Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audits

We have performed an audit of the accompanying financial statements of Premium Building Products Company Hourly Employees Pension Plan ("the Plan"), an employee benefit plan subject to the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA), as permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). The financial statements comprise the statement of net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) as of December 31, 2024, and the related statement of changes in net assets available for benefits (modified cash basis) for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management, having determined it is permissible in the circumstances, has elected to have the audit of the Plan's financial statements performed in accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. As permitted by ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C), our audit need not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investment of the plan (investment information) by a bank or similar institution or insurance carrier that is regulated, supervised, and subject to periodic examination by a state or federal agency, provided that the statements or information regarding assets so held are prepared and certified to by the bank or similar institution or insurance carrier in accordance with 29 CFR 2520.103-5 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA (qualified institution).

Management has obtained a certification from State Street Bank and Trust Company, a qualified institution, as of December 31, 2024, and for the year then ended, stating that the certified investment information, as described in Note 4 to the financial statements, is complete and accurate.

Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

In our opinion, based on our audit and on the procedures performed as described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements section—

- the amounts and disclosures in the 2024 financial statements referred to above, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.
- the information in the 2024 financial statements referred to above related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C).

Basis for Opinion on the 2024 Financial Statements

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the Plan and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audits. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit opinion.

Emphasis of matter – basis of accounting

We draw attention to Note 2 of the financial statements, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial statements are prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Our opinion is not modified with respect to this matter.

Responsibilities of Management for the 2024 Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2, and for determining that the modified cash basis of accounting is an acceptable basis for the presentation of the financial statement in the circumstances. Management is also responsible for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error. Management's election of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit does not affect management's responsibility for the financial statements.

In preparing the financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for one year after the date the financial statements are available to be issued.

Management is also responsible for maintaining a current plan instrument, including all plan amendments; administering the plan; and determining that the plan's transactions that are presented and disclosed in the financial statements are in conformity with the plan's provisions, including maintaining sufficient records with respect to each of the participants, to determine the benefits due or which may become due to such participants.

Auditors' Responsibilities for the Audit of the 2024 Financial Statements

Except as described in the Scope and Nature of the ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) Audit section of our report, our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audits in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Plan's internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the Plan's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Our audit did not extend to the certified investment information, except for obtaining and reading the certification, comparing the certified investment information with the related information presented and disclosed in the 2024 financial statements, and reading the disclosures relating to the certified investment information to assess whether they are in accordance with the presentation and disclosure requirements of the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.

Accordingly, the objective of an ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) audit is not to express an opinion about whether the financial statements as a whole are presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting described in Note 2.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audits, significant audit findings, and certain internal control-related matters that we identified during the audits.

In accordance with ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C) pursuant to 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA, the prior year audit did not extend to any statements or information related to assets held for investments of the plan that were certified by a qualified institution. Their report dated October 10, 2024 indicated that in their opinion (a) the amounts and disclosures in the 2023 financial statements, other than those agreed to or derived from the certified investment information, were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with the modified cash basis of accounting, and (b) the information in the 2023 financial statements related to assets held by and certified to by a qualified institution agrees to, or is derived from, in in all material respects, the information prepared and certified by an institution that management determined meets the requirements of ERISA Section 103(a)(3)(C). NOTE 1 – DESCRIPTION OF PLAN

General

The following description of the Premium Building Products Company Hourly Employees Pension Plan (the “Plan”) provides only general information. Participants should refer to the Plan document for a more complete description of the Plan’s provisions.

The Plan is a noncontributory defined benefit plan that covers employees of Premium Building Products Company (the “Company” or “Plan Sponsor”), a subsidiary of Associated Materials LLC, who are members of United Steelworkers of America Local Union 8869 (the “Union”) and parties to the collective bargaining agreement between the Company and the Union and provides for retirement benefits. The Plan is subject to the provisions of the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974, as amended (“ERISA”).

Effective November 4, 2013, the Plan is frozen to new entrants. Active participants in the Plan at that time were given the one-time option to freeze future benefit accruals effective December 31, 2013, and begin earning benefits in a Company sponsored defined contribution plan beginning in 2014 or continue earning benefits in the Plan.

On November 16, 2018, the Plan was amended to include annual opt out for participants to elect to freeze future benefit accruals and begin earning benefits in a Company sponsored defined contribution plan. The Plan was also amended wherein an employee retiring between November 16, 2018 and November 4, 2019, shall receive a monthly pension of \$22.25 multiplied by the participant’s years of service. Any employee retiring after November 4, 2019, shall receive a pension of \$22.50 multiplied by the participant’s years of service.

Contributions

Annually, an independent actuary is utilized to determine the Plan’s funding requirements. The Plan’s funding policy is for the Company to contribute an amount which will meet or exceed the annual ERISA minimum funding requirement, as determined by the enrolled actuary. The Company funded total contributions of \$86,000 and \$105,000 for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023, respectively.

Pension Benefits

Participants are entitled to a normal retirement benefit for those that have reached the later of the age of 65 or five years of service in the Plan. The normal monthly retirement benefits are calculated based on a participant’s years of credited service multiplied by a monthly benefit level as provided in the Plan. Participant’s years of service include credited years of service. The normal form of benefit is a single life annuity. The Plan also offers a 50% joint and survivor annuity option. The Plan provides for early retirement, disability, and pre-retirement spousal benefits for any participant who meets certain requirements. Participants become fully vested on completion of five years of continuous service.

Plan Termination

The Company anticipates that the Plan will continue without interruption but reserves the right to terminate the Plan or to discontinue contributions to the Plan. In the event the Plan is terminated, the Plan provides for

the allocation of net assets up to the present value of accumulated plan benefits among the participants and pensioners. To the extent unfunded vested benefits exist, such benefits would be payable by the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation (“PBGC”), up to specified limitations, as described in ERISA, specifically in the order of:

- a. Benefits attributable to employee contributions.
- b. Annuity benefits that former employees or beneficiaries have been receiving for at least three years.
- c. Other vested benefits insured by PBGC.
- d. All other vested benefits.
- e. All non-vested benefits.

To the extent that Plan net assets exceed benefits due to participants and pensioners, and provided that the Plan has met all legal requirements, any remaining assets at termination, net of applicable taxes, will revert back to the Company.

Benefits under the Plan are insured by the PBGC. Generally, the PBGC guarantees most vested normal retirement benefits, early retirement benefits and certain disability and survivor benefits. However, the PBGC does not guarantee all types of benefits under covered plans, and the amount of benefit protection is subject to certain limitations. The PBGC guarantees vested benefits at the level in effect on the date of plan termination. However, if benefits have been increased within the five years before plan termination, the benefit increase may not be guaranteed. In addition, there is a ceiling on the amount of monthly benefit that PBGC guarantees which is adjusted periodically.

Administrative Expenses

The Plan’s expenses are paid either by the Plan or the Company, as provided by the Plan document. Certain expenses incurred in connection with general administration of the Plan that are paid by the Plan are recorded as deductions in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available to benefits. In addition, certain investment related expenses are included in net appreciation (depreciation) in fair value of investments presented in the accompanying statements of changes in net assets available for benefits.

Death and Disability Benefits

A participant that has been married for at least one year, dies while actively employed or dies while inactive with a vested benefit prior to commencement of benefits, is entitled for a death benefit to be paid to the spouse. The amount of the payment to be made is based on the participant’s age at death, years of vesting service and beneficiaries’ age in accordance with the Plan document. Non-married participants are not entitled to death benefits unless it is a return of employee contributions to the Plan. A participant who has attained at least 10 years of service and who has become permanently incapacitated, while accruing service, shall be eligible to retire on a permanent incapacity retirement. Participants that meet the eligibility requirements of a permanent incapacity pension will receive a regular pension benefit as defined by the Plan.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Plan are prepared on a modified cash basis of accounting, as interest and dividend income, employer contributions, if any, and administrative expenses are recorded when received or paid versus when the revenue or expense has been incurred. The modified cash basis of accounting, which is permitted under the Department of Labor's Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure, is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America ("U.S. GAAP").

Investment Valuation and Income Recognition

The Plan's investments are stated at fair value. Fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. See Note 5 for further discussion and disclosures related to fair value measurements.

Investment transactions are recorded as of the trade date. Interest income and dividends are recorded when received. Net appreciation (depreciation) includes the Plan's gains and losses on investments bought and sold as well as held during the year.

Actuarial Present Value of Accumulated Plan Benefits

Accumulated plan benefits are those estimated future periodic payments, including lump-sum distributions that are attributable under the Plan's provisions to services rendered by employees prior to the valuation date. Accumulated plan benefits include benefits expected to be paid to 1) retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries, 2) beneficiaries of employees who have died, and 3) present employees or their beneficiaries. Benefits for retired or terminated employees or their beneficiaries are based primarily on the employees' credited service. The accumulated plan benefits for active employees are based on service rendered as of the valuation date. Benefits payable under all circumstances, including retirement, death, disability, and termination of employment, are included to the extent they are deemed attributable to employee service rendered to the valuation date.

Payment of Benefits

Benefit payments to participants are recorded upon distribution.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes and supplemental schedules. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent Events

The Plan Sponsor evaluated subsequent events of the Plan through October 9, 2025, the date these financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 3 – ACCUMULATED PLAN BENEFITS

Consulting actuaries estimate the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits, which is the amount that results from applying actuarial assumptions to adjust the accumulated plan benefits earned by the participants to reflect the time value of money (through discounts for interest) and the probability of payment (by means of decrements such as death, disability, withdrawal, or retirement) between the valuation date and the expected payment date.

NOTE 4 – SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL INFORMATION CERTIFIED BY THE TRUSTEE

State Street Bank and Trust Company (“Trustee”) was the trustee of the Plan and held the Plan’s investment assets and executed investment transactions as of and for the years ended December 31, 2024 and 2023.

The Plan sponsor has elected the method of annual reporting compliance permitted by 29 CFR 2520.103-8 of the Department of Labor’s Rules and Regulations for Reporting and Disclosure under ERISA. NOTE 5 – FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

Financial Accounting Standards Board Accounting Standards Codification (“ASC”) 820, *Fair Value Measurements and Disclosures*, establishes a framework for measuring fair value. That framework provides a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. The hierarchy gives the highest priority to unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities (Level 1 measurements) and the lowest priority to unobservable inputs (Level 3 measurements). The three levels of the fair value hierarchy under ASC 820 are described below:

- Level 1 – Fair value is based on unadjusted quoted prices for identical assets or liabilities in active markets that the Plan has the ability to access at the measurement date.
- Level 2 – Fair value is based on quoted prices in markets that are not active, quoted prices for similar assets or liabilities in active markets, and inputs that are observable for the asset or liability either directly or indirectly, for substantially the full term of the asset or liability and inputs that are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data by correlation or other means.
- Level 3 – Valuation inputs are unobservable and significant to the fair value measurement. These inputs may be used with internally developed methodologies that result in management’s best estimate.

The asset’s or liability’s fair value measurement level within the fair value hierarchy is based on the lowest level of any input that is significant to the fair value measurement in its entirety.

Following is a description of the valuation methodologies used for assets measured at fair value. There have been no changes in methodologies used at December 31, 2024 and 2023.

Mutual funds - Valued at the daily closing prices as reported by the fund. Mutual funds held by the Plan are open-end mutual funds that are registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission. These funds are required to publish their daily net asset value (“NAV”) and to transact at that price. The mutual funds held by the Plan are deemed to be actively traded.

Collective trust fund – The fair value of the collective trust fund has been determined using the NAV per share of the underlying pool of securities as a practical expedient, which was provided to the Plan by the trustee. At December 31, 2024, and 2023, the Plan has no unfunded commitments related to collective trust funds. The redemption of common/collective trust funds is subject to the preference of the plan administrator.

NOTE 6 – INCOME TAX STATUS

The Internal Revenue Service (“IRS”) has determined and informed the Company by a letter dated July 29, 2014, stating that the Plan and related trust are designed in accordance with applicable sections of the Internal Revenue Code (“code”). The Plan has been amended since receiving the determination letter. The Plan Sponsor believes the Plan is designed and is currently being operated in compliance with the applicable requirements of the code.

The Plan is subject to routine audits by the IRS; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

NOTE 7 – RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Plan invests in various investment securities. Investment securities are exposed to various risks such as interest rate, market, and credit risks. Due to the level of risk associated with certain investment securities, it is at least reasonably possible that the changes in the values of investment securities will occur in the near term and that such changes could materially affect the amounts reported in the statements of net assets available for benefits.

Plan contributions are made, and the actuarial present value of accumulated plan benefits are reported based on certain assumptions pertaining to interest rates, inflation rates, and employee demographics, all of which are subject to change. Due to uncertainties inherent in the estimation and assumption processes, it is at least reasonably possible that changes in these estimates and assumptions in the near term could materially affect the amounts reported and disclosed in the financial statements.
