N.A., the custodian of the Plan, during the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023. Therefore, these transactions qualify as party-in-interest transactions. As described in note 2, the Plan paid certain expenses related to plan operations and investment activity to various service providers. These transactions are considered related party or party-in-interest transactions.

6. PLAN TERMINATION

Although it has not expressed intent to do so, the Sponsor has the right, under the Plan, to discontinue its contributions at any time and to terminate the Plan, subject to the provisions of ERISA. In the event of Plan termination, participants' accounts would become 100% vested in their employer contributions.

7. INCOME TAX STATUS

The Plan adopted a standardized form of a prototype plan. The prototype plan has received an opinion letter dated June 30, 2020 from the IRS as to the prototype plan's qualified status. The prototype plan opinion letter has been relied upon by this Plan. Although the Plan has been amended since adoption, the Plan Administrator believes the Plan is designed and is being operated in compliance with applicable requirements of the Internal Revenue Code, and, therefore, believes that the Plan is qualified, and the related trust is tax-exempt.

GAAP requires plan management to evaluate tax positions taken by the Plan and recognize a tax liability if the Plan has taken an uncertain position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by the IRS. The Plan is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions, including the IRS; however, there are currently no examinations for any tax periods in progress.

8. RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and such changes could materially affect participants' account balances and the amount reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.
